Series History

- Today's game represents the second meeting between Fairfield and Iona this season. The Gaels hold a 65-43 edge in the series which includes an 84-65 loss in New Rochelle earlier this month. Tyler Nelson led the Stags offense with 16 points while Deyshonee Much posted 32 points with most of his points coming from behind the three-point line (six three pointers).

- The two teams split the last two regular season series with the home team winning each of the games a year ago. Last season, Fairfield posted a 93-87 win at home while Iona responded with a 96-89 victory. Tyler Nelson averaged 22 points per game in the two games a year ago.

- Fairfield and Iona played a five-overtime game during the 1981-82 season which the Gaels won 102-100. Nine players fouled out in the game with the Gaels losing five student-athletes to disqualification. The game was tied 65-65 after regulation and no team scored more than nine points in any of the overtime periods.

- Fairfield and Iona played another memorable overtime game in which the Stags overcame a double-digit second-half deficit to defeat the Gaels in overtime and win the 1987 MAAC Championship. Jeff Gromos registered a double-double for Fairfield with 24 points and 10 rebounds. Nestor Payne recorded 16 points and eight rebounds to aid the Iona cause.

Scouting Fairfield: The Stags made a valiant attempt to overcome a late deficit but time ran out as Quinnipiac held off Fairfield by a 75-70 score at the Nassau Coliseum on Saturday. The team trailed by nine points with just over a minute remaining in regulation and managed to cut the deficit to two points with 30 seconds left. After Quinnipiac converted one of two free throws, Fairfield had a chance to tie but its three-point try fell off the rim with five seconds remaining. Jesus Cruz led all Stag scorers with 21 points in addition to his team-best 10 rebounds and four steals. Jonathan Kasibabu also turned in a strong performance with a career-best 16 points along with seven caroms and three assists. Kasibabu's performance on the boards on Saturday continued a long run of success, averaging 6.3 rebounds per game over the last 12 games. Tyler Nelson also reached double figures with 13 points, his lowest point total since netting six points at Wright State in November. Still, the senior remains the team's top scorer with a 20.8 scoring average, which also places him second in the conference. Kasibabu hit the century mark by picking up his 100th rebound of the season, which leads the team with 5.0 per contest.

Scouting Iona: Six Gaels reached double figures to propel Iona past Manhattan College by a 78-65 count at the Nassau Coliseum on Saturday. Schadrac Casimir paced the offense with 20 points, making five of seven three-point tries. Deyshonee Much put together an outstanding all-around game with 10 points, six rebounds, six assists, and two steals to aid the cause. Iona enjoyed a good shooting night, netting 51 percent of its shots in the first half and 57 percent over the final 20 minutes. With their sizzling shooting in the second half, the Gaels were able to build 13-point leads on several occasions including the final margin. Rickey McGill, who posted 11 points against Manhattan, leads the team in scoring with 14 points per game as well as with 5.2 assists per contest. He is one of three student-athletes averaging in double figures, joined by Much's 12.2 scoring average and E.J. Crawford's 11.6 points every forty minutes. TK Edogi also ranks as the team's top rebounder, collecting 7.4 caroms per contest.

Double Double: Jesus Cruz registered his first career double-double by setting career highs with 21 points and 10 rebounds. The freshman became the first freshman on this year's roster to tally a double-double this season. Cruz added four steals to his double-double which raised his team-leading total to 33 (1.65 per game).

On The Glass: Fairfield posted 21 offensive rebounds in the Quinnipiac game which led to 23 second-chance points. Six different Stags secured an offensive rebound, led by Jonathan Kasibabu and Jesus Cruz who each tallied five caroms. Matija Milin also had multiple offensive rebounds with three caroms.

Nothing But Net: Jonathan Kasibabu made all five of his field goal attempts against Quinnipiac, his second straight game in which he made all of his field goal attempts. The forward went 2 for 2 in the Rider game, making his 7 for 7 over the last two outings. Kasibabu owns a .656 field goal percentage in the month of January, making 21 of his last 32 attempts. For the season, Kasibabu is shooting .633 from the floor by making 57 of 90 field goal attempts this season.

New Role: Jonathan Kasibabu did not turn the ball over in his 23 minutes against Quinnipiac, the second time in the last three games that he did not commit a miscue. Over the last three games, the forward has six assists against one turnover in 58 minutes on the court. Over the same games, Kasibabu is averaging 10 points and 5.7 rebounds per game.

Off The Bench: Omar El-Sheikh scored four points when he came off the bench against Quinnipiac, the most among Fairfield reserves. He has now scored in three straight games which is the longest such streak of his career. The freshman has appeared in 11 games this season and scored in eight of those appearances. For the season, El-Sheikh is averaging 3.3 points and 2.8 rebounds per game.

Rim Shot: Fairfield is coming off its worst shooting performance of the season, connecting on 33.8 percent of its shots and 20 percent of its three-point attempts. The Stags previous low field goal percentage was 35 percent at Manhattan (21 of 60).

The team's three-point field goal percentage was the lowest since the Stags netted 18.5 percent from the behind the arc at Manhattan (5 of 27). Fairfield's top two scorers also enjoyed one of their coolest shooting nights as Tyler Nelson connected on 4 of 18 shots while Ferron Flavors Jr. netted 4 of 17 field goal attempts.

What's Yours Is Mine: The Stags earned 10 steals in the Quinnipiac game, tying the team's season high. Fairfield also recorded 10 steals against Saint Peter's on December 28. Jesus Cruz was nearly responsible for half of the steals last Saturday, leading the team with four steals. Against Saint Peter's, Nelson established a personal best with five, accounting for half of the team's steals.

Top 25: Tyler Nelson made all four of his free throws against Quinnipiac which moved him to 22nd in the nation for free throw percentage. The senior has made 103 of 115 charity tosses, averaging just over five free throws per game. Since missing a season high three free throws at Wright State, Nelson is shooting 91.1 percent from the line (72 of 79).

Number Two: Tyler Nelson fell to number two on the MAAC scoring leader list after his 13 points against Quinnipiac. The senior is averaging 20.8 points per game, slightly lower than Niagara's Khalil Duke (21.1 ppg) but just ahead of Niagara's Matt Scott (20.7 ppg).

At The Start: Since returning to the starting lineups two games ago, Jesus Cruz is averaging 18.0 points per game which includes his career-best 21-point performance against Quinnipiac on January 27. He followed that contest with 14 points before resetting his personal best with 21 points vs. Quinnipiac, giving him a personal-best four straight games in double figures. On the season, Cruz is averaging 11.6 points over his 12 starts (138 points) and 7.0 points as a reserve (56 points in eight games).

Point Taken: Fairfield hit the century mark in its win over Niagara on January 20, the team's first 100-point performance since beating Bucknell 101-91 in December 2015. The Stags' 104 points were the most scored by the program in a MAAC games

since edging Saint Peter's University 109-108 in February, 2006. Fairfield's 58-point first half represented the most points scored in a half since dropping 66 points at the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore in November, 2015, netting 66 points in the 113-74 win.

Start To Finish: Fairfield never trailed in the game against Niagara, scoring the first four points of the game which led to a double-digit lead just seven minutes into the game (23-13). It was the first time this season that the Stags led from start to finish in a game.

Home Stand: Fairfield started a run of home games that included three dates at Webster Bank Arena over a four-game stretch. The Stags started the run with its 104-85 win against Niagara and a 90-88 setback against Rider. Iona is next on the home docket with a date on January 29. This year, Fairfield owns a 5-3 record at Webster Bank Arena and a 1-1 mark in neutral site games.

Flirting With 50: Ferron Flavors Jr. became the sixth first-year Stag to reach 50 for the season as his three long-range jumpers against Niagara pushed him to 51 three pointers for the season. He is climbing the list which includes Jermaine Clark (69 in 1998-99), Tyler Nelson (64 in 2014-15), Derek Needham (58 in 2009-10), Kyle Commodore (51 in 1995-96), and Mike Evanovich (50 in 2006-07) also accomplished the task. Clark, Nelson, Needham, and Commodore were all freshmen while Evanovich was a transfer sophomore just like Flavors Jr.

Dynamic Duo: Tyler Nelson made five three-point field goals against Niagara which raised his season total to 54. Along with Ferron Flavors Jr.'s 55 three pointers, the duo is averaging a combined 5.73 three pointers per game, slightly better than Niagara's Khalil Dukes and Matt Scott's average of 4.71 three pointers per contest (99 in 21 games).

All For One: For the first time this season, the Stags had six reserves score in a game with Jesus Cruz leading the charge with six points at Iona. Fairfield had five student-athletes put score bench points at Rider, but saw that number surpassed in the next outing.

Passing Game: The Stags had eight different players pick up an assist in the game at Rider with the reserves accounting for 12 of the team's 16 assists. Before the Rider game, the reserves' high for assists in a game was eight against Wagner. Wassef Methnani led all Fairfield student-athletes with five assists, the most since registering four against Loyola Maryland. It was the fourth time this season in which the team had eight players with at least one assist - Purdue (12), Wagner (16), UNH (16).

Rejected: The Stags blocked a season-high seven shots at Rider, two more than they had against Penn in the season opener and again at Wagner in early December. The last time that the Stags had more than seven blocks came at Quinnipiac during the 2016-17 season when the team combined for eight rejections with Jonathan Kasibabu leading the squad with four blocks.

Moving Up: With his 31 points against New Hampshire, Tyler Nelson's was able to move up three spots on Fairfield's career scoring leader list, pushing past Mark Young '79 (1,643 points), Troy Bradford '89 (1,648 points), and Marcus Gilbert '16 (1,661 points). He now sits fourth all-time with 1,843 and sets his sights Derek Needham '13 who netted 1,875 points during his four-year career. Nelson is one of seven Stags to reach 1,600 career points and the third to play under Coach Sydney Johnson.

Stop The Streak: The Stags overtime loss to Old Dominion ended a run of six straight Fairfield victories in extra time. Fairfield went 4-0 during the 2015-16 season and followed with a 2-0 mark last season. Fairfield has enjoyed overtime success under Coach Sydney Johnson, posting a 9-6 record during his seven seasons.

Long-Range Jumpers: Ferron Flavors Jr. leads the team with 55 three-point field goals which break down to 2.9 per game. That per game average places him third in the MAAC. On the team's season long seven-game road trip, the sophomore shot 44 percent (22 of 50) from the three-point area, averaging 3.3 three pointers per game during the run. Since that stretch, he is averaging 3.0 three pointers per game (30 in 10 games).

20/20: For the second time this season, the Stags enjoyed two student-

athletes with 20 or more points in a game. Tyler Nelson led all Fairfield scorers with 28 points while Ferron Flavors Jr. netted a personal best 20 points in the loss against Jacksonville. Against Penn, Nelson (30 points) teamed up with freshman Wassef Methnani (20 points) for the honor.

Hurricane Relief: Fairfield and Hofstra played an exhibition game to help raise funds for hurricane relief efforts that have affected residents in Texas, Louisiana, Florida, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The two teams raised \$4,300 during the event which benefitted Save the Children, which is based in Fairfield. The exhibition game stemmed from an idea brought forth by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

International Flair: The Fairfield roster features student-athletes from nine countries plus one United States commonwealth, giving CBS Sports' Matt Norlander reason to call the Stags one of the most international rosters in the country. He listed the note as number 36 on his 50 fun facts for the 2017-18 college basketball season. The Stags roster includes student-athletes from Canada, Lithuania, Sweden, Democratic Republic of Congo, Serbia, Tunisia, Egypt, Kuwait, and the United States. Six of Fairfield's nine newcomers hail from outside the United States.

On The Horizon: Head Coach Sydney Johnson is in his seventh season with the Stags and is closing in on his 100th victory as Fairfield's head coach. Since taking over the program, Johnson has won 97 games on the Fairfield bench and has 163 victories overall. Johnson won 19 or more games in three of his first six seasons, including a 22-win mark in his inaugural season.

Teammates: Omar El-Sheikh and Wassef Methnani were teammates before sharing the floor at Fairfield. The two student-athletes came to Fairfield after spending time at The Knox School and being part of the school's first men's basketball teams.

FIBA Foes: Omar El Sheikh and Jesus Cruz matched up in their respective countries' first FIBA tournament game over the summer with Egypt edging Puerto Rico in a tournament played in Egypt.

Four On The Floor: Olivier Cadieux posted a career-high four rebounds in three different games as a freshman, beginning with the game at Wagner in mid-November. He also hit that mark at Rider and against Saint Peter's. For the season, Cadieux is the top returning rebounder among last year's freshman class, collecting 18 rebounds in 18 appearances.

Five Spot: Olivier Cadieux netted a personal best five points against Army West Point, making two of four field goal attempts with one coming from behind the three-point line. His next best scoring performance would be three points which he accomplished against Dartmouth, Rider, Bucknell, and Saint Peter's.

Out Of The Lineup: Olivier Cadieux played in two of the team's final 12 games due to injury. He missed eight straight games before gaining entry to the Monmouth game on February 21, but played just one minute in his return. He also gained entry in the CIT tournament game against UMBC.

Scoreboard: Olivier Cadieux scored his first collegiate points with a first-half free throw at Dartmouth. The freshman later added a basket in the second half. He became the first member of the class of 2020 to score multiple points in a game in 2016-17.

Cadieux's Biography

2016-17

Olivier Cadieux made his debut with the Stags during the 2016-17 season and ended the year with 18 appearances as a reserve. He played in the first nine games of the season and 16 of the first 19 contests. He played in just one game from January 31 through the regular season due to injury, playing one minute when the Stags hosted Monmouth on February 21. He took the floor for the Stags' CIT first round game against UMBC in which he scored a basket in his one minute of action. Cadieux scored in eight of his 18 appearances and secured at least one rebound in eight games as well. He posted a career-high five points in the win over Army West Point, and grabbed a personal-best four rebounds three times, the last of which came against Saint Peter's in January. For the season, the forward averaged 1.3 points and 1.0 rebounds per game.

Before Fairfield

Cadieux came to Fairfield University after a successful academic and athletic career at Brebeuf Jesuit. On the court, Cadieux was one of the program's top scorers as a junior and senior, leading the league in with a scoring average that hovered around 20 points per game. He showed his explosive ability with a 35-point performance against Champlain, the 2014-15 provincial champion. He averaged 16 points per game as a junior which ranked among the team leaders during season.

Segura's Biography

2016-17

Jerome Segura finished the 2016-17 season with the sixth-best assists per game average in the MAAC, dishing off 4.1 per game. The guard registered a team-best 122 assists, bringing his career total to 346 over his three years. For the third straight season, Segura recorded more assists than turnovers with his 2016-17 totals standing at 122 to 77. With those numbers, Segura ranked 11th in the conference with a +1.6 ratio. Segura dished off at least one assist in 29 of his 30 appearances which included 12 games with five or more assists. He was also listed among the league leaders for minutes played, averaging 30.6 minutes per game over his 30 starts. He played every minute in three games last season, collecting 40 minutes against Boston College and Rider as well as a personal-best 45 minutes at Wagner. Segura earned his first double-double of his career with a career-high tying 17 points and 10 assists in a season-opening win against Sacred Heart. Segura would go on to pick up six more double-digit scoring totals in 2016-17, three coming in non-conference play (Sacred Heart, Dartmouth, and Bucknell) and four occurring in MAAC play (at Rider, Iona, Siena, at Iona).

2015-16

Segura emerged as the team's point guard from the beginning of the 2015-16 season, earning a start at the position in all 32 appearances as a sophomore. He posted a positive assist-to-turnover ratio in 24 of his 32 games and posted an equal number of assists and turnovers in five other games. He recorded a personal best 11 assists at Marist and later tied that mark at home against Manhattan. Segura also showed a knack for scoring when he scored a personal best 17 points in the Wagner game, one of his nine double-digit point totals a year ago. He finished the campaign strongly by scoring 10 or more points in three of his final five games, averaging 9.8 points per game and shooting 43.7 percent from the floor (21 of 48) during that run. He also recorded 20 assists against 11 turnovers during the final five contests. He ended the season with 160 assists which is the 10th highest single-season total in Fairfield basketball history.

2014-15

Segura was a regular all season long, playing in all but one contest as a freshman. He missed the Saint Peter's game after playing in his first 27 collegiate games. He posted a career-high 13 points in a start at Saint Peter's. He also reached double figures as a reserve with 11 points at Niagara in the regular-season finale. Segura was sure-handed with the basketball and was one of only three Stags with more assists than turnovers (64 assists/60 turnovers). He dished off nine assists against four turnovers in the team's Buffalo weekend, highlighted by six assists and two miscues against Canisius. Segura earned his first collegiate start at Siena on January 11, joining Tyler Nelson to comprise an all-freshmen backcourt.

Double-Double: Tyler Nelson registered his first double-double of the season with 24 points and a career-best 11 rebounds against Rider on January 23. The effort marked his second career double-double that included points and rebounds, last making the mark with 30 points and 10 caroms against UMBC in last year's CIT game. He also has two double-doubles from points and assists in his career.

End Of A Streak: Tyler Nelson saw his consecutive free throw streak end with a miss against Rider (January 23), stopping the run at 34 charity tosses. He missed for the first time since January 11 when he went 2 for 3 at Manhattan. Trailing by two points with one second left in regulation, Nelson missed the first free throw and was forced to miss the second on purpose with the hopes of the Stags getting a tip in.

In The 30s: Tyler Nelson eclipsed the 30-point mark for the third time this season and the fifth time in his career. The senior posted 35 points in 45 minutes of action at Marist, netting 11 field goals with five three pointers and eight free throws. The Stags own a 4-1 record in games in which Nelson reaches 30 points with the one setback coming in last year's postseason game against UMBC (30 pts).

Top 30: Tyler Nelson continues to rank among top 30 Division I free throw shooters after his 5 for 7 performance against Rider brought his season percentage to .892. He stands 26th in the country based on his making 99 of 111 free throws this year. For his career, Nelson has netted 426 of 488 free throw attempts (.873).

Round Number: Tyler Nelson made five free throws at Iona which sent him over 400 charity tosses made in his career and made him the fourth Stag to accomplish the task. He enters tonight's game with 430 career charity tosses. Mark Young '79 holds the school record with 543, followed by Tony George '86 (510), and Joe DeSantis '79 (462). Nelson is averaging 5.2 free throws made per game (103 of 115), his best single-season average which would surpass his 4.45 free throws per game in 2015-16.

Home Court: Tyler Nelson continued to reap the benefits of the home court as he scored 14 points against Manhattan. In his four games at Webster Bank Arena, Nelson is averaging 22.6 points per game (158 points in seven games) and 22.8 points (184 points in eight games) if you include the home game at Alumni Hall. On the road and in neutral site games, Nelson is averaging 19.9 points per game (219 points in 11 games).

Scoring Leader: Senior Tyler Nelson has a chance to set the school scoring record this season checking into tonight's action with 1,856 points. He is currently needs 147 points to surpass Tony George '86 who netted 2,006 points during his four-year career. The senior could also set a school record for career three-pointers, needing 21 baskets to eclipse Derek Needham's mark of 281 set from 2010-13.

Weekly Honors: Senior Tyler Nelson and freshman Wassef Methnani earned weekly honors from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) on Monday. Nelson secured the Player of the Week after scoring 30 points in the team's win over Penn. Methnani collected the Rookie of the Week following his 20-point, eight-rebound debut against the Quakers.

It's Been A While: Senior Tyler Nelson tallied 30 points in the season opener against Penn, becoming the second Stag to score 30 points in a season opener. Mark Plefka netted 36 points against Loyola University in the 1977-78 opener, a game which Fairfield won by a 100-89 count. The Stags almost had two 30-point scorers in that game as Kim Fisher netted 28 points in the victory. Tony George, Fairfield's

all-time leading scorer, just missed the mark with 29 points in the 1984-85 season opener which ended in a victory over Marist.

Preseason Honors: Tyler Nelson was named the MAAC Preseason Player of the Year as well as a unanimous pick to the Preseason All-MAAC first team. Nelson was an All-MAAC selection in 2016-17 (first team) and 2015-16 (second team).

Rare Company: Tyler Nelson surpassed the 500-point mark in 2016-17 the second straight season that he has hit that mark. He joins Marcus Gilbert, Troy Bradford, and Tony George as the only Stags to score 500 or more points in consecutive seasons. Nelson posted his 60th three-point field goal in the Rider game last year, becoming only the second Stag to record 60 or more three pointers in three different seasons. Derek Needham is the other Fairfield student-athlete to accomplish the task with 78 in 2012-13, 72 in 2011-12, and 72 in 2010-11.

Nelson's Biography

2016-17

Tyler Nelson earned All-MAAC honors after placing second in the MAAC for scoring with 19.5 points per game. He is the top returning scorers in the conference with the departure of Monmouth's Justin Robinson (19.7 ppg). Nelson became the latest member of the Fairfield University 1,000-point club when he tallied the prestigious point against North Carolina State. The guard has netted 1,440 points through his three-year career, including 604 points in 2016-17. Nelson needs 567 points in 2017-18 to become the program's all-time leading scorer, surpassing Tony George's school record 2,006 points set (1982-86 seasons). Nelson scored in double figures 30 times in 2016-17, missing the mark with nine points against Niagara in late February. The nine-point effort stopped his streak of 53 straight games with 10 or more points. He ended the season with 30 points against UMBC in the CIT first round, his second 30-point effort of the season. He posted a career-high 38 points against Rider in the MAAC opener, making six of 10 three pointers and all 10 free throw attempts. Nelson earned two MAAC player of the week honors, the first of which came he scored 28 points at Dartmouth and followed with 23 points in a overtime win at Wagner. He picked up another award after his 38-point effort at Rider and 23 markers at Siena. Nelson registered two buzzer-beating shots that won one game and sent another into overtime for Fairfield. In a one-week span, Nelson hit a three-point field goal against Canisius (58-55) and sent the Quinnipiac game into overtime with a layup. Nelson's 604 points in 2016-17 was his second straight 500-point season, one of only four to accomplish that feat at Fairfield.

2015-16

Tyler Nelson looks to become the Stags' next 1,000-point scorer in 2016-17, needing just 164 points to reach the prestigious plateau. He comes off his best offensive season of his two-year career with a team-high 529 points which translated into a 16.0 scoring average. The guard earned a spot on the All-MAAC second team after placing sixth among the MAAC scoring leaders. He led the conference in free throw percentage at .880 (147 of 167), a number which was also good enough for 14th in the nation. He netted 2.0 three pointers per game which was ranked 12th in the MAAC as his 66 long-range jumpers raised his career total to 130 in 63 games. He netted three or more three pointers in 10 games during 2015-16, giving him Nelson started all 33 games last season, giving him 63 career starts. Nelson led the team in steals with 44 which ranked 12th in the MAAC at 1.3 per game, and placed second among his teammates with 95 assists. The guard ended the season with 15 straight double-digit scoring games including six with 20 or more points. He netted 20-plus points 11 times, highlighted by his career-best of 27 markers against Niagara in Bridgeport.

2014-15

Nelson emerged as one of the MAAC's top freshmen which was backed up by his appearance on the MAAC's All-Rookie team. The guard became one of the conference's top three-point threats by netting 64 shots from behind the three-point line, the most since Jermaine Clark posted 70 three pointers as a freshman. Nelson averaged 17.5 points per game over the final six regular-season games and hit double-figures in each of those contests. The rookie scored 10 or more points in 15 games, second only to Marcus Gilbert (27 games). He scored 24 points against South Dakota in his fourth career game, his only 20-point performance until he reached the mark in back-to-back games late in the year (26 vs. Saint Peter's and 23 at Canisius). He was one of three Stags to have more assists (41) than turnovers (40).

Glass Wear: Jonathan Kasibabu secured seven rebounds against Quinnipiac, on January 27 the seventh time in an 11 game run that he reached at least seven caroms in a game. During that run, Kasibabu averaged 6.8 rebounds per game with 70 caroms those 11 games (December 17 to January 27). He remains the team's top rebounder with 5.0 per contest.

Double-Double: Jonathan Kasibabu picked up his third career double-double but first on the road with his 14 points and 13 rebounds at Manhattan on December 30. The achievement was his first since the 2015-16 campaign when he posted 16 points and 10 rebounds against Saint Peter's and 12 points and 15 rebounds versus Sacred Heart. Kasibabu joins Matija Milin as the only Stags with a double-double this year as Milin secured 18 points and 11 rebounds in the Loyola Maryland game.

On The Blocks: Jonathan Kasibabu blocked one shot against Niagara, giving him a team-best 20 rejections in his 19 appearances (1.1 per game). He has a block in 10 straight games and six games with two or more blocks. His season high is three rejections against New Hampshire. Kasibabu was the team's leading shot blocker in 2016-17 with 44 in 31 games (1.4 per game).

Perfection: Jonathan Kasibabu made all four of his field goal attempts and both of his free throw attempts to reach double figures with 10 points in the New Hampshire game. With his three blocks last Friday, Kasibabu enjoyed his best overall performance since making all five shots at Manhattan last year, finishing with 13 points, nine rebounds, and five blocks in the game.

Second Half Surge: Jonathan Kasibabu averaged 12.3 points per game during the team's stay at the Wright State tournament over Thanksgiving weekend. The junior posted 13 points against Jacksonville, tying his career high with that performance. One game later, the forward reset the mark with 15 points in the victory against Gardner-Webb. He just missed double figures with nine points in the Wright State game.

Season Highs: After setting his season-high with 13 points against Jacksonville on November 24, Jonathan Kasibabu reset his season-best with 15 points against Gardner-Webb. The junior just missed his season high of 16 points set on two different occasions. The 28 points in back-to-back games represents his best two-game scoring total since hitting the same mark in two-game trip to Buffalo last season. He started the run with 12 points at Canisius and followed up with his career high 16 points at Niagara.

Kasibabu's Biography

2016-17

Jonathan Kasibabu continued his development as one of the top big men in the MAAC, ranking among the conference leaders in both rebounding and blocked shots. The sophomore posted 4.9 rebounds per game which placed him 19th in the MAAC, while his 1.4 blocks per contest was fifth-best among the conference leaders. Kasibabu started the year with four straight multi-block games and went on to register two or more rejections in 11 more games to bring his season total to 15. Kasibabu led the team in field goal percentage, netting 76 of 130 shots in 2016-17 for a .585 mark. Over his final 10 games, Kasibabu shot 60.7 percent from the floor (34 of 56), highlighted by his 6 of 7 performance at Niagara that led to a career-high tying 16 points. He just missed a double-double at Niagara with a nine rebounds, a mark he would surpass one game later with 10 caroms at Siena. Kasibabu was a member of the starting lineup in the first three games of the year, came off the bench for 19 straight outings, before starting the final nine games of the campaign. His best bench performance included 13 points, nine rebounds, and a career-best five blocks at Manhattan.

2015-16

Jonathan Kasibabu led all Stags with 181 rebounds in 2015-16 which broke out to 5.5 rebounds per game. The forward was ranked in three MAAC statistical categories, namely rebounding (16th with 5.5 per game), blocked shots (7th with 1.2 per game), and eighth in offensive rebounding (2.1 per game). He was among the top rebounders during the MAAC tournament by averaging 8.0 per contest, highlighted by nine against Monmouth. He posted 10 or more rebounds in five games, two of which completed a double-double. The forward garnered 12 points and a personal-best 15 caroms against Sacred Heart and followed up with 16 points and 10 rebounds versus Saint Peter's. He blocked at least one shot in 21 games, putting together a run of 10 straight games with a block. He totaled 19 rejections over those 10 games (1.9 per game). He tallied four blocks in the MAAC tournament quarterfinal game against Saint Peter's, tying his season high set earlier at Marist. Kasibabu was the team's most accurate shooter with a .514 field goal percentage, the only Stag who made more than half of his attempts for the season. He earned the MAAC rookie of the week award on November 23.

Before Fairfield

Kasibabu attended Westtown School (Pa.) where he earned All-Friends School League first team honors. The 6-8 forward also gained attention when he was labeled a "Player to Watch" at the Chic-Fil-A Classic Holiday Tournament earlier in the season. He was voted team captain by his teammates and helped the team post a post a 25-8 record and capture the 2015 Friends School League title. Before his time in the United States, Kasibabu was selected to the Euroleague Nike International Junior Tournament All-Tournament team in 2014 and was one of 12 players who were designated Top Prospect that showed best potential at the same tournament.

Best Of The Bench: Matija Milin posted 15 points as a reserve against Niagara (January 20), nearly reaching his personal best of 19 points when he came off the bench against Manhattan as a freshman. The 15-point effort is the best by a Fairfield reserve since Kevin Senghore-Peterson netted 17 at Wagner on December 1. His seven field goals against the Purple Eagles tied for his season-high which he also accomplished against Loyola-Maryland.

10 Spot: Matija Milin picked up 10 points against Manhattan (January 11), his first game with 10 points since netting 11 against Saint Peter's in late December. He added a fifth double-digit scoring game with 15 points off the bench against Niagara. All five of Milin's double-digit games have come at home, where he is averaging 10.7 points per game (85 points in eight games).

More From Milin: Matija Milin just missed a double-double against Manhattan with nine points and eight rebounds against Manhattan, one game after he put together an impressive game with 11 points, seven rebounds, and a pair of assists against Saint Peter's. The junior continues to be one of the team's top rebounder with 4.7 caroms per contest.

Sweet 16: Matija Milin earned 16 points against Old Dominion, the ninth time in his career that he has tallied at least 16 points in a game. He just missed his season high of 18 points set against Loyola Maryland on November 14. Most of his points came from behind the line as his career-high four three pointers represented 12 of his 16 points.

On Board: Matija Milin has emerged as the one of the team's top rebounder so far, grabbing 4.8 caroms per contest. In comparison, Milin averaged a personal-best 4.1 rebounds per game last year, slightly higher than his 3.7 average as a freshman. He has been the team's top rebounder four times this year - Loyola Md. (11), Gardner-Webb (6 - co-leader), Wright State (8), and Houston (7).

Hall Pass: Matija Milin has posted nine multi-assist games this season, highlighted by a season-best three against both Penn and Gardner-Webb. Through the first 19 games, Milin has 23 assists, nearly reaching his total of 25 assists in 29 games a year ago. His career best total stands at 32 set in his freshman campaign which he accomplished in 31 games.

Double-Double: Matija Milin secured the season's first double-double for Fairfield with his 18-point, 11-rebound performance against Loyola-Maryland. The effort represented the forward's third career double-double, also picking one up against Columbia (10 points, 11 rebounds) as a freshman and another as a sophomore against UMBC (20 points, 12 rebounds) in last year's season finale.

Milin's Biography

2016-17

Matija Milin began the year as a starter, getting the nod through the first 15 games of the campaign. He came off the bench for the remainder of the regular season, not earning a start until the MAAC tournament quarterfinal game against Siena. He added another start at UMBC in the CIT tournament as well, posting a double-double with 20 points and a career-high 12 rebounds. As a reserve, Milin reached double figures twice – 14 points at Iona and 11 points vs. Rider. He would tack on one more double-digit effort as a starter when he posted a double-double against UMBC in the CIT first round, recording 20 points and grabbing 12 rebounds in 37 minutes. The performance against UMBC was one point shy of his personal best of 21 points, set against Iona, playing a career-high tying 40 minutes against the Gaels. Milin ended the season with an 8.3 scoring average and a .483 field goal percentage. His field goal percentage was third among his teammates.

2015-16

Matija Milin developed into one of the top sixth-men in the MAAC during the 2015-16 campaign, coming off the bench in all regular-season games. He garnered his first start in the MAAC quarterfinal game against Saint Peter's and remained among the starting five in the next two postseason games against Monmouth and New Hampshire. Milin reached double figures for the first time as a Stag with 11 points at Maryland-Eastern Shore which started a run of five straight double-digit scoring games. During that run, Milin posted his only double-double of the season with 10 points and 11 rebounds against Columbia. He fell one rebound short of a double-double in three other games – Manhattan (19 pts.), Saint Peter's (10 pts.) and Monmouth (16 pts.). The latter two in that list came in the MAAC tournament which enabled him to be the team's top rebounder in the MAAC tournament with a 9.0 average. Milin was named the MAAC rookie of the week when he averaged 16 points in a 1-1 week against Siena and at Saint Peter's in the final week of the season. The forward later surpassed that five-game run of double-digit scoring when he hit the 10-point mark six times over the final four regular-season games and the two MAAC tournament dates. He was also successful distributing the ball, posting at least one assist in 15 games and three or more assists in six contests.

Before Fairfield:

Milin, a 6-9, 220-pound forward, came to Fairfield from Belgrade, Serbia and was ranked as a high major player at the 2015 UBA Showcase in Istanbul, Turkey. He was a member of the Serbian Junior National Team from 2011-14 and was also a member of KK Zeman (Serbia) Junior Team.

He responded with six points and six rebounds in his 21 minutes of work. Methnani becomes the second Fairfield freshman to earn a start, joining Jesus Cruz (nine starts) for that distinction.

All-Around Performance: Wassef Methnani enjoyed his best all-around game at Rider. The freshman set personal bests with nine rebounds and five assists as well as tying his career high with three blocks. He added eight points to his game total, his best offensive output since his nine points at LIU Brooklyn. He also made his fourth three pointer of the season and his first since November 25 against Gardner-Webb. For the season, Methnani is averaging 4.6 points and 3.8 rebounds per game.

Securing Six: For the sixth time in his brief career, Wassef Methnani secured at least six rebounds in a game with his nine caroms at Marist. Double-Double: Jesus Cruz registered his first career double-double with a career-high 21 points and a personal-best 10 rebounds. The freshman also added four steals in the game which was one off his career high. Cruz becomes the first Fairfield freshman to register a double-double this season.

At The Start: Since returning to the starting lineups two games ago, Jesus Cruz is averaging 18.0 points per game which includes his career-best 21-point performance against Quinnipiac on January 27. He followed that contest with 14 points before resetting his personal best with 21 points vs. Quinnipiac, giving him a personal-best four straight games in double figures. On the season, Cruz is averaging 11.6 points over his 12 starts (138 points) and 7.0 points as a reserve (56 points in eight games).

Back On Track: After going without a steal for three straight games, Jesus Cruz has registered 20 steals in the last nine outings including a career-best five steals at Manhattan. Cruz recorded at least one steal in each of his first eight games for a total of 17 before coming up empty against LIU Brooklyn, Old Dominion, and New Hampshire. The guard currently averages 1. steals per game which ties him for third in the MAAC.

Cruzin': Jesus Cruz posted his first game without a turnover when he went 30 minutes against Houston without a miscue. Cruz has registered one turnover or less in 10 of his 21 appearances. In his two games against majors, Cruz had one turnover in 56 minutes of work (1 in 26 minutes vs. Purdue, 0 in 30 minutes vs. Houston). In road games, Cruz has 10 turnovers in 215 minutes of work.

First Time: Guard Jesus Cruz earned his first career start in the Gardner-Webb game and responded by setting personal bests with 11 points and six rebounds as well as tying his career high with four steals. The freshman also played all 40 minutes in the game, the first time that he went the distance in a contest. Cruz received the nod in lieu of Ferron Flavors Jr., who started the first four games.

Foursome: Jesus Cruz accounted for four of the Stags' five steals at Purdue, becoming the most steals by a Stag since Jerome Segura picked up four steals against Boston College and Penn in consecutive games last season. The total was the most by a freshman since Curtis Cobb posted four steals against Marist during the 2015-16 season. Earlier that season, freshman Jerry Johnson Jr. accumulated five steals in the win over Maryland-Eastern Shore.

Head Coach Sydney Johnson



Sydney Johnson became the 12th head coach to oversee the Fairfield University men's basketball program when he was introduced in April, 2011. Johnson joined the Stags program after spending four seasons as the head coach at his alma mater Princeton University.

Head Coach Sydney Johnson begins his seventh season at Fairfield University, leading the Stags to the postseason in four of those campaigns. The 2011-12 Stags reached the MAAC Tournament Championship game, the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT) semifinals, and defeated Arizona State, Old Dominion, and Iona, among others, en route to a 22-win season. In 2012-13, the Stags earned another postseason berth as a participant in the 2013 CIT.

Fairfield posted 41 victories under Coach Johnson in his first two seasons and 90 wins overall. His 41 wins through his first two campaigns ties him for the most by any Fairfield men's basketball coach through his first two seasons. The Stags three postseason wins in 2012-13 were the most by any team in school history. Fairfield also led the MAAC in scoring defense at 61.1 ppg in his inaugural season.

Since his arrival, seven Fairfield student-athletes have signed professional contracts, namely Rakim Sanders (Israel), Ryan Olander (Lithuania), Derek Needham (Lithuania), Colin Nickerson (Canada), Maurice Barrow (Austria), Marcus Gilbert (Italy), and Amadou Sidibe (Spain).

At Princeton, Johnson led the Tigers to the 2010-11 Ivy League championship and an automatic berth to the NCAA tournament. Princeton took the University of Kentucky to the final seconds before dropping a 59-57 decision in the NCAA tournament second round. It marked the second straight season that the program advanced to postseason play, playing in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) in 2009-10. During his tenure, Johnson owned a 66-53 record as the Tigers' head coach.

Johnson helped turn around the Princeton program in his four-year stay as the Tigers posted a 6-23 overall record and a 3-11 Ivy League slate in his first season. After improving to 13-14 overall and 8-6 in Ivy play in 2008-09, Johnson led Princeton to its first 20-win season since 2004 when the team finished the year with a 22-9 overall record. This year, the Tigers tied the second-highest win total in Princeton history with a 25-7 mark.

Under his guidance, Princeton has become one of the top defensive teams in the country. The Tigers led the nation in scoring defense during the 2009-10 season, allowing fewer total points (1652) and fewest points per game (53.3) than any other Division I team that year.

Johnson was named the Ivy League Coach of the Year by CollegeInsider.com following the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons.

Before taking over the Princeton program, Johnson was an assistant coach at Georgetown University under John Thompson III. He helped the Hoyas advance to the program's first Final Four in 22 years. Georgetown owned a 30-7 record that season, winning the Big East regular season and tournament titles. Georgetown advanced to the postseason in all three of his years as an assistant coach which included two NCAA tournaments and one NIT berth.

Johnson also experienced postseason play as a student-athlete, leading the Tigers to the NCAA tournament during the 1995-96 and 1996-97 seasons. In the 1996 tournament, Princeton upset defending national champion UCLA to advance to the second round.

As a student-athlete, Johnson earned the 1997 Ivy League Player of the Year as well as an All-Ivy League first team honors in 1995-96 and 1996-97. He is the only three-time captain in Princeton men's basketball history. He earned an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship in 1997, but decided to continue his basketball career overseas.

He was a starter for Gorizia Pallacanestro in Italy and helped the team capture the Italian Second Division championship. The following season, he was part of another championship team as Reggio Calabria won the league title.
