- Carolina is a No. 1 seed for a record 17th time. This is the best four-year stretch (2016-19) based on NCAA Tournament seeds in Carolina Basketball history (1,1,2,1). Previous bests were 1981-84 (2,1,2,1); 1982-85 (1,2,1,2); 2005-08 (1,3,1,1) and 2006-09 (3,1,1,1).
- Carolina is 27-6 overall. The Tar Heels won a share of the ACC regular season title for the ninth time in Roy Williams' 16 seasons and the 32nd time in school history.
- The Tar Heels were the No. 2 seed in the ACC Tournament and went 1-1, defeating Louisville, 83-70, and falling to Duke, 74-73.
- UNC is playing in its 50th NCAA Tournament. Only Kentucky (58) has more appearances.
- Carolina is 124-46 in NCAA Tournament games. UNC is second in NCAA history in appearances, wins, games and winning percentage (.729).
- Carolina has earned No. 1 seeds in 1979, 1982, 1984, 1987, 1991, 1993, 1994, 1997, 1998, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2016, 2017 and 2019. The Tar Heels advanced to the Final Four 10 times as a No. 1 seed and won the national championship five times as a No. 1 seed.
- Roy Williams is a No. 1 seed for the 13th time, second most in NCAA Tournament history.
- This is the eighth time in 16 seasons as Carolina's head coach Roy Williams has led the Tar Heels to a No. 1 seed. UNC also was a No. 2 seed twice under Williams. UNC had earned a No. 1 seed five times in the 25 years prior to Williams becoming the head coach.
- Carolina is playing in the NCAA Tournament in Columbus, Ohio, for the first time. This is UNC's first game in Columbus since 11-28-2007, a 66-55 win over Ohio State in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge. The game was played in the Schottenstein Center.
- Carolina is playing in the Midwest Regional for the first time since 2012, when it reached the Elite Eight in St. Louis. UNC also played in the Midwest Regional in 1980 and 1990.
- Carolina is No. 3 in the final Associated Press poll. This is UNC's highest finish since 2016, when the Tar Heels also were third. It is UNC's 38th top-10 finish in the 71-year history of the AP poll. It is Roy Williams' 20th top-10 finish (11 at UNC) and 15th top-five (eight at UNC).

- The Tar Heels have advanced to the Final Four 10 times as a top seed - 1982, 1991, 1993, 1997, 1998, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2016 and 2017.
- The Tar Heels have won the national championship as a No. 1 seed in 1982, 1993, 2005, 2009 and 2017.
- Roy Williams has led teams to No. 1 seeds 13 times in 31 years as a head coach, the second-most of any coach. Duke's Mike Krzyzewski is first with 14.

Carolina ranks where in all-time NCAA Tourney wins and Final Fours? Second in wins with 124, two behind Kentucky. UNC has played in a record 20 Final Fours.

Who played in more NCAA Tournament wins than any other Tar Heel? Pat Sullivan, 16 wins in 1991 (4), 1992 (2), 1993 (6) and 1995 (4).

Which coach has the most NCAA Tournament wins in the previous 17 years? Roy Williams – 52 wins at Kansas and North Carolina from 2002-18, 10 more than any other coach.

Which Tar Heels have won NCAA championships and NBA championships? James Worthy, Michael Jordan and Danny Green.

Which coaches rank second and third, respectively in all-time NCAA Tournament wins? Roy Williams is second with 77 and Dean Smith is third with 65.

Which two teams hold the NCAA record for wins in a season without a loss? 1957 North Carolina and 1976 Indiana both went 32-0.

In which cities has Carolina won NCAA championships? New Orleans twice (1982, 1993), Detroit, Mich. (2009), Glendale, Ariz. (2017), Kansas City, Mo. (1957) and St. Louis, Mo. (2005).

In which city has Carolina won more NCAA Tournament games than any other city? Charlotte. UNC is 11-1 in NCAA games in Charlotte and 33-2 in the state.

What school has been a No. 1 seed the most times since the NCAA began seeding the field in 1979? Carolina – 17 times. Duke and Kansas are second with 14.

How many wins does Carolina have as either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed?

84-61 as a No. 1 and 23 as a No. 2. That's more wins as just those two seeds than every school in the country has ever won in the NCAA Tournament except Kentucky, Duke, UCLA and Kansas.

Which teams are the only ones in ACC history to win the ACC regular season outright, the ACC Tournament and advance to the Final Four in three consecutive seasons? The 1967, 1968 and 1969 Tar Heels.

Who are the only Tar Heels to start in three Final Fours? Bill Bunting and Rusty Clark in 1967, 1968 and 1969 and Ed Cota in 1997, 1998 and 2000.

Which six Tar Heels started in two national championship games? Jimmy Black, Sam Perkins and James Worthy in 1981 and 1982; Joel Berry II, Justin Jackson and Kennedy Meeks in 2016 and 2017

Which Tar Heels have won ACC Player of the Year honors and a national championship in the same season? Lennie Rosenbluth in 1957, Ty Lawson in 2009 and Justin Jackson in 2017.

Who made the winning free throws in the 1957 NCAA title game against Kansas? Joe Quigg with six seconds to play in triple overtime.

Which Tar Heel made the game-winning shot in the 1982 national championship game vs. Georgetown? Michael Jordan.

Who scored the winning basket in the 2005 national final vs. Illinois? Marvin Williams on a tip-in with 1:26 left to break a 70-all tie in a 75-70 UNC win.

Joel Berry II is one of seven players to score 20 points in consecutive national championship games. Five of the other six are Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famers. Who are they? – Bob Kurland, Oklahoma State; Bill Russell, San Francisco; Gail Goodrich, UCLA; Lew Alcindor, UCLA; Bill Walton, UCLA.

Which Tar Heels are the only players to earn All-NCAA Regional honors three times? J.R. Reid (1987, 1988 and 1989), Ed Cota (1997, 1998 and 2000) and Tyler Hansbrough (2007, 2008 and 2009)

Who is the only Tar Heel to be named NCAA Regional MVP as a non-starter? Luke Maye, 2017 NCAA South Regional

Who is the only Tar Heel to earn All-Final Four team honors twice? Joel Berry II in 2016 and 2017

Which player scored the most points in NCAA Tournament history by a Tar Heel? Tyler Hansbrough, 325 from 2006-09. The 2008 National Player of the Year is fourth in NCAA history in scoring in NCAA Tournament games.

Which Tar Heel scored the most points in any NCAA Tournament? Lennie Rosenbluth, 142 in five games (28.4 per) in 1957.

Which Final Four MVP scored a UNC-record 134 points in a six-game NCAA Tournament series? Sean May averaged 22.3 points in six wins en route to the title in 2005.

Who is the last Tar Heel to score 30 or more points in an NCAA Tournament game? Tyler Zeller scored 32 against LIU in the 2011 first round in Charlotte.

Which Tar Heel is the most recent player to score 25 or more points in both the national semifinal and national championship games? Donald Williams – 25 vs. Kansas and 25 vs. Michigan in New Orleans in 1993.

Who holds the Final Four record for most points in a national semifinal? Al Wood – 39 against Virginia in 1981.

Which Tar Heel set the freshman scoring record in 1977 for a Final Four game? Mike O'Koren with 31 points in the semifinals vs. UNLV (since broken by Mark Aguirre of DePaul in 1979 and Carmelo Anthony of Syracuse in 2003).

What national championship game scoring records did the Tar Heels set in the first half against Michigan State in 2009? UNC scored 55 points and led by 21 points, both records for the title game. Final Four MOP Wayne Ellington scored 17 points in that first half.

Which Tar Heels had two of the five-highest single-game field goal percentages in Final Four history? Sean May vs. Illinois in the 2005 national championship (made 10 of 11, .909) and Kennedy Meeks vs. Oregon in the 2017 semifinals (made 11 of 13, .846).

Who is the last Tar Heel to grab 20 rebounds in an NCAA Tournament game? Tyler Zeller had 22 boards against Ohio in the 2012 Sweet 16 in St. Louis.

Which Tar Heel has the school record for most double-doubles in NCAA Tournament history? Antawn Jamison with eight, all in points and rebounds.

Which player is the only Tar Heel with double-doubles in the Sweet 16, Final 8, national semifinal and national championship game in one season? George Lynch vs. Arkansas, Cincinnati, Kansas and Michigan en route to an NCAA title in 1993.

Which Tar Heel has the school record for most points-assists double-doubles in NCAA Tournament history? Kendall Marshall with three.

Who is the last non-starter to have a double-double in the NCAA Tournament? Luke Maye had 16 points and 12 rebounds vs. Butler in the 2017 Sweet 16 in Memphis.

Which Tar Heel scored the most points as a non-starter in an NCAA Tournament game?

Ranzino Smith scored 27 points vs. Loyola Marymount in the 1988 second round

Which Tar Heel holds the school record and is ninth in NCAA Tournament history in most three-pointers in a game without a miss? Hubert Davis was 5 for 5 against Eastern Michigan in 1991.

Which Tar Heels held the record (since broken) for the highest three-point percentage in a Final Four game? Donald Williams and Wayne Ellington. Williams was 5 for 7 (.714) against both Kansas and Michigan in 1993; Ellington was 5 for 7 against Villanova in 2009.

Marcus Paige's game-tying three-pointer against Villanova in the 2016 national championship game set what title-game record? Paige's double-clutch three with 4.1 seconds to play made UNC 11 for 17 from three-point range, a percentage of .647 that is the highest in the national championship game.

How many points did Carolina allow in its two Final Four wins in the 2005, 2009 and 2017 national championship seasons? 141 by Michigan State and Illinois in 2005, 141 by Villanova and Michigan State in 2009 and 141 by Oregon and Gonzaga in 2017

Which game did Carolina set the single-game NCAA Tournament scoring record (since broken)? 1988 West second round vs. Loyola Marymount. The Tar Heels scored 123 points and shot 79.0 percent from the floor. Both were NCAA Tournament records that have since been surpassed. The points are now fourth most and the FG percentage is second highest.

Which Tar Heel set an NCAA finals record with eight steals in 2009 vs. Michigan State? Ty Lawson.

CO-REGULAR-SEASON ACC CHAMPS

- Carolina and Virginia earned a share of the 2019 ACC regular-season title with identical 16-2 records, two games ahead of third-place Duke.
- The Tar Heels and Cavaliers both lost in the ACC Tournament semifinals, but both teams also were rewarded with No. 1 seeds.
- Carolina won its 32nd regular-season ACC title, most in league history. Duke is second with 19 and Virginia is third with nine.
- Roy Williams has won nine regular-season ACC titles in 16 years. He has led UNC to more regular-season championships than every other school has won in their program's history except Duke and Virginia.
- Roy Williams has led Carolina (9) and Kansas (9) to 18 regular-season conference titles in 31 years as head coach. That is tied for the third most in college basketball history behind only Adolph Rupp of Kentucky (28) and Phog Allen (24) of Kansas.

JOHNSON, MAYE, WHITE EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

- Cameron Johnson earned a spot on the 2019 All-Atlantic Coast Conference first team, while teammates Luke Maye and Coby White made the second team, giving the Tar Heels three of the top 10 spots on the league's all-star teams.
- Johnson was the fourth-leading vote-getter among the first-team selections, with Maye, a first-team pick in 2018, receiving the sixthmost votes overall and the most among the second-team honorees. Johnson is the 78th firstteam All-ACC selection for the Tar Heels, most in league history.
- White received the ninth-most votes for the all-conference teams and also earned a spot on the All-Freshman team. He was chosen by 67 of 70 voters for the All-Freshman team, the second-highest vote-getter behind Duke's Zion Williamson.
- Johnson, Maye and White also were among 10 players on the USBWA's All-District III team.

MAYE, WILLIAMS CLIMBING IN ALL-TIME WINS

- Carolina has won 119 games in the last four seasons (including 2018-19). That is the fourthmost wins in any four-year span in UNC Basketball history. The only classes with more are 2009 (124), 2008 (123) and 2010 (121).
- Luke Maye has played in 108 wins in his career.
- Kenny Williams has played in 100 victories.

MAYE'S WINS IN ACC PLAY

- Luke Maye played in 59 wins in ACC regular season and ACC Tournament play. That is tied with Nate Britt and Isaiah Hicks for for the most ACC wins by a Tar Heel. They played at Carolina from 2013-17, capping their careers with the national championship.
- Maye played in 52 ACC regular-season wins and seven ACC Tournament victories.

WHITE A FIVE-TIME ROOKIE WINNER

• Coby White was the second-leading vote-getter on the ACC All-Freshman team (behind only Zion Williamson) and won Freshman of the Week honors five times, including the last two weeks and four times in league play. White is the 25th Tar Heel to win ACC Freshman of the Week multiple times. His five awards equal the fourth most by any UNC freshman.

BEATING NO. 1

- Carolina's 88-72 win at Duke was the 14th time UNC defeated the No. 1 team in the AP poll. That is more wins over No. 1 than any other school in college basketball history. Only three schools have won 10 or more - UNC, UCLA (12) and Maryland (10).
- Eight of UNC's 14 wins have come against Duke, including four in Cameron Indoor Stadium. three in the Smith Center and one in the Greensboro Coliseum.

ROY'S REMARKABLE ROAD SUCCESS

- Carolina went 9-0 on the road in ACC games this season. It was the eighth winning record in ACC road games in the last nine seasons and the 12th in Williams' 16 seasons as UNC's head
- Carolina has posted winning road records in ACC play under Williams in: 2005 (6-2), 2006 (7-1), 2008 (8-0), 2009 (6-2), 2011 (6-2), 2012 (7-1), 2013 (5-4), 2014 (5-4), 2015 (6-3), 2016 (6-3), 2017 (5-4) and 2019 (9-0).
- Williams is third all-time with 88 ACC road wins behind Krzyzewski (183) and Smith (133).
- · Williams has the highest road winning percentage in ACC games among coaches with at least 100 opportunities and the second highest among all coaches at 65.2 percent (88-47).
- Carolina has gone unbeaten in ACC road games seven times: 1957 (7-0), 1960 (4-0), 1976 (6-0), 1984 (7-0), 1987 (7-0), 2008 (8-0) and 2019 (9-0).
- Carolina went 11-1 on the road this year in all games. That included a 9-0 ACC record and a 2-1 record in non-conference play. UNC won at Wofford and Elon to open the season, and lost at Michigan in late November in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge.
- This was the eighth time UNC has won 10 or more road games in a season (12 in 1924, 11 in 1935, 14 in 1946, 11 in 1976, 11 in 1987, 10 in 1993, 13 in 2007 and 11 in 2019).

MISCELLANEOUS

- This is the 15th consecutive season the Tar Heels have won at least 20 games under Roy Williams (this is Carolina's 61st 20-win season) and the 12th time in 16 seasons Williams has led UNC to 25 or more wins (39th time in UNC history).
- Carolina won at No. 1 Duke, No. 15 NC State and No. 15 Louisville (AP). This was the first time since 2006 UNC won three road games over AP-top 15 teams.
- Carolina's 79-69 win at Louisville was the first time in UNC history the Tar Heels followed a 20-point home loss with a double-digit win on that same team's home floor.
- Carolina won three ACC road games by 20 or more points for the second time in school history. UNC won by 25 at Pitt, 23 at Georgia Tech and 38 at Wake Forest (in 2005, UNC won at Virginia Tech and Virginia by 34 and at Florida State by 21).
- Carolina is averaging 86.1 points, which is third in the nation, on pace for the fourth-highest figure in Roy Williams' 16 seasons as head coach, and the highest since 2008-09.
- Carolina has ranked in the top 10 in scoring eight times under Williams.
- This is the 10th time in 16 seasons UNC is averaging 80-plus points under Roy Williams.
- · Carolina is seventh nationally in offensive efficiency and 10th in defensive efficiency (Ken-Pom). UNC is one of four teams that are ranked in the top 10 in offensive and defensive efficiencies (with Virginia, Duke and Michigan State).
- Carolina has finished the season in the top 10 in KenPom's offensive efficiency in eight of the previous 15 seasons, including 10th in 2015, first in 2016, ninth in 2017 and sixth in 2018.

REBOUNDING

- Carolina has out-rebounded its opponents 28 times in 33 games and is 24-4 in those games.
- Carolina has 40 or more rebounds 21 times, including seven of the last eight games; UNC is 18-3 when it has 40 or more rebounds.
- The Tar Heels lead the ACC and are second nationally in rebound margin at plus 9.7 per game. That is the sixth-highest rebound margin in UNC history.
- UNC has finished in the top 10 in the nation in rebound margin in nine of Roy Williams' first 15 seasons at UNC, including No. 1 in the country in 2008, 2012 and 2017. The Tar Heels have finished ninth, ninth, first and third in the nation in the previous four years.
- Carolina leads the nation with 43.5 rebounds per game. UNC also led the nation in rebounds per game 2016-17 and 2017-18.

ASSISTS

- The Tar Heels are **averaging 19.0 assists** per game, third in the country (behind Belmont and Michigan State). The 19.0 assists are the 10th most in UNC history and the most in a season since 1990-91 (20.0 per game).
- Carolina is 15-0 when it has 20 or more assists.
- The Tar Heels have finished in the top six in the country in assists per game 11 times under Williams, including second, fourth, fourth and tied for fourth in the last four seasons.
- Carolina's assist-error ratio of 1.46 is the fifth highest in school history. Six of the seven best assist-error ratios in UNC history have been established in the last 11 seasons under Roy Williams.

THREE-POINTERS

- Carolina has made 289 three-pointers, the third most in school history (305 in 2018 and 290 in 2003). Three of UNC's four-highest single-season totals have come in the last four seasons.
- The Tar Heels have made 13 or more three-pointers six times this season (13 vs. Gonzaga, 16 vs. Virginia Tech, 13 at Georgia Tech, 13 vs. Miami, 16 at Wake Forest and 13 at Clemson). This is the first time in school history the Tar Heels have made 13 or more threes six times. UNC is 6-0 in those games.
- The Tar Heels have scored 867 of their 2,840 points from **three-point range, matching the highest** percentage (.305) in the Roy Williams Era. The previous high was a year ago (also 30.5 percent).
- The Tar Heels are making a school-record 8.8 threes per game. UNC has made 8.0 or more in only two previous seasons (a school-record 8.3 in 2002-03 and 8.2 in 2017-18).

AP POLL NOTES

- Carolina is No. 3 in the final 2018-19 AP poll, which was released on March 18.
- It is Carolina's 38th top-10 finish, 25th top-five finish and 12th top-three finish in the AP poll.
- Carolina has finished in the top 10 in 38 seasons and out of the top 10 in just 33 seasons.
- Carolina has finished in the top 10 in 27 of the last 39 years. UNC has finished the season ranked in the AP poll 51 times.
- It is Roy Williams' 20th top-10 finish in 31 years as a head coach (11 in 16 seasons at Carolina) and 12th top-five (eight at UNC).
- Carolina has been ranked in the AP poll 916 times, more than any other school in college basketball history.
- This is Carolina's eighth consecutive week in the top 10.

- UNC reached as high as No. 3 in the AP poll this season. It was the highest ranking in the AP poll since week four in 2016-17 (also No. 3).
- This is the 100th consecutive AP poll in which the Tar Heels are ranked, dating back to mid-conference play in the 2013-14 season.
- UNC began the year No. 8 in the preseason AP poll. It was the 13th time in 16 seasons under Roy Williams UNC was ranked in the preseason Top 10.
- This season is the 56th time in 71 seasons the Tar Heels have been ranked in the top 10 in at least one week of the poll.

PLAYING AP RANKED TEAMS

- Carolina has already played eight teams that are ranked in the final AP top 25, including three of the top four and six of the top 10 teams.
- Carolina is 8-4 this season against AP-ranked opponents.
- The Tar Heels have wins over No. 17 UCLA, No. 4 Gonzaga, No. 15 NC State, No. 10 Virginia Tech, No. 15 Louisville, No. 1 Duke, No. 16 Florida State and No. 4 Duke.
- UNC lost to No. 7 Michigan, No. 19 Kentucky, No. 4 Virginia and No. 5 Duke.
- Carolina had eight wins over ranked teams prior to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since winning 10 in 1998.

NUMBER ONE IN WINS PER SEASON

• Carolina came into the season having won an average of 20.7 games per season and has 27 wins this season. UNC is the only school in the top 10 in all-time NCAA wins that has averaged at least 20 wins per season.

SERIES NOTES

- Carolina is 3-1 against Iona, its opponent in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.
- Carolina is 2-0 vs. the Gaels in Chapel Hill and 1-1 in New York's Madison Square Garden.
- The teams last played on 11-18-2007 in the Smith Center in the Las Vegas Invitational. The No. 1-ranked Tar Heels won, 107-72, behind 27 points from Tyler Hansbrough, 15 from Danny Green and 13 points and nine assists by Ty Lawson.
- Iona's head coach, Tim Cluess, was Danny Green's high school coach at St. Mary's High School in Manhassett, N.Y.
- Carolina and Utah State have never played.
- Carolina is 2-0 against Washington.
- The Tar Heels beat the Huskies on 12-29-1972 in Honolulu in the Rainbow Classic and 3-20-2011 in Charlotte in the second round of the NCAA East Regional.
- The Huskies led the 2011 NCAA Tournament game by a point at the half, but Carolina won, 86-83 behind Tyler Zeller's 23 points, Harrison Barnes 22 points, John Henson's 10 rebounds and four blocks and Kendall Marshall's 13 points and 14 assists (most ever by a Tar Heel in an NCAA Tournament game).
- Terrence Ross led four Huskies in double figures with 19 points; Isaiah Thomas scored a dozen and had eight assists.

PLAYING IN COLUMBUS

- Carolina is 3-1 in Columbus, Ohio, having played Ohio State four times in three different buildings.
- The Tar Heels lost in 1929 in Taft Coliseum, beat the Buckeyes in the 1965-66 and 1992-93 seasons in St. John's Arena, and won 66-55 on 11-28-2007 in Nationwide Arena (then known as the Schottenstein Center).

AGAINST THE FIELD

- Carolina went 9-5 this season in 14 games against 10 different teams that are participants in the 2019 NCAA Tournament.
- UNC played all three other No. 1 seeds (2-1 vs. Duke, 1-0 vs. Gonzaga and 0-1 vs. Virginia) and two of four No. 2 seeds (0-1 vs. Kentucky and Michigan).
- Carolina went 2-1 vs. Louisville and 1-0 vs. Florida State, Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Wofford.

NCAA VETERANS

- Luke Maye and Kenny Williams have been a part of UNC teams that are 12-2 in three previous NCAA Tournament appearances, including winning the national title as sophomores in 2017.
- UNC has earned three No. 1 seeds and a No. 2 seed in their four seasons. It is the best four-year period based on seeds in Carolina Basketball history.
- UNC went 5-1 in their freshman season, winning the 2016 East Regional and the national semifinal over Syracuse before losing to Villanova

on a last-second shot in the national championship game.

- In 2017, Carolina went 6-0 in the NCAA Tournament, winning the South Regional and then beating Oregon and Gonzaga in Phoenix to win the national championship.
- Maye came off the bench that season, but hit the winning shot to beat Kentucky in the Elite

Eight to send UNC to the Final Four. Maye had a double-double vs. Butler in the Sweet 16 and 17 points against Kentucky in the regional final and was the Most Outstanding Player of the South Regional.

- Williams had started 22 of UNC's first 26 games in 2016-17, but injured his knee in practice in early February and did not appear in the post-season.
- Juniors Brandon Robinson and Seventh Woods also played on the 2017 championshiop team. Woods played three minutes in the title game vs.
- Last year, Carolina was the No. 2 seed in the West Regional, beat Lipscomb in the first round and lost to Texas A&M in the second.
- Sterling Manley had 10 rebounds against Lipscomb.
- Cameron Johnson played in one NCAA Tournsment game while at Pitt (against Wisconsin in 2016). Last year, he scored 12 points against Lipscomb and had seven vs. Texas A&M.

HALL OF FAMERS SCOTT, PERKINS

- Charlie Scott was inducted in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in September 2018.
- Scott became the 10th Tar Heel in the Naismith Hall of Fame, joining Ben Carnevale (inducted in 1970), Frank McGuire (1977), Dean Smith (1983), Billy Cunningham (1986), Bob McAdoo (2000), Larry Brown (2002), James Worthy (2003), Roy Williams (2007) and

- Michael Jordan (2009).
- Sam Perkins was inducted in November in the NABC College Basketball Hall of Fame in Kansas City.
- Perkins is the 11th Tar Heel in the College Hall of Fame with Brown, Carnevale, Cunningham, Phil Ford, McAdoo, McGuire, Scott, Smith, Williams and Worthy.
- Charlotte native, Tar Heel All-America forward, U.S. Olympian and NBA defensive stalwart Bobby Jones is one of 13 finalists for the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

HALL OF FAME HONORS FOR STEVE ROBINSON

- Steve Robinson, in his 16th season as assistant men's basketball coach at Carolina, is one of eight Division I coaches selected to the A STEP UP Assistant Coaches' Hall of Fame.
- A STEP UP is in its 10th year of educating and inspiring collegiate assistant coaches at all NCAA levels. A STEP UP will induct its inaugural Hall of Fame class on May 7 in Atlanta at its annual professional development symposium.
- Robinson came to Chapel Hill with head coach Roy Williams in 2003 and has helped lead the Tar Heels to NCAA championships in 2005, 2009 and 2017, two additional Final Four appearances, three ACC Tournament championships and nine ACC regular-season titles. Robinson also was an assistant on Williams' staff at Kansas for eight seasons, helping the Jayhawks reach the Final Four three times.



2018-19: Led or tied for the team lead in assists four times • Averaging 2.6 points and 2.2 assists in 11.2 minutes per game • Scored a career-best 14 points against Gonzaga on 12/15 • Is 4 for 10 from three-point range (made two 3FGs in his first two seasons) • Two-time defensive player of the game (Virginia Tech and Clemson) • Made his first career start against <u>UNCW</u> • Did not play in the two games in Las Vegas due to a concussion he suffered in practice on 11/20.

POSTGAME NOTES



GAME 1: UNC 78, at WOFFORD 67

- Luke Maye led all scorers with 24 points, Garrison Brooks scored 13 of his career-high 20 in the opening half and Cameron Johnson added five three-pointers in UNC's 78-67 win at Wofford
- The win improved UNC to 97-12 in season-opening games, including 15-1 under Roy Williams.
- Brooks made a career-high nine field goals (previous was five).
- Johnson was 5 for 7 from three-point range. It was the seventh time he made at least five threes in a game.
- Johnson broke a 46-all tie with a three, and added two more threes in a 14-5 UNC run that gave the Tar Heels a 60-51 lead.
- Freshmen Coby White and Nassir Little combined for 15 points and five assists.
- White became the 35th Tar Heel to start his first game as a freshman (the 15th under Roy Williams).

GAME 2: UNC 116, at ELON 67

- The 116 points were the most by the Tar Heels since a 116-48 win over UNC Asheville in Chapel Hill on 11/30/2008 and tied the record for most points in the Roy Williams era.
- The 49-point win was the largest road win in the Roy Williams era.
- Carolina held Elon to 16.1 percent shooting from the floor in the second half (5 of 31 field goal attempts). That was the lowest in a half by an opponent in the Roy Williams era (previous low was 16.7 percent by Radford in the second half of an 2009 NCAA Tournament first round game).
- Johnson and Little led the Tar Heels with 21 points apiece.
- Johnson and Little became the third and fourth Tar Heels in the first two games to score 20 or more points (Maye had 24 and Brooks 20 at Wofford). That had not been accomplished at UNC in more than 50 years.
- Little became the first Tar Heel freshman to score 20 points in a game since Justin Jackson had 22 against Virginia in the 2015 ACC Tournament
- Point guards Seventh Woods, Leaky Black and White combined for 12 assists and one turnover.

GAME 3: UNC 90, STANFORD 72

- Johnson led all scorers with 17 and Maye had 16 points and eight rebounds.
- The Tar Heels shot 60 percent from the floor (21 of 35), turned the ball over only five times and held the Cardinal to 35.5 percent shooting in building a 52-26 advantage at the half.
- Carolina improved to 102-7 in home openers, including 30-2 in the Smith Center.
- UNC has won 86 of its last 88 home openers, including 17 in a row.
- Carolina is 12-0 against Stanford, the second-most wins by UNC against any opponent without a loss (19-0 vs. The Citadel).

GAME 4: UNC 108, TENNESSEE TECH 58

- Carolina won for the 200th time against non-conference opponents in the Smith Center in 216 games.
- Carolina had season highs in assists (29), blocks (8), steals (16), rebound margin (54-24)

- and scoring margin (108-58).
- The Tar Heels shot 55.5 percent from the floor.
- The Tar Heels were credited with 29 fastbreak points, more than any game in at least three seasons. The season-high last year was 21.
- Carolina scored 30 second-chance points, most since scoring 36 against Nicholls on 12/19/2011.
- The 50-point margin of victory was UNC's largest since beating NC State by 51 on 1/8/2017.
- Woods had a career-high eight assists (previous was six against Long Beach on 11/15/2016).
- Woods made a three-pointer and scored seven points, all in the first half. It was the third 3FG of Woods career. He last made a three at Hawai'I on 11/18/16.
- Maye led six Tar Heels in double figures with 15 points.
- Sterling Manley scored a season-high 13, the second-most points in his career. He tied his career high with six field goals (also against Bucknell on 11/15/2017).

GAME 5: UNC 101, SAINT FRANCIS 76

- Carolina improved to 5-0 for the third year in a row and the seventh time in 16 seasons under Roy Williams.
- Carolina went on an 11-0 run after Saint Francis out-scored the Tar Heels, 16-6, to begin the second half to close within 58-52.
- It was the first time UNC scored 100 points in consecutive games since the 2016 Maui Invitational against Chaminade and Oklahoma State.
- Johnson led UNC in scoring with 20 points. It was his second 20-point game of the season and the 10th of his career.
- Maye had his first double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds.
- Kenny Williams tied his previous career high in assists with six in the first half and finished with a career-best nine.

GAME 6: TEXAS 92, CAROLINA 89 (Las Vegas)

- White scored 33 for UNC and Kerwin Roach II had 32 for the Longhorns. It was the first time a player on each team scored 30 or more points since Carolina's previous game in Las Vegas, against Kentucky on 12/16/2017 (Justin Jackson had 34 for the Tar Heels and Malik Monk scored 47 for UK).
- Carolina shot 44.3 percent from the floor, its lowest in the first six games.
- Carolina made a season-high 11 threes and allowed a season-high 11 threes.
- Texas became the first opponent to shoot 50 percent from the floor (.525) against the Tar Heels this season.
- Texas scored 31 points off 17 Tar Heel turnovers, the most since Vanderbilt scored 31 in San Juan on 11/21/2010.
- White's 33 points were the most by a UNC freshman since Harrison Barnes scored 40 against Clemson on 3/12/2011 in the ACC Tournament. It is the third-most points ever by a UNC freshman.
- White made seven three-pointers, the second most by a UNC freshman (Raymond Felton made eight, which equals the school record, against NC State on 1/26/2003).
- Johnson scored 16 points and hit the 1,000-point mark in his career.
- Brooks tied his career high with five offensive

- rebounds and total rebounds with eight.
- Carolina trailed at the half for the first time this year.

GAME 7: UNC 94, UCLA 78 (Las Vegas)

- Carolina won its 12th consecutive game against the Pac-12 and improved to 13-1 against Pac-12 opponents under Roy Williams.
- Carolina committed a season-low six turnovers, including only one in the second half.
- Carolina scored 53 points on 41 possessions in the second half – a season-best 1.29 points per possession for a half.
- Carolina tied its season high with 11 three-pointers.
- It was the fifth time in the first seven games UNC scored 90 or more points.
- Williams scored a season-high 15 points.
- White had 19 points and a season-high eight assists against UCLA.
- Brandon Robinson tied his career high with four assists (and had no turnovers) in 14 minutes of action.
- Johnson and Maye combined for seven first-half points and 23 in the second half.
- Johnson finished with 14 points, 11 of which he scored in the second half. He scored UNC's first nine points of the second half.

GAME 8: at MICHIGAN 84, UNC 67

- The Wolverines shot 59.3 percent in the second half and 57.4 percent for the game, while UNC made only 12 of 37 shots in the second half (.324).
- Carolina led 21-11 before an 11-0 UM run gave the Wolverines the lead. It was UNC's second straight loss when leading early in the game by double figures.
- Carolina committed only 10 turnovers, but Michigan converted them into 18 points.
- The Tar Heels scored only 26 of their 67 points in the paint.
- Carolina had season lows in points (game and in a half), field goal percentage (game and half), free throws made, attempted and percentage, assists, blocks and steals.
- Michigan had opponent highs to date in field goals, FG percentage, three-pointers and 3FG percentage, defensive boards and blocked shots.
- Maye had a season-high 15 rebounds, most by any Tar Heel in the first eight games. It was the seventh time in his career he grabbed at least 15 rebounds.
- White led UNC with 12 points and four assists. It was his third consecutive game as Carolina's leading scorer. Joel Berry II was the only Tar Heel to accomplish that last season. White is the first UNC freshman to do that since Harrison Barnes led four games in a row (twice) in 2010-11.
- It was Carolina's first game ever in Ann Arbor.
- Michigan's two offensive rebounds tied the fewest by an opponent in the Roy Williams era.

GAME 9: UNC 97, UNCW 69

- Johnson led UNC in scoring for the fourth time this season with 21 points.
- Williams had a game-high eight assists. It was the second time this year he had eight or more assists (his previous high in his first three seasons was six). It was the fifth time this season he has led or tied for the team lead in assists. He did that four times in his first three seasons.

- Manley grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds. It was the third time in his career he had double-figure rebounds and the first since the 2018 NCAA first round vs. Lipscomb.
- Brandon Huffman scored a season-high seven points.
- Carolina had 23 assists, including 15 on UNC's 18 field goals in the first half.
- The Tar Heels scored 34 points off UNCW's 25 turnovers; it was Carolina's most points off turnovers since scoring 37 against NC State on 1/8/2017.
- White did not play due to a sore left ankle; Robinson did not play due to a sore shoulder.
- Carolina made its first change to the starting lineup with Woods replacing White. It was Woods' first career start.
- Carolina improved to 168-18 against in-state, non-ACC teams.

GAME 10: UNC 103, GONZAGA 90

- The 103 points were UNC's second-most ever against an AP top-five team (105 vs. No. 4 Louisville in Final Four consolation game, 3/25/1972; 103 vs. No. 4 Gonzaga; and 101 vs. No. 2 Virginia, 1/15/1983)
- It was the sixth time in 25 games all-time under Roy Williams that UNC won when allowing 90 or points.
- UNC had lost the previous four games when it allowed 80 points. Also had lost the previous four times the opponents shot 50 percent from the floor.
- Carolina improved to 27-22 when playing host to an AP top-five opponent, including 7-1 against top-five, non-conference opponents.
- Out-scored Gonzaga, 27-0, in second-chance points.
- Gonzaga was first opponent to score zero second-chance points since Clemson on 1/16/2018.
- UNC committed a season-high 23 turnovers. It was the first time UNC won when committing 20 or more turnovers since committing 20 vs. Syracuse on 1/26/2015.
- Gonzaga's 29 points off UNC turnovers were the second most vs. UNC this year (31 by Texas).
- Maye had 20 points and 16 rebounds. His 20th point was his 1,000th career point.
- It was the 15th 20-point game of Maye's career, 21st double-double and eighth time with 15 or more rebounds.
- Maye was 7 for 7 from the free throw line, the best game of his career (previous best perfect game was 5 for 5 vs. Pitt as a junior)
- Johnson made six threes and led all scorers with 25 points, his second career game with 25 or more.
- Woods scored a career-high 14 points (had 11 to set a career high just in the first half).
- Woods made six field goals his previous high in a game was three on three occasions.
- Woods made two three-pointers for the first time in his career.
- Brooks had a then-career-high nine rebounds (previous was eight). He tied his career high with five offensive rebounds.

GAME 11: KENTUCKY 80, UNC 72 (Chicago)

- Carolina committed 18 turnovers that led to 23 Kentucky points, the fourth time in the first 11 games UNC's opponents scored 20 or more points off turnovers.
- Carolina had season lows in offensive rebounds (five), total rebounds (33), points in a half (31 in the first) and points per possession in a half (.69

- in the first, 31 points on 45 possessions).
- Carolina was out-rebounded for the first time this season (44-33).
- Johnson led UNC in scoring (17) for the third game in a row and sixth time in 11 games, but tied his career high with five turnovers.
- Kentucky had 24 assists on 28 baskets. The 24 assists were the most by an opponent in the first 11 games.
- Kentucky point guard Ashton Hagans made eight steals, which equaled the second-most by an opponent vs. UNC and were the most since Maryland's Juan Dixon had eight in 2002.
 Hagans tied UK's single-game record and were the most against a Roy Williams-coached UNC team.
- The loss dropped UNC to 3-2 in the CBS Sports Classic and 4-4 in Chicago.

GAME 12: UNC 82, DAVIDSON 60

- Carolina held the Wildcats to 29.9 percent shooting from the floor, lowest by an opponent in the first 12 games.
- Davidson attempted 38 three-pointers.
- Carolina ended the first half on a 20-4 run over the final 9:02. Davidson led 24-19 after free throws with 9:03 to play. Neither team scored again until Brooks' three-point play with 6:40 to play.
- The Tar Heels scored 19 points in the first 13:30, then scored 20 points in the final 6:40 of the first half.
- Carolina also out-scored the Wildcats 14-4 to start the second half to increase the run to 34-8 over a span of 14:10.
- Carolina held the Wildcats to 11 points over an 18:03 stretch midway through the game.
- Maye had his fourth double-double of the season and 22nd of his career with 11 points and a game-high 14 rebounds (10 rebounds in the opening half).
- Johnson did not score until the 6:14 mark of the first half but finished with a game-high 17 points.
- White had seven assists before he scored a single point.

GAME 13: UNC 77, HARVARD 57

- Harvard shot six more free throws than UNC in the first half (5 for UNC, 11 for Harvard); in the second half UNC went 15 for 17 from the line and the Crimson was 1 of 2.
- Carolina shot a season-high 86.4 percent from the free throw line.
- Carolina shot 34.6 percent from the floor in the second half (9 of 26), its second lowest in a half in the first 13 games (second half at Michigan).
- Carolina forced 22 turnovers and out-scored Harvard, 21-9 in points off turnovers.
- Maye (14), Johnson (13) and White (13) led five in double figures.
- Little (12 points) scored in double figures for the second game in a row and shared the team lead in rebounding with seven. It was the first time he has led UNC in rebounding and the seven rebounds tied his season high.

GAME 14: UNC 85. at PITT 60

- Cameron Johnson returned to the Petersen Events Center, where he played from 2014-17, and had 15 points, nine rebounds and four assists, and made three 3FGs.
- White led all scorers with 22 points. It was the first time he led UNC in scoring since Michigan

- and his second 20-point game of the season.
- Carolina's points per possession of .91 was its lowest in a win to date this season.
- UNC made 10 three-pointers (seven in the first half). It was the fifth time this year Carolina made 10 or more threes. The seven threes in the opening 20 minutes equaled the most in a half this year (UNC also made seven in the first half vs. both Saint Francis and Gonzaga).
- Pitt's 19 field goals, two threes and 19 threepoint attempts were season lows to date by an opponent.
- Pitt's 20 free throws, 32 free throw attempts, 16 offensive rebounds and 46 total rebounds were season highs to date by UNC opponents.
- Carolina led for 38:35 and never trailed.
- The game was tied 12-12 before Cameron Johnson hit a three to give UNC a 15-12 lead. The Panthers scored to make it 15-14, then the Tar Heels went on a 16-0 run to lead 31-16.
- Carolina held the Panthers without a field goal for 12:10 in the first half. Pitt missed 15 consecutive field goal attempts and UNC forced seven turnovers in that span.
- Brooks had nine points, eight rebounds, five assists and no turnovers. It was the first time he led the Tar Heels in assists.
- Maye (17/11) became the 29th Tar Heel with 700 or more career rebounds.
- Robinson made a career-high three steals and scored five points in 15 minutes (the most minutes he had played in an ACC game in his career).

GAME 15: UNC 90, at NC STATE 82

- It was Carolina's sixth straight win at NC State.Carolina tied its season high with 23 turnovers
- (wins over Gonzaga and NC State).
- It was the most turnovers in a road win since 2/2/2006 at Maryland when UNC committed 24 in a 77-62 win.
- It was the first time UNC won a road game with 20 or more turnovers since Ty Lawson hit a buzzer-beating three at Florida State on 1/28/2009. UNC committed 21 in that win in Tallahassee.
- All five starters scored in double figures for the first time this season.
- NC State came into the game fifth in the country in offensive rebound percentage (.392), but the Tar Heels grabbed 37 defensive rebounds to the Pack's 10 offensive boards (.213).
- Carolina came into the game first in the ACC and sixth nationally in rebound margin (at +11.1) and out-rebounded State by 18 (51-33).
- Carolina was 22 for 26 from the free throw line
- Maye (21/11), Johnson (15/11) and Kenny Williams (15/10) had double-doubles. This was the first time three Tar Heels had double-doubles since the 2012 NCAA Sweet 16 against Ohio (Tyler Zeller, John Henson and Reggie Bullock).
- It was a career-high 10 rebounds for Kenny Williams and his first career double-double.
- Johnson had a season-high five assists and made 4 of 7 three-pointers.
- Johnson left the game with 12:36 to play due to leg cramps and did not return.
- The game was tied twice at 47-all and 53-all. Both times, Johnson broke the tie with a three-pointer. He was fouled and converted a four-point play on the first one.
- Brooks had 11 points, seven rebounds and five assists. It was the second game in a row he led or tied for the lead in assists, the first two times he has done that as a Tar Heel.

GAME 16: LOUISVILLE 83, UNC 62

- Louisville made its first seven shots from the floor and six of its first nine three-point tries, out-rebounded the Tar Heels by nine and held UNC to under 35 percent shooting from the floor.
- Carolina was a season-worst 3 for 22 from three-point range (Johnson 0-4, Maye 1-6, White 0-3, Williams 1-4).
- It was Carolina's first home loss this season.
- It was the largest home loss in 16 seasons under Roy Williams. The previous was a 69-53 loss to Duke on 3/9/2013.
- It was the largest home loss since 1/31/2002, an 87-58 loss to Duke.
- It was Carolina's third-largest loss in the Smith Center (29 against Duke and 22 against Wake Forest, both in the 2001-02 season).
- It was the largest home loss by a ranked Tar Heel team (AP) against a non-ranked opponent.
- Carolina had season lows in field goals (20), field goal attempts (58), field goal percentage (.345), field goal percentage in a half (.308 in the second), three-pointers (3), three-point percentage (.136), rebounds (31), assists (tied, 13), points (62) and points in a half (28 in the second).
- Carolina's points per possession was a season-low .73 (62 points on 85 possessions). Its previous low was .82 in losses to Michigan and Kentucky.
- Carolina's second-half points per possession was its low in a half this season. UNC scored 28 second-half points on 45 possessions (.62). Previous low was .69 in the first half against Kentucky.
- Kenny Williams led UNC in scoring for the first time this season. His 12 points match the dozen scored by Coby White at Michigan for the fewest points by Carolina's leading scorer in any game this season.
- It was Carolina's largest loss to Louisville (previous was a 97-80 loss in Freedom Hall in Louisville on 12/23/1999).

GAME 17: UNC 75. NOTRE DAME 69

- Carolina out-scored the Irish, 12-1, in a 5:35 span in the second half. Notre Dame led 58-57 before the Tar Heels went on the 12-1 run. White (5) and Little (5) accounted for 10 of the 12 Tar Heel points.
- Carolina shot 39.7 percent from the floor. It was the first time this season UNC won when shooting under 40 percent from the floor.
- The teams combined for just three turnovers in the second half – two by the Tar Heels and one by the Irish.
- Carolina's first-half points per possession of .75 (33 points on 44 possessions) was its thirdworst in a half this season. In the second half, UNC scored 42 points on 44 possessions (.95).
- White led UNC in scoring (17) for the fifth time and second time in four ACC games.
- Little scored all 11 of his points in the second half. It was the most points in a half since he had all 11 of his points in the second half against Texas on 11/22.
- Johnson did not make a three-pointer for the second game in a row but had a season-high six assists
- Robinson set a career high with three three-point field goals, all in the first half.
- Notre Dame's John Mooney had 16 points, 19 rebounds and four blocks. The 19 rebounds tied the most by an opponent in the Smith Center and equaled the fourth most by any player in the

Smith Center. He had 16 defensive boards, most against a Roy Williams-UNC team.

GAME 18: UNC 85, at MIAMI 76

- Carolina shot 55.0 percent from the floor, its second-highest percentage in the first 18 games (highest to date in an ACC game). It was the highest since the Tennessee Tech game (.554).
- It was the first time in eight games UNC shot 50 percent from the floor (first time since Gonzaga).
- Carolina shot 60 percent from the floor in the second half. It was the best second-half shooting game of the season to date and matched the highest in any half (also shot 60 percent in the first half vs. Stanford).
- Carolina's first 10 field goals in the second half were two-pointers. The Tar Heels then made five of their next six baskets from three-point range three by Johnson and two by Williams.
- Carolina had 26 assists, second most this season and most since UNC had 29 against Tennessee Tech.
- Johnson went 5 for 7 from three-point range and led all scorers with 22 points. It was the third time this year he made at least five threes in a game (five at Wofford, six vs. Gonzaga).
- White tied his season high with eight assists (also vs. UCLA). Maye also tied his season high with four assists and Robinson tied his career best with four.
- Kenny Williams scored 16 points, tied his season high with three three-pointers and had six assists and no turnovers.
- Miami made 7 of 14 three-pointers in the first half, but UNC held the Canes to 2 for 7 from three-point distance in the second half.

GAME 19: UNC 103, VIRGINIA TECH 82

- Carolina made 16 three-pointers, which equaled the second most in UNC history and second most by UNC in the Smith Center. It was the fourth time UNC made 16 in any game and the first time since against Western Carolina on 12/6/2017.
- The teams made 29 three-pointers, most ever in a game in the Smith Center. The previous high was 28 by UNC (16) and Western Carolina (12) on 12/6/17.
- Carolina made 1 of its first 12 from three, then made 14 of its next 19 and finished 16 of 34 for the game.
- Carolina attempted 34 three-pointers, second most in UNC history and the most ever by a Roy Williams team.
- Carolina attempted more three-point shots (34) than two-pointers (33). It was the first time this season UNC took more threes than twos.
- Carolina shot 60.6 percent from the floor in the second half. It was the second game in a row UNC shot 60 percent from the floor in the second half and was the highest percentage in a half to date this season.
- Carolina went on a 20-0 run (part of a 32-9 run to end the first half).
- Carolina's points per possession of 1.18 was a season best (previous 1.13 vs. UCLA).
- The 21-point win was Carolina's largest over a top-10 team in the AP poll since beating No. 10 Gonzaga, 98-77, in the Sweet 16 in 2009.
- White became the first Tar Heel to lead the team in points (27), rebounds (7), assists (6) and steals (4) since Joseph Forte at Duke, 2/1/2001 (Forte had 24/16/6/3).
- Little scored a season-high 23 points.

- The 50 points by White and Little were the most ever by a pair of UNC freshmen. The previous high was 48 by Harrison Barnes (40) and Kendall Marshall (8) vs. Clemson in 2011 and Raymond Felton (28) and Rashad McCants (20) vs. NC State in 2003.
- It was the third time two UNC freshmen scored 20 points in the same game (Felton and McCants against Virginia and NC State in 2003).
- Maye tied his career high with four three-pointers.

GAME 20: UNC 77, at GEORGIA TECH 54

- Carolina led by seven at the half, then began the second half on a 25-5 run, during which UNC made five threes and scored the other 10 points on fastbreaks.
- Carolina was 13 for 27 from three-point range. UNC made 29 three-pointers in the last two games, most in UNC history in consecutive games (16 vs. Virginia Tech and 13 at Georgia Tech).
- The previous record for consecutive games was 27 in 1994-95 (10 in Greensboro vs. Virginia Tech on 1/21/95 and a school-record 17 at home vs. Florida State on 1/25/95).
- UNC's previous high for made three-pointers in consecutive games under Roy Williams was 25 twice (10 vs. Long Beach State and 15 vs. Mississippi State in 2012-13 season and 16 vs. Maryland and nine vs. Virginia in the 2008-09 season).
- Tech's 54 points were the fewest allowed by UNC in the first 20 games and the fewest in ACC road game since 2015.
- Johnson led UNC with a game-high 22 points. It was the ninth time this year he led the team in scoring and his sixth 20-point game of the season.
- Johnson made 8 of 10 shots from the floor, a season-best percentage of .800.
- White tied his season high with eight assists and made five three-pointers en route to 19 points.
- Carolina improved to 4-0 on the road in ACC play for the first time in 11 seasons and the second time under Roy Williams.
- Carolina scored 24 fastbreak points, second most this season (29 vs. Tennessee Tech).
- Carolina scored a season-low one second-chance point (previous low was eight vs. Davidson).
- Carolina held Tech to 35 percent shooting from the floor, the fifth time this season an opponent shot 35 percent or lower.
- The Tar Heels shot 53.1 percent from the floor in the second half. UNC has shot 60.0, 60.6 and now 53.1 percent in the second half in the last three games.
- Roy Williams won his 211th ACC game, moving him into third in ACC history.

GAME 21: UNC 79, at LOUISVILLE 69

- Carolina avenged a 21-point home loss three weeks earlier by building a 19-point advantage and winning by 10 on the Cards' home floor.
- It was the first time Carolina lost a home game by 20 or more points then beat a team on its home floor by 10 or more in the same season.
- It was the first time since 1938-39 (Wake Forest) Carolina lost by 20 or more at home then beat the same team on its home floor in the same season (the Deacons won by 20 in Woollen Gym, UNC then won by two points at Wake Forest).

- It was the first time a Roy Williams' team lost at home by double figures then won by double figures on the other team's home floor since 2006 (Miami).
- It was Carolina's second win in as many years at Louisville.
- Carolina improved to 5-0 on the road in ACC the eighth time in nine years and the 12th time in Roy Williams' 16 years the Tar Heels have clinched a winning record on the road in ACC play.
- Maye had a game-high 20 points and 11 rebounds.
- Johnson had his fifth career double-double with 19 and 10.
- Brooks was 6 for 9 from the floor for 12 points. He and Maye did an outstanding job defending Steven Enoch, who had 17 points and 13 rebounds in Chapel Hill but was held scoreless with four rebounds.
- Carolina made six three-pointers. UNC made 53 three-pointers in the last five games, most in any five-game stretch in school history.
- Louisville entered the game 12th in the country in getting to the free throw line, but went seven of nine, the fewest makes and attempts by an UNC opponent in the first 21 games.
- Louisville won the rebounding battle, 40-31, in Chapel Hill, but the Tar Heels had a 49-32 advantage in the rematch and out-scored UL 18-3 in second-chance points.
- The Tar Heels had 18 offensive rebounds on 43 missed shots; the Cards grabbed seven offensive boards on 38 misses.

GAME 22: UNC 113, NC STATE 96

- Carolina swept the regular-season series against NC State for the 12th time in 16 seasons under Roy Williams.
- The 113 points were the most ever by the Tar Heels in 236 games against NC State and were the second most allowed in any game in NC State history.
- The 113 points were the most by UNC in an ACC game since 12/20/2003, when UNC lost in triple overtime to Wake Forest, 119-114, and the most points by UNC in a regulation-length ACC game since UNC scored 115 vs. Clemson on 1/13/1968.
- The 113 points were the fourth most by UNC in a regulation-length ACC game.
- Carolina shot a season-high 56.1 percent from the floor.
- Carolina had season highs in free throws made (31) and attempted (37).
- Maye had a game-high and season-high 31 points and 12 rebounds. It was his fourth career 30-point game (third against NC State).
- Maye has averaged 29.0 points and 13.0 rebounds in his last four games vs. NC State.
- Maye's 116 points in his last four games vs. NC State (31-33-21-33) are the most points ever scored by a Tar Heel in four straight games against the Pack (previous was 106 by Lennie Rosenbluth from 1955-56 to 1956-57...23-26-29-28).
- Maye became the first Tar Heel to ever score 30 points three different times against NC State. There have been 18 30-point games by Tar Heels against NC State (by 14 players). Maye has three, Charlie Scott and Phil Ford both had two.
- Maye tied the season high for field goals by a Tar Heel with 10 (Coby White had 10 vs. Texas).
- Maye shot a UNC-best 10 for 10 from the free throw line.

- Brooks had career highs in rebounds (10) and assists (6), scored eight points and had no turnovers.
- Brooks had 11 assists and no turnovers in 46 minutes this season against NC State.
- White had 21 points and four assists. It was his fourth 20-point game and his third in ACC play.
- Williams scored a season-high 17 points (previous was 16 at Miami).
- Johnson was 3 for 5 from three-point range and scored 17 points and had three steals. It was the 10th time this year he made three or more 3FGs (UNC is 10-0 in those 10 games).
- Maye (10), Little (8) and White (7) each made a season- and career-high number of free throws.

GAME 23: UNC 88, MIAMI 85 (0T)

- White scored 33 and had six assists, Maye hit a game-tying three with 10.2 seconds to play and Carolina won an overtime game for the eighth time in 11 tries.
- Miami (14) and Carolina (13) combined for 27 three-pointers, which tied the third most in any game in the Smith Center.
- Carolina committed 10 turnovers, which tied the fewest this season in an ACC game.
- Miami's 14 three-pointers were the most by an opponent this year.
- It was the first time this season UNC won a game when it was out-rebounded.
- It was the first time a Tar Heel had at least 33 points and six assists since Joseph Forte (38 and 6) vs. Tulsa on 11/11/2000.
- It was just the fourth time ever a Tar Heel had at least 33 points and six assists (Charlie Scott did it twice and Forte in 2000).
- White's 33 points tied the 33 he scored against Texas on 11/22 for the third most by a Tar Heel freshman. Tyler Hansbrough scored 40 vs. Georgia Tech on 2/15/2006 and Harrison Barnes had 40 against Clemson on 3/12/2011.
- White became the second UNC freshman to score 30 or more twice (J.R. Reid had 31 twice in 1986-87), but the first to score as many as 33 twice.
- White made seven threes (he also did that against Texas), which equaled the seventh most made in a game by any Tar Heel and equaled the second most by a UNC freshman (Raymond Felton made eight vs. NC State in 2003 as a freshman).
- White's 11 field goals were the most by a UNC freshman since Kennedy Meeks had 11 at Florida State in 2014.
- White became the first UNC freshman to score 20 in consecutive games (had 21 against NC State) since Harrison Barnes in 2011.
- When Maye tied the game with a three with 10.2 seconds to play, it was the first time Miami had not led since the 13:48 mark of the second half.
- Kenny Williams made one three-pointer, but it came with 2:08 to play in overtime and gave Carolina an 82-79 lead, its first lead since it led 47-45 with just under 14 minutes to play in the second half.

GAME 24: VIRGINIA 69. UNC 61

- The loss snapped UNC's seven-game ACC win streak.
- The 61 points were a season low. Previous low was 62 in the home loss to Louisville.
- Carolina shot 35.4 percent for the game, lowest since shooting 34.5 in that loss to Louisville.

- Carolina tied its season-low for free throws made with six (also at Georgia Tech), but set a season low in free throw attempts with just seven (previous was 11 at Georgia Tech).
- Carolina tied its season low for points in the paint with 22 (also at Georgia Tech).
- Carolina made nine three-pointers, but its last was a White three with 12:06 to play that gave UNC a 49-43 lead.
- Carolina scored eight points in the final 8:57. The Tar Heels led 53-46 with 8:58 to play after a Cameron Johnson basket.
- White led UNC in scoring with 17 points, Maye had a game-high 11 rebounds but was held to four points, which tied his season low (also at Georgia Tech).
- Little played just two minutes in the first half before spraining his right ankle. He did not return.
- It was Virginia's eighth win in 74 games in Chapel Hill (UNC leads 24-5 in the Smith Center).
- It was also Virginia's fourth win in 10 games all-time in which both teams were ranked in the AP top 10.

GAME 25: UNC 95, at WAKE FOREST 57

- UNC improved to 6-0 in ACC road games.
- The 38-point margin of victory was the largest in series history and was the largest ACC road win in UNC history (previous 34 at Virginia Tech om 12/19/2004 and at Virginia on 1/29/2005).
- The loss was the worst for Wake Forest in 30 years at LJVM Coliseum.
- Carolina made 16 three-pointers, which tied the season high (also vs. Virginia Tech) and equaled the second most in UNC history.
- Carolina shot a season-high 62.3 percent from the floor.
- Carolina made 16 of 25 three-pointers to shoot 64 percent, which tied the third-highest percentage in a game in UNC history and was the highest in any road game in UNC history.

- In the first half, Carolina shot a season-high (for a half) 74.1 percent from the floor to build a 49-21 lead. The 28-point margin was Carolina's largest halftime lead of the season (previous 26 vs. Stanford).
- It was Carolina's best shooting in a half since shooting 78.1 percent in the second half at NC State on 2/10/2018.
- Carolina scored the game's first 18 points. It was the second time this year UNC jumped out to at least a 12-0 lead in an ACC road game (also 12-0 at NC State).
- In the first half, UNC scored 49 points on 38 possessions (1.29), while the Deacons scored 21 points on 43 possessions (.49).
- Johnson led all scorers with 27 points, his seventh 20-point game of the season and the 10th time he led UNC in scoring.
- Johnson made a career high seven 3FGs.
- Maye had a game-high seven rebounds and surpassed 800 career rebounds (806).
- It was UNC's sixth win in a row over Wake Forest and 10th in 11 games.
- Carolina was 3 for 11 from the free throw line, the second-worst free throw percentage (.273) in

school history. No starter made a free throw.

• Wake Forest scored 21 points in the first half, fewest in any half by an opponent this year.

GAME 26: UNC 88, at DUKE 72

- It was the 14th time UNC has defeated the No. 1 team in the AP poll, more than any other school in college basketball history.
- It was the eighth time Roy Williams has defeated the No. 1 team in the AP poll. That breaks a tie with Gary Williams for the most wins over the AP No. 1 team in college basketball history.
- Carolina is now 8-10 against Duke when the Blue Devils are ranked No. 1 in the AP poll. This was Carolina's fourth win at Cameron Indoor Stadium against a No. 1-ranked Duke team.
- Carolina had 21 assists, the 14th time this season the Tar Heels assisted on 20 or more field goals.
- Carolina shot 50.7 percent from the floor, including 57.1 percent in the second half, the seventh time in the last nine games UNC has 50 percent or better in the second half.
- The Tar Heels made only 2 of 20 three-pointers. The two threes are a season low for the Tar Heels.
- Carolina's three-point percentage (.100) was its lowest in a win since UNC beat Gardner-Webb in the 2012-13 season opener when the Tar Heels made 1 of 12 (.083).
- Carolina scored 62 of its 88 points in the paint. The 62 points were the most by Carolina this season in an ACC game and the second most in any game (64 against Tennessee Tech). The previous high in an ACC game this year was 50 in the home win over NC State.
- Carolina never trailed and led for all but 34 seconds.
- Maye scored 30 points and had a game-high 15 rebounds. It was his third career 30/15 game (vs. Boston College and NC State last year) and just the second by a Tar Heel against Duke. Billy Cunningham had 31 points and 16 rebounds, also at Duke, on Feb. 23, 1963.
- Maye is the first Tar Heel to score 30 or more points in his career at both Duke and NC State.
- Johnson made a career-high 11 field goals and scored 26 points. It was the first time he scored 20 or more points in a game in which he did not make a three-point field goal (was 0 for 4).
- Brooks had 14 points and eight rebounds. The 14 points equal his second-highest career scoring game and were the most he has scored in an ACC game.
- The 16-point win was the second-largest by a Williams-led team at Duke. UNC won by 18 in 2012 (88-70).

GAME 27: UNC 77, FLORIDA STATE 59

- Carolina beat an AP-ranked team for the seventh time in 10 games. The seven wins are the most for UNC against ranked teams in the regular season since 2007.
- Carolina held the Seminoles to their lowest field goal percentage of the season (.305, previous low was .341 against Virginia).
- FSU's 18 field goals were the fewest by an opponent in the first 27 games.
- The 18-point margin of victory is the largest against FSU this season.
- FSU's shooting percentage was the lowest by a Tar Heel opponent in ACC play this season (previous .306 by Pitt).
- The Tar Heels held the Seminoles to 59 points, 19.2 points below their average.

- Carolina came into the game No. 1 in the nation in rebounds per game (42.7 per game) and had 47.
- Carolina came into the game No. 3 in the nation in rebound margin (+9.3 per game) and out-rebounded the Seminoles, 47-32 (+15).
- The 47-32 rebound margin for Carolina (+15) was the largest against FSU this season.
- Little scored in double figures for the 14th time, the first time since he had 10 against Miami on 2/9, and grabbed a season-high eight rebounds.
- It was the second time Little led the team or shared team scoring honors. He and Johnson also shared team scoring honors at Elon.
- Johnson had his third double-double of the season with 18 points and 10 rebounds.
- FSU scored four points off 10 UNC turnovers, the fewest points off turnovers by an opponent in the first 27 games.

GAME 28: UNC 93, SYRACUSE 85

- It was Carolina's eighth win in a row over the Orange.
- Carolina is now 3-5 this season when trailing at the half (wins over UCLA, Notre Dame and Syracuse). The Orange led by as many as nine in the first half. In the second half, Syracuse led by three points for just 28 seconds.
- UNC made a season-high 34 free throws, attempted a season-high 37 and shot a season-best 91.9 percent from the line (previous highs were 31 for 37 in the home win over NC State and 88.4 percent against Harvard).
- This was the first game in which UNC shot 90 percent from the line with at least 20 attempts since shooting 90.5 percent (19 for 21) against Providence in Raleigh in the 2016 NCAA Tournament second round.
- White scored 34 points to become the first Tar Heel freshman to score 30 points three times.
- White went 10 for 10 from the line, the first UNC freshman to make at least 10 for 10 in a game since Tyler Hansbrough went 14 for 14 against NC State in 2006.
- White made six three-pointers. He had made six combined in the previous four games.
- Little scored in double figures (11) for the second game in a row.
- Maye had a game-high 12 rebounds and a career-high six assists.

GAME 29: UNC 81, at CLEMSON 79

- White (28) and Johnson (19) both made six three-pointers and combined for 47 of UNC's 81 points.
- It was the first time in UNC history two Tar Heels made six three-pointers in a game.
- It was also the first time in UNC history a player (White) made at least six threes in consecutive games.
- White's 62 points in the last two games were the second most by a Tar Heel freshman in consecutive games. Record is 65 by Tyler Hansbrough in 2006 (25 vs. Miami and 40 vs. Georgia Tech).
- The Tar Heels won at Clemson for the eighth time in their last 10 attempts.
- Maye's one three-pointer of the game, which cut Clemson's lead to one midway through second half, was his 100th career three-pointer.
- Roy Williams left the court with 55 seconds to play in the first half due to vertigo and did not return to the bench. Assistant coach Steve Robinson led the team in Williams' absence.

GAME 30: UNC 79, at BOSTON COLLEGE 66

- Carolina won its 25th game for the 39th time all-time and the 12th time in Roy Williams' 16 seasons as head coach.
- Johnson had 22 points, 12 rebounds and 5 assists. He is the first Tar Heel with 20/10/5 since Maye vs. Arkansas a year ago in Portland.
- Johnson in the nine ACC road wins: 20.8 points per game, shot 58.3 percent from the floor, 57.4 from three (35 of 61) and averaged 7.1 rebounds.
- Johnson set a UNC record by shooting 57.3 percent from three-point range in ACC road games. The previous record was 55.3 by Kenny Smith in 1987.
- Roy Williams has led UNC to 88 wins in 135 ACC road games, a winning percentage of .652 that is second in ACC history behind Vic Bubas (.667) and first among coaches with at least 100 games.
- Carolina finished the season undefeated on the road in ACC games this season, posting its first 9-0 conference record and its seventh unbeaten ACC road mark all-time.
- Maye had a career-high 20 rebounds plus 17 points and five assists. It was his 13th double-double of the season, 31st in his career and fourth in the last five games.
- Maye's 20 rebounds were the most by a Tar Heel since Brice Johnson had 21 at Duke on 3/5/2016
- Johnson also had 12 rebounds for his fourth double-double of the season.
- Maye is the first Tar Heel to have a double-double in a half since he did it against BC on 1/19/18 (21 points/10 rebounds in first half).
- White (469 points) passed Mike O'Koren (458) and Michael Jordan (460) for 10th place on the UNC freshman scoring list.
- Carolina had 60 rebounds, which tied its season high (also at Elon).
- Carolina has won 12 in a row over Boston College.
- The Tar Heels are 16-4 against BC since the Eagles joined the ACC, including 8-1 in Conte Forum.

GAME 31: UNC 79, DUKE 70

- Tar Heels clinched a share of the ACC regular-season championship at 16-2.
- Carolina improved to 9-0 under Roy Williams against Duke in the final game of the regular season when first place in the ACC (outright or share) is on the line. UNC has won those games in 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2016, 2017 and 2019.
- Carolina improved to 6-3 in the Smith Center in AP top-five games, including 4-2 against the Blue Devils.
- It was Carolina's eighth win over AP-ranked teams this season, most in the regular season since winning 10 in 1997-98.
- Carolina has won 14 of its last 15 games, its best stretch since 2010-11.
- Carolina held Duke to 34.2 percent shooting from the floor, the Blue Devils' lowest FG percentage of the season. Duke's previous low was 34.7 percent against Carolina on 2/20/2019 in Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- Coby White led UNC in scoring with 21 points. It was his 11th time as UNC's leading scorer and the eighth time he scored 20 or more.
- White did not commit a turnover (had six at Duke on 2/20). It was his first game this season with no turnovers.

- White set the UNC freshman record for threes in a season. He hit four for the game, which gave him 75 for the season to break the record which was previously held by Rashad McCants (72 in 2003).
- Kenny Williams made a season-high four threes and scored a season-high 18 points (previous was 17 vs. NC State). He drew four charges.
- Maye had a career-high seven assists and grabbed 16 rebounds. Maye has 36 rebounds in the last two games (20 at BC).
- Brooks scored 10 points, his third straight game scoring in double figures against Duke.
- Carolina won at Cameron and the Smith Center in the same season for the first time since 2009.
- Carolina has won three in a row against Duke for the first time since the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons.
- Carolina did not make a field goal in the final 6:47. It was the first time UNC won when not making a field goal in the final five minutes since March 9, 2018, against Duke in the ACC Tournament semifinal (no field goals in the last 5:32).

GAME 32: UNC 83, LOUISVILLE 70 ACC QUARTERFINAL, CHARLOTTE, N.C.

- Carolina has won 15 of its last 16 games, the first time UNC has done that in ACC play since 1986-87
- With the win, Carolina advanced to the semifinals for the fifth consecutive year and 51st time in 66 seasons.
- Carolina scored 27 fastbreak points, second most this season and most since it had 29 against Tennessee Tech on November 16.
- Carolina allowed two second-chance points; Louisville had 15 in beating UNC in Chapel Hill in January.
- This was the 24th time this season UNC has out-rebounded the opponents (UNC is 24-3 in those games).
- Carolina committed nine turnovers and forced 11 by Louisville; UNC is 16-1 this season when it forces more turnovers than the Tar Heels commit.
- Maye tied the UNC record for playing in 59 ACC wins (52 regular season and now seven ACC Tournament wins). Nate Britt and Isaiah Hicks also played in 59 ACC wins from 2013-17.
- Maye and Coby White led UNC in scoring with 19 apiece.
- It was the fourth time in the last five games White led UNC in scoring (Syracuse, Clemson, Duke and Louisville).
- White also tied his season high with seven rebounds and had six assists and one turnover.
- Maye passed Al Lifson in career scoring. Maye with 1,329 points. With nine rebounds, he passed Ademola Okulaja for 12th place in UNC history with 899.
- Brooks scored 11 points. It was the first time this season and the first time since his first two games as a freshman he scored in double figures in consecutive games.
- Robinson made two three-pointers (for the first time since Wake Forest on Feb. 16) and scored seven points, with four rebounds and two assists.

GAME 33: DUKE 74, UNC 73 ACC SEMIFINAL, CHARLOTTE, N.C.

- It was Carolina's second loss in its last 17 games.
- The game featured eight lead changes and five ties.
- Carolina took a 73-72 lead on a Nassir Little dunk with 47 seconds to play, but Zion Williamson (31 points) scored the game-winner on a putback of his own missed shot with 31 seconds to play.
- Carolina made 25 of 46 shots from two-point range (54.3 percent) and 4 of 27 from three (14.8 percent).
- Carolina made four threes, its third fewest in a game this season (made two in the win at Duke and three in the home loss to Louisville).
- The Blue Devils scored 50 points in the paint, which equaled the most by an opponent this season (NC State scored 50 of its 96 points in Chapel Hill in the paint in a UNC win).
- Duke overcame a 13-point deficit, which ties UNC's largest lead in a loss this season. Texas also trailed by 13 (17-4) and came back to win.
- Carolina shot 39.7 percent from the floor. UNC is 1-4 this season when shooting under 40 percent.
- Carolina scored 29 points in the second half, equaling its second fewest in a half this year (scored 28 in the second half in its home loss to Louisville). UNC also scored 29 in the first half in the home loss to Virginia.
- Johnson led UNC with 23 points. It was his 31st game in double figures and his 10th 20-point game this season.
- Maye had 14 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. It was his 14th double-double this year and the 32nd of his career.
- It was Maye's seventh game with double-digit rebounds in the last eight games.
- Maye had 44 rebounds in the three games against Duke this year (15, 16 and 13).
- Maye became the 12th Tar Heel to reach 900 career rebounds.
- White scored in double figures for the 25th time with 11 points. He was 0 for 6 from three-point range, which equaled his most attempts without a three this season (also 0 for 6 in a win at Louisville).
- Robinson was a team-best plus 7 in plus/ minus. He had the second-best plus/minus on either team.
- This was the sixth time UNC had won both ACC games against Duke in the regular season and the teams met in the ACC Tournament. UNC is now 2-4 against Duke in the ACC Tournament in those six seasons.


