THE MATCHUP

QUICK HITS

- Hofstra Women's Basketball fell to Siena on Monday night, 70-60, at home.
- Senior Ashunae Durant picked up a double-double (10 points, 14 rebounds) as all three seniors (Durant, Olivia Askin and Aleana Leon) and E'Lexus Davis all finished in double figures for the second straight game.

CAA PRESEASON POLL

Hofstra Women's Basketball was predicted to finish seventh in the CAA in the league's preseason poll voted on by the conference's 10 head coaches. The Pride finished 5-13 in conference last season, good for the No. 8 seed in the CAA Championship.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Senior Ashunae Durant was named to the Preseason All-CAA First Team for the second consecutive season after averaging 16.0 points and 10.6 rebounds a season ago, earning second-team honors at the conclusion of the campaign. Classmate Aleana Leon was an honorable mention.

NEARING 200

Hofstra Head Coach Krista Kilburn-Steveskey is nearing her 200th career win, posting her 195th at Sacred Heart on Nov. 30. Already the winningest coach in program history after surpassing Harvey Pyser's 162 victories, Kilburn-Steveskey would be the first to post 200 wins.

MCCLAIN WATCH LIST

Senior forward Ashunae Durant has been named to the Katrina McClain preseason watch list. The inaugural Katrina McClain Award will honor the best power forward in women's college basketball. The list, which will be fluid, will be narrowed down to 10 in mid-February before the five official finalists are announced in March. The award will be presented at the NCAA Women's Final Four in Columbus.

1,000 POINT CLUB

Senior forward Ashunae Durant recorded her 1,000th career point on Jan. 29, 2017 against Elon, finishing with 17 points on the day. She became the 24th player in Hofstra Women's Basketball history to reach the milestone and just the 12th do so in three seasons or less.

CLOSE QUARTERS

So far this season, six of the Pride's games have seen a margin of six points or fewer at halftime, with three being a differential of just one point at the break. Hofstra has gone on to win four of those games, with three of the victories coming by six points or fewer.

DURANT DOUBLING UP

Senior forward Ashunae Durant led the CAA in double-doubles last season with 16, and has three so far this season, posting 18 points and 13 rebounds in a season-opening win over UMBC before recording 23 points and 12 boards at Sacred Heart in a double-overtime victory and 10 points and 14 rebounds in a loss to Siena.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Hofstra has been notoriously strong at the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex. The Pride was an even 7-7 at home last season. In the 2015-16 campaign, the team tied the program record for home wins, posting a staggering 14-1 mark at home. Since the 2008-09 campaign, the Pride has gone 87-46 at home.

LEON LIGHTING UP

Senior guard Aleana Leon evolved into a permanent starter last season, providing energy and athleticism on the court. A CAA preseason honorable mention, she posted the second double-double of her career at Sacred Heart with 12 points and 12 rebounds. She has scored in double figures in five straight games, the longest such streak of her career.

DAVIS'S DAY

After coming off the bench last season behind starting point guard Krystal Luciano, sophomore E'Lexus Davis has earned the starting role this season, and has impressed. In her first game in the role, the season-opener against UMBC, she neared a triple-double with 17 points, eight rebounds and nine assists. In a double-overtime win at Sacred Heart, she posted a careerhigh 19 points, including nine in the second extra frame to help the Pride to the win.

ASKIN FOR TROUBLE

Senior Olivia Askin has found her offensive rhythm this season, scoring in double figures four times already after only breaking the threshold once before this season. She scored a season-high 18 points at Hartford on Nov. 18.

IN THE RANKS

Two of the Pride's opponents and fellow CAA members, James Madison and Elon, were ranked in this week's edition of the College Insider Mid-Major Top 25 poll, while William & Mary is receiving votes.

GOLD STANDARD

Last season, Hofstra wore its gold alternate uniforms six times, going 5-1 in those games. Three of the victories were comeback wins, with the Pride's only loss in its gold uniforms came in the CAA Quarterfinals, falling to eventual champion Elon. Hofstra is currently 2-0 in its gold uniforms in 2017-18.

IN THE RANKS

Two of the Pride's opponents and fellow CAA members, James Madison and Elon, were ranked in this week's edition of the College Insider Mid-Major Top 25 poll, while William & Mary is receiving votes.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

This year's Hofstra Women's Basketball team has eight nationalities represented, including four sophomores that come to Hempstead from overseas. The sophomore class features two student-athletes from Finland (Marianne Kalin and Sandra Karsten), one from the Canary Islands (Ana Hernandez Gil) and one from Slovenia (Petja Krupenko). Joining them this season is freshman Mie Hoff from Norway and Sica Cuzic, a junior transfer from Romania.

TRANSFER NEWS

The Pride features a pair of junior transfers this season in Sica Cuzic and Boogie Brozoski. Cuzic comes to Hofstra from Salt Lake City Community College, where she was an NJCAA honorable mention All-American. She averaged 8.8 points per game. Brozoski was a highly touted recruit out of Long Island Lutheran High School who averaged 5.6 points in her season and a half at Michigan.

NEW FACES

In addition to the Pride's two transfers, Hofstra gains three other new faces in forwards Mikiyah Croskey, Mie Hoff and Jaylen Hines. Croskey joined Hoftsra in January 2017 and will eligible to compete following Fall Semester 2017. The Bowie, Maryland, native averaged 10.7 points and 8.7 rebounds at National Christian Academy. Hoff, a native of Bergen, Norway, has been in the Norwegian National Team system since 2012, competing at the U16, U18 and senior levels. She has played in the European and Nordic Championships, and averaged 15.1 rebounds per game in Norway's top women's league. Hines is a native of Clinton, Maryland, who played her high school ball at Elizabeth Seton, where she racked up over 1,000 rebounds and averaged 13.5 points per game.

NATIONAL RANKS

Senior forward Ashunae Durant ranked in the top five nationally for offensive rebounds for most of the 2016-17 season, including leading the nation in the category for several weeks. She also remained in the top 20 for total rebounds per game.

FOLLOW THE LEADERS

Seniors Ashunae Durant, Aleana Leon and Olivia Askin will have big roles to play this season as the team's veteran leaders. Durant has had a starting role since her freshman season, while Leon and Askin became more permanent fixtures in the starting lineup a season ago. The three of them combined for more than 2,600 minutes last season, with the trio contributing more than 30 points and 16 rebounds per game. This season, they will be looked at to give guidance to a young sophomore-laden team.

CAA WEEKLY AWARDS

In the 2016-17 season, forward Ashunae Durant was named Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 12 after recording double-doubles in wins over Massachusetts and American. She posted 10 points and 11 rebounds against the Minutewomen before adding 23 points, 12 rebounds and a careerhigh six assists in an overtime win over the Eagles. She earned her second Co-Player of the Week award on Feb. 27, after shooting over 70 percent from the field against Towson and Drexel. Krystal Luciano was named CAA Co-Player of the Week on Feb. 20 after posting the first triple-double in program history with 21 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in a win over UNCW. She also added 10 points and eight assists at Elon that week for her first CAA weekly honor of the season.

WNIT APPEARANCES

The Pride has earned six bids to the Women's National Invitation Tournament in program history, including two in the past four seasons. In 2015-16, Hofstra tied its best all-time finish, advancing to the quarterfinals of the tournament.

KRISTA KILBURN-STEVESKEY

Krista Kilburn-Steveskey is entering her 12th season as Hofstra's head coach in 2017-18. She has averaged over 17 wins per season since arriving on campus in 2006 while posting seven winning seasons and leading the Pride to five appearances in the Women's National Invitation Tournament, including two consecutive appearances in 2014-15 and 2015-16. With a 191-157 career record, Kilburn-Steveskey is the winningest coach in Pride history and her .538 winning percentage is third all-time.

Kilburn-Steveskey, who was named the 11th head women's basketball coach at Hofstra University on May 16, 2006, led the Pride to the WNIT in 2007, 2010, 2012, 2015 and 2016, with trips to the quarterfinals in 2007 and 2016 and a second round visit in 2010. She also steered Hofstra to a team Division l-record 26 victories in 2006-07. She signed a multi-year contract extension in October 2013.

In 2016-2017, Kilburn-Steveskey led the Pride back to the Colonial Athletic Association quarterfinals, and helped forward Ashunae Durant earn All-CAA and All-Met Second-Team honors. Durant recorded her 1,000th career point, becoming the 12th player in program history to reach the milestone in three seasons or less. Krystal Luciano also joined the 1,000 point club in her final season in Hempstead, while also recording the program's first tripledouble, posting 21 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in a win over UNCW on Jan. 15. Luciano became just the fifth player in CAA history to post 1,000 career points, 500 assists and 400 rebounds.

Kilburn-Steveskey is a 1990 graduate of North Carolina State University in Raleigh, North Carolina, where she was coached by the legendary Yow and served as team captain during her senior year. In her four years at NC State, the Wolfpack compiled an 83-37 record and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1987, 1989 and 1990. The 1990 squad posted a 25-6 record, won the regular season ACC championship and was ranked 11th in the nation by the Associated Press.


