The Series with Iona

Series Leader (82nd Meeting): Siena Leads, 47-34

Last Meeting: Siena 79, Iona 68 - Jan. 25, 2025 (Loudonville, NY)



Notables:

The Saints and Gaels are set to clash for the 82nd time ever, with Siena holding a 47-34 edge in the all-time series. Since the turn of the century, however, Iona clings to a 29-28 advantage, while recent history has been no different between the sides. Siena and Iona have split the last 10 meetings, including each winning at home last year. Additionally, the sides have alternated wins in New Rochelle over the past six games played there, with the Saints looking to keep the trend going after falling at Hynes Athletics Center last season.

the first player in conference history to take home Player and Rookie of the Week honors on the same day. Siena ended the year with three players in double-figure scoring, six averaging seven points per-game or greater, and eight averaging more than 20 minutes per-game.

Primm was instrumental in helping the Owls achieve several milestones over his four years. In 2020-21, Primm helped FAU to eight Conference USA wins, the most in program history. The Owls also earned their first conference tournament win in program history with a victory over No. 6 UAB. Primm was the lead on bringing in Iggy Allen, who won C-USA Newcomer of the Year along with First Team All-Conference and All-Defensive Team honors. Allen ranked 14th in the NCAA in scoring (22.0 ppg) and 23rd in rebounding (10.0 rpg), while leading the Owls to 21st in the nation in rebounding (42.0 rpg).

Primm also had the opportunity to coach his daughter, Crystal Primm, in her final collegiate basketball season in 2019-20. The graduate transfer had a stellar campaign, finishing in the top-10 in points (15.4 PPG) and rebounds (8.0 RPG) in Conference USA, as well as sitting No. 7 in free throw attempts (214) and 29th in makes (137) in the NCAA. Crystal also was given a nod to the C-USA Second Team.

Also in 2019-20, the Owls put up the third most 3-pointers in a season (211), which was fourth in the conference, while tallying the fourth best free throw percentage in school history (71.7). FAU improved in a myriad of categories from the prior season, including in scoring offense, where the Owls averaged 66.3 PPG in comparison to the 2018-19 season's 57.0 PPG.

In his first season as an assistant coach at FAU, Primm helped lead the Owls to a seventh place finish in C-USA, the program's highest finish mark joining the league in 2013. Working primarily with the forwards, Primm helped build one of the nation's best rebounding teams. The Owls averaged 42.3 rebounds per game, leading the conference and ranking 18th in the country.

Prior to joining the Owls, Primm spent two seasons as an assistant coach with Coastal Carolina. He helped usher the Chanticleers into the Sun Belt Conference for the 2016-17 season. The team finished with a 13-16 overall record and went 8-10 in league play. In his first season with the Chants in 2015-16, Coastal had several notable wins throughout the season, including its first-ever victory against Clemson on Nov. 15 and its first win against Liberty in 20 years to snap a 45-game losing streak against the program.

Before heading to Coastal, Primm was at Oxbridge Academy of the Palm Beaches where he served as the head girls' basketball coach and director of basketball operations since 2013. During that time, Primm led the girls' program to a 39-11 (.780) overall record over the course of two seasons, and Oxbridge Academy reached the Florida High School Athletic Association Regional Final for the first time in the school's history in the 2014-15 season. His program also enjoyed success in the classroom as the girls' basketball team boasted a 3.50 combined team GPA.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities at Oxbridge, Primm also worked for the Miami Suns Youth Organization where he served as a coach, trainer and consultant.

Prior to Oxbridge, Primm served as the head men's basketball coach at Palm Beach Atlantic University from 2007-13. Primm's teams consistently faced the top competition in the NCAA Division II South Region and were able to knock off three top-25 nationally ranked teams as well as numerous regionally ranked squads. Included in PBA's notable wins during Primm's tenure was an overtime victory over North Greenville University in the 2009-10 NCAA South Region championship game.

Before taking the head coaching job at PBA, Primm spent several seasons as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Sailfish. PBA won two NCAA regional championships and posted back-to-back 20-win seasons in Primm's two year as an assistant coach from 2003-05.

Primm is the founder of the Top Performance Basketball Academy, and has additional coaching experience as an assistant at The Benjamin School (Palm Beach Gardens) and various camps. The Benjamin School won the 2001 FHSAA Class 2A State Championship with Primm as an assistant on the coaching staff.

A two-year starter for Palm Beach Atlantic from 1995-97, Primm averaged 18.7 points per game for the Sailfish to sit fourth all-time in the men's record book. He shot 57.4 percent from the floor while making over 37 percent of his 3-point attempts to rank in the top five in each category. He also ranks in the program's top five in steals per game.

Primm is a two-time graduate of PBA, earning his bachelor's degree in business administration before completing his master's degree in organizational leadership. His daughter, Crystal Primm, played at Duke and Auburn before spending her final year of eligibility at FAU. He is the father of Crystal and Journee Primm.

Terry Primm was promoted to head coach of Siena Women's Basketball in April 2024 after serving as the top assistant on Jim Jabir's staff from 2021-24. Primm followed Jabir to Siena from Florida Atlantic, where he served as Jabir's Associate Head Coach for four years.

Primm has played an integral role in the improvement of the Siena Women's Basketball program, highlighted by consecutive MAAC Semifinals appearances as an assistant for the first time in 11 years. Working in lock-step with Jabir, the Detroit native helped Siena achieve an 18-12 overall record including a 14-6 ledger in Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference action during the 2023-24 season, marking the program's most league victories in more than two decades dating back to the 2002-03 season. Primm previously led the Saints for seven games as acting head coach during the 2022-23 season, guiding the team to a 6-1 record.

"We are very excited that Terry Primm will take over our women's basketball program," Siena Vice President / Director of Athletics John D'Argenio said upon Primm's promotion. "Coach Primm has been a key part of Coach Jabir's coaching staff over the last three seasons, which has led to the recruitment of outstanding student athletes and success on the court. He is the right choice to lead our student athletes and to continue to move this program toward a MAAC Championship. Join me in congratulating Coach Primm and his family on being part of a new chapter in Siena Women's Basketball."

Primm's first season at the helm led to the program qualifying for a national postseason tournament for the first time in 10 seasons. Siena ranked third offensively in the MAAC in 2024-24 averaging 64.6 points per game, while his squad led the league with a 75.2 mark from the free throw line. Additionally, Primm's Saints were top-five in the conference in field goal percentage (41.4%), three-point percentage (31.2%), rebounding (35.2 RPG), blocks (3.32 BPG), and assists (13.52 APG).

Under his direction, the Saints boasted four All-MAAC performers including unanimous first team selection, Teresa Seppala, and All-Rookie selection, Myriam Traore.

After aiding the Saints to their first MAAC Opening Round bye in five seasons during his first campaign back with the team in 2021-22, Primm helped guide one of the youngest teams in the nation in 2022-23 to a fourth place regular season finish and both the program's first winning record and MAAC Semifinal appearance since 2018.

Siena boasted an 11-5 home record and a nine-win improvement while garnering five MAAC postseason honors - including Elisa Mevius winning MAAC Rookie of the Year honors. The team led the league in scoring offense and saw Mevius and classmate Teresa Seppala claim a combined 12 MAAC weekly honors - including Mevius becoming

Additionally, Primm's Saints were top-five in the conference in field goal percentage (41.4%), three-point percentage (31.2%), rebounding (35.2 RPG), blocks (3.32 BPG), and assists (13.52 APG).
- Siena was selected to finish fifth in the 2025 MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll
- The Saints are off of back-to-back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2001-04.
- Siena (5-7, 3-0) secured its fifth consecutive win last time out with a resilient 69-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's. The Saints—who have not lost since Nov. 26—surpassed 50 total rebounds in Thursday's win, marking the second time this season they have eclipsed the half-century mark. Siena is now the only team in the MAAC with two 50-rebound games and, after raising its season average to a conference-leading 39.3 rebounds per game, ranks 118th nationally. The Saints also sit 23rd nationally with 15.9 offensive rebounds per contest.
- While her scoring has garnered attention, it was Francesca Schiro's rebounding that stood out against the Mount. The freshman pulled down a game-high 12 boards to record double-figure rebounds for the first time in her career, while also securing her first career double-double with 14 points.
- For the fourth straight game—and the fifth time in her last six—Genevieve Wedemeyer reached double figures in scoring, pouring in a career-high 16 points against Mount St. Mary's. The junior added eight points from the free-throw line on 11 attempts, helping Siena earn a season-high 27 trips to the charity stripe. As a team, the Saints converted 21 free throws, the second-most in a game this season (23 vs. New Haven).
- After starting the season 7-2, Iona (8-6, 1-3) has dropped four of its last five games, including a 10-point loss to Mount St. Mary's—the same team Siena defeated Thursday. The Gaels currently rank second in the MAAC in scoring defense, allowing just 59.6 points per game, but have surrendered more than that average in five of their last six contests, four of which were losses. Isabellah Middleton (12.9 PPG) and Zoey Ward (12.6 PPG) lead the league's seventh-ranked offense, which averages 58.1 points per game. Behind Ward's 7.9 rebounds per contest, Iona ranks among the MAAC's top three rebounding teams (38.1 RPG) and sits second only to Siena on the offensive glass (14.1 ORPG).
- The Saints and Gaels are set to meet for the 82nd time, with Siena holding a 47-34 edge in the all-time series. Since the turn of the century, however, Iona owns a narrow 29-28 advantage. Additionally, the sides have alternated wins in New Rochelle over the past six meetings there, with Siena looking to continue the trend after falling at the Hynes Athletics Center last year.
- Six of Siena's 14 players are juniors or above, while the other eight range from freshman to redshirt-sophomore.
- Sydnie Rosales returns for her third season as assistant coach, while Billy Lovett is back for his second.
- Heather Stec '09 also returns to Primm's staff for her fifth overall season with the program and her first as the Director of Basketball Operations.

The Last Time...

Siena scored 100 points in a game: Siena defeated Niagara 107-69 on Dec. 19, 2025, in Niagara Falls, NY - the first time Siena reached 100 since doing so against Rider in a 103-69 win on Jan. 13, 2001.

Siena allowed 100 points in a game: No. 14/13 Syracuse defeated the Saints, 102-65, on Nov. 9, 2016 in Syracuse, NY.

Siena scored between 90-99: Siena hit 94 points for the first time since 2022-23 in a 94-56 win over Central Connecticut State on Dec. 15, 2025, at the UHY Center. Siena set a single-game program record with 14 made three-pointers in the game.

Siena won an overtime game: A shorthanded Siena squad with just six active players grabbed a 55-51 road victory at Fairfield on Jan. 19, 2023, marking its first OT triumph since a 78-66 win at Canisius on Feb. 22, 2019.

Siena lost an overtime game: The Saints dropped a 67-64 overtime thriller at the UHY Center to Merrimack on Nov. 28, 2023.

Siena held an opponent to 40 points or fewer: The Saints held Rider to 26.4% shooting in a 77-40 win at Alumni Gymnasium on Mar. 7, 2024. Siena had 14 steals in the game, led by Ahniysha Jackson's five.

Siena was held to 40 points or fewer: Siena was stifled in an 69-38 loss against Rider back on Feb.13, 2020. The Saints turned the ball over 28 times, in was their third loss of being held under 40 points on the season.

Siena won by more than 30 points: Siena downed Niagara 107-69 on Dec. 19, 2025, in Nigara Falls, NY, just one game after another 30-point win over Central Connecticut State on Dec. 15.

Siena lost by more than 30 points: Siena fell at Mount St. Mary's, 92-57, on Jan. 23, 2025

A Siena player scored 30 or more points in a game: Rookie Francesca Schiro became Siena's first 30-point scorer since Dec. 30, 2024, after dropping a career-high 32 on Niagara on Dec. 19, 2025, in Niagara Falls, NY.

A Siena player recorded 20 or more rebounds in a game: Heather Stec pulled down 23 rebounds on Jan. 21, 2007 at Saint Peter's. She came up one rebound shy of the program record (24) set by Melanie Halker '97 on Feb. 23, 1997.

A Siena player had 10 or more assists in a game: Elisa Mevius dished out 11 assists in Siena's 74-57 win over Iona on Feb. 8, 2024.

Siena featured multiple players with a double-double in a game: Teresa Seppala (17 points, 11 rebounds) and Anajah Brown (12 points, 13 rebounds) each had a double-double in the WNIT First Round at Howard on Mar. 21, 2025.

Siena failed to convert a free-throw: The Saints failed to score, as well as attempt a free throw in their 59-49 loss to Duquesne on Nov. 27, 2021. The Saints would go 0-0 in the game, marking the latest mark since Dec. 4, 2006 when Siena went 0-3 from the line at #1 Maryland.

Siena failed to convert a 3-pointer: Siena defeated Binghamton, 54-50, despite going 0-13 from the three-point line on December 5, 2022. The result marked the first time since Feb. 20, 2020 that the Saints had gone quiet from beyond-the-arc, and the first time since an 84-81 overtime victory at Rider on Feb. 29, 2008 that they pulled out a win with no three's made.

A Siena opponent failed to convert a 3-pointer: St. Bonaventure went 0-13 from beyond the arc in a 50-42 Bonnies win at the Reilly Center on November 11, 2021. It marked the first time in 10 years that Siena held its opponent without a three since Saint Peter's went 0-for-8 from distance on Feb. 19, 2011.
