**THE BUFFALOES:** No. 18 (Associated Press) / 21 (USA Today Coaches) ranked Colorado is 4-1 on the season after placing second at the 2023 Sunshine Slam in Daytona Beach, Fla., last week. The Buffaloes edged out Richmond 64-59 in the semifinal game on Nov. 20, before dropping their first game of the season, 77-71 in overtime to Florida State.

Colorado is averaging 82.2 points per game, ranking third in the Pac-12 Conference. The Buffaloes are hitting 48.5 percent from the field including a league-best 43.3 percent mark from 3-point range. Colorado also leads the Pac-12 in free throw accuracy at 77.5 percent..

**SHARING THE BALL:** Colorado enters the weekend ranking second in the Pac-12 and 13th in the nation in assists at 19.4 per game. With 25 assists in the Milwaukee game, the Buffaloes dished out at least 20 dimes in three-straight games, their longest streak of that nature since the first three games of the 2001-02 season.

Prior to that run, Colorado had three games with 20-plus assists over the previous 44 contests dating back to the 2021-22 season.

Colorado dished out 28 assists against Grambling State, the program's most since dishing out 29 vs Mercer on Dec. 22, 2005. It ties for the 19th most in a single game in team history.

Colorado has won 28-straight when dishing out at least 21 assists and has won 75 of its last 79 dating back to the 1996-97 season.

**INDIVIDUALLY SPEAKING:** Junior **KJ Simpson** tops Colorado at 19.0 points and 4.4 assists per game while ranking second in steals (1.4 spg) and third in rebounding (4.8 rpg). Simpson has made 24 of 27 from the line (.889) leading the Buffaloes in all three categories.

Simpson was named to the Sunshine Slam All-Tournament Team, averaging 19.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in the two games in Daytona Beach. He led the Buffaloes with 23 points against Richmond, matching a team season-high. Simpson had 15 points and a season-best nine rebounds against Florida State.

On the Pac-12 charts, Simpson is third in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.7), fourth in free throw percentage, fifth in scoring, six in assists and 10th in steals.

Senior **Tristan da Silva** is averaging 14.8 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists while hitting 54 percent from the field and 44 percent from 3-point range. He had 15 points and a season-best eight rebounds in the Sunshine Slam win over Richmond.

On the Pac-12 charts, da Silva ranks 12th in 3-point percentage, 13th in field goal shooting, 14th in blocks and 15th in scoring.

Senior **J'Vonne Hadley** averages 10.0 points per game while leading the Buffaloes in shooting (.593) and steals (eight) and ranking second in rebounding (6.6 rpg). Hadley had six points, six rebounds and a team season-high four steals against Richmond. He had eight points and seven rebounds against Florida State.

Hadley is fifth in field goal percentage, eighth in steals, ninth in overall rebounds, defensive rebounds (4.6 drpg) and free throw percentage (.818) and 14th in offensive rebounds (2.0 orpg) on the Pac-12 charts.

Senior **Eddie Lampkin, Jr.**, leads the Buffaloes and ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in rebounding at 8.4 per game. He had a game-high 11 rebounds along with eight points and four assists in the Sunshine Slam championship game against Florida State.

The 11 rebounds against FSU marked Lampkin's second double-figure rebounding game of the season. He had his first double-double in a Colorado uniform with 14 points and a team season-high 12 rebounds against Milwaukee. It was the seventh overall double-double for Lampkin who had six with TCU.

Lampkin is second in the Pac-12 in offensive rebounds (3.2 orpg) and fifth in defensive boards (5.2 drpg).

Freshman **Cody Williams** is third on the team in scoring at 11.0 points per game while shooting 53 percent from the field. He earned Sunshine Slam All-Tournament Team honors averaging 11.5 points in the two games in Daytona Beach. Williams tied his collegiate best

with a team-high 17 points against Florida State.

Junior **Julian Hammond III** is averaging 9.8 points and is second on the team in assists with 15. Hammond is second in the Pac-12 in 3-point shooting at 50 percent and also ranks eighth in assist-to-turn-over ratio (2.1) and 14th in assists (3.0 apg).

**ABOUT THE GAELS:** Iona is 2-3 overall, preparing for its fifth game away from home to start the season. The Gaels went 1-2 at the Gulf Coast Showcase in Estero, Fla, last week falling to High Point (82-68) and Long Beach State (80-76) before defeating Buffalo in their final game, 89-64.

Iona is averaging 78.0 points per game while shooting 44.7 percent from the field. The Gaels allow 75.6 points with opponents shooting nearly 46 percent from the field. Iona leads the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in steals at 9.4 per game.

Graduate Idan Tretout leads Iona at 16.8 points per game shooting 45.2 percent from the field. Greg Gordon leads the Gaels in rebounding at 7.0 per game while pitching in 11.4 points per contest. Wheza Panzo averages 13.6 points and leads Iona in 3-pointers with 18.

**THE SERIES:** This will be the second meeting between Colorado and Iona. The Buffaloes cruised in the only other meeting, a 99-54 decision on Dec. 29, 2019. Colorado tied its school record of 17 3-pointers in that contest which also serve as the 200th win at Colorado for head coach Tad Boyle.

**NATIONALLY RANKED:** Colorado jumped seven spots into 18th in the second regular season Associated Press Top 25 Poll released on Nov. 20. The No. 18 AP ranking is the program's best since hitting No. 18 on Feb. 7, 2020. Colorado debuted at No. 25 in the first regular season Associated Press Top 25 Men's Basketball Poll released on Nov. 13.

It was just the second time since 1970 the Buffaloes appeared in the first regular season AP Poll. Colorado appeared in the exact same spot, No. 25, on Nov. 11, 2019; a season where the Buffaloes were ranked for a school-record 13 weeks, climbing as high as No. 16.

Overall this week's recognition marks Colorado's 57th all-time appearance in the AP Poll. The Buffaloes were second among teams receiving votes in this year's preseason poll.

Colorado debuted at No. 21 in the second USA Today Sports Coaches Top 25 Poll released on Nov. 20.

**NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS:** Colorado is 122-38 (.763) in nonconference regular season games under head coach **Tad Boyle** including a 75-21 mark (.781) since the beginning of the 2014-15 season.

Colorado is 92-8 (.920) in nonconference home games under Boyle, a record which includes a 7-2 mark in postseason action.

**RIGHT AT HOME:** At the CU Events Center, the Buffaloes have won:

- 3 of 3 in 2023-24 (3-0)
- 16 of their last 21 (16-5)
- 39 of 51 (39-12)

In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is 180-39 at home (.822). The Buffaloes are 493-190 (.722) all-time at the CU EC. The Buffaloes have won at least 10 games at home each of the last 14 seasons.

**DA SILVA HONORS:** The preseason honors have been rolling in for senior **Tristan da Silva**:

- One of 50 watch-list members for the Naismith Trophy and Wooden Award for National Player of the Year honors.
- One of 20 watch-list members for the 2024 Karl Malone Award, given to the nation's top power forward by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Preseason All-America Fourth Team by Blue Ribbon Yearbook.
- Preseason All-Pac-12 by The Almanac and that publication's 56th best player in the nation.
- Preseason Media All-Pac-12 Team.
- NCAA.com's top small forward and listed as one of the top 10 seniors in the nation overall.

Da Silva was a 2022-23 All-Pac-12 Conference First Team selection as a junior, leading Colorado at 15.9 points per game on just under 50 percent shooting. He led the Buffaloes with 54 3-point field goals and 44 steals while ranking second on the team in rebounding with 168.

**SIMPSON & WILLIAMS ALSO HONORED:** Along with senior Tristan da Silva, junior **KJ Simpson** and freshman **Cody Williams** received recognition on the Preseason Pac-12 All-Conference teams. Simpson was named to the media's 10-member All-Pac-12 First Team. Williams earned honorable mention, receiving at least five votes from the media panel.

Simpson was named to The Almanac's Preseason All-Pac-12 Second Team and ranked as the 91st best player in the nation. Williams came in at No. 92 on The Almanac's Top 100 List.

**1,000-POINT CLUB WATCH:** Colorado's active leading scorer, **Tristan da Silva** is 14 points away from becoming the 39th member of Colorado's 1,000-point club. He is currently 40th with 986 points needing 17 to break the top 40.

**BOYLE MILESTONE:** Head coach **Tad Boyle**, in his 14th season, has 276 wins at Colorado the most in program history.

Boyle-led teams own nine of the 13 20-win seasons in team history, the top five single-season win totals and six of the top seven. With a record of 276-173 at CU, his 61.5 winning percentage is second all-time just behind Forrest “Frosty” Cox at 62.3 from 1936-50.

Boyle has 118 Pac-12 regular season wins ranking 19th in conference history.

**OPENERS:** Colorado improved to 86-35 (.711) in all-time season openers and has won its last eight. The Buffaloes are 12-2 under head coach **Tad Boyle** and 39-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes are 97-24 (.802) all-time in home openers, have won their last 16 and 22 of their last 23. Boyle’s teams are 13-0 in home openers.

**PRESEASON POLL:** Colorado was picked to finish fifth in the annual Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll released Oct. 11. Arizona, which received 18 first place votes, was picked to win the league, followed by USC, UCLA, Oregon, Colorado and Arizona State.

**GOLD STANDARD:** Colorado is 86-6 in the Tad Boyle era when meeting the program’s “Gold Standard” of holding an opponent to 40 percent or less from the field and having a plus-8 rebounding edge. The Buffaloes have reached that mark in both games this season. Colorado held Grambling State to 38.9 percent and had a plus-17 advantage on the boards (41-24). Colorado held Towson to 35 percent shooting and held a plus-12 advantage on the boards (38-26).

**AGAINST RANKED TEAMS:** Colorado was 2-4 against ranked teams in 2022-23. The Buffaloes had nonconference wins over No. 11 Tennessee, 78-66, on Nov. 13, and No. 24 Texas A&M, 103-75, on Nov. 18. In Pac-12 play, Colorado dropped a 78-68 decision at Arizona on Feb. 18 and lost three games to Top 10 ranked UCLA teams.

Colorado’s 25 wins over ranked opponents in the Tad Boyle era is by far the best in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 25-46, have accounted for 36 percent of wins over ranked opponents (69) since 1949-50.

**HONORING BURDETTE “BURDIE” HALDORSON:** Colorado is wearing a patch with the initials “BH” on their jerseys this season to honor Former All-American and CU Athletics Hall of Famer Burdette “Burdie” Haldorson who passed away on Oct. 13 at the age of 89.

As a senior in 1954-55, Haldorson led the Buffaloes to a 19-6 record, 11-1 in conference play and the Big Seven title by averaging 21.0 points and 13.8 rebounds per game (upping his averages from 16.7 and 9.0, respectively, from his junior season). He was a first-team All-Big Seven performer for the second straight year and was named a first-team All-American. CU eventually went on to finish third in the nation, losing in the Final Four to eventual champion San Francisco and the legendary Bill Russell. The Buffs defeated Iowa in the then-third place game to match the ‘42 team for the school’s still highest finish ever in the NCAA tournament.

Haldorson’s No. 22 is one of two retired Colorado Basketball jersey numbers.

another nationally acclaimed recruiting class as head coach Tad Boyle announced the signing of four outstanding prospects who signed their National Letters of Intent on Nov. 8.

Andrew Crawford (Littleton, Colo.), Felix Kossaras (Montreal, Quebec), Doryan Onwuchekwa (Dallas, Texas) and Sebastian Rancik (Bratislava, Slovakia) comprise Colorado’s Class of 2024, a group that on Signing Day ranked 12th in the country by 247Sports, No. 16 by Rivals and No. 26 by On3.com.

All four members are labeled as four-star prospects and ranked as one of the top 100 players in the nation by at least one recruiting service. Three of the four are consensus four-star picks.

This is the third Colorado class in the last four seasons ranked in the nation’s Top 25 by 247Sports and Rivals, including the 2023 Class slotted in at No. 25 and No. 13 respectively.

Crawford is a 6-foot-6-inch, 175-pound combo guard from Thunder-Ridge High School, who averaged just under 20 points along with 11 rebounds and six assists as a senior, earning Colorado Class 6A All-State First Team honors.

Kossaras, a 6-5, 180-pound, guard from Montreal, is in his senior season at Fort Erie International Academy in Ontario. He played internationally for Team Canada at the FIBA 2022 U17 World Cup in Spain.

Onwuchekwa is a 6-10, 235-pound center from Dallas. A consensus four-star prospect, he has helped Oak Cliff Faith Family Academy to three-straight Texas 4A state titles.

Rancik, a 6-9, 210-pound forward at JSerra Catholic School in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., averaged 16.5 points and 7.7 rebounds – along with 45 blocks – as a junior earning All-CIF-SS Division 1 and All-Los Angeles Times First Team honors.

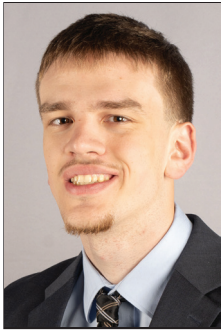

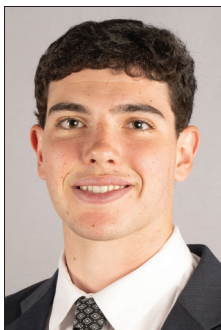

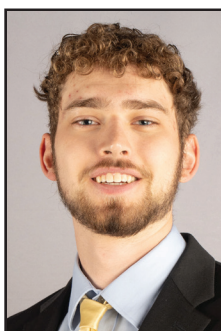

**BOULDER** — Colorado's defense set the tone in the first half and the Buffaloes' offense came alive in the second Monday as CU rolled to a 75-57 win over Towson in the season opener at the CU Events Center.

The Buffs led by four at the half but exploded with a 17-1 run to open the second half and Towson never threatened again, as CU pushed its lead to as much as 38 down the stretch.

Colorado improved to 14-0 in home openers in the Tad Boyle era. **KJ Simpson** led the Buffs with 22 points and **Tristan da Silva** added 13, all in the second half. **J'Vonnie Hadley** added 13 points and a game-high nine rebounds and **Luke O'Brien** had seven points and seven boards.

Dylan Williamson led Towson with 15 points. Colorado shot 52 percent from the floor, including 8-for-17 from 3-point range. The Buffs missed all seven attempts from beyond the arc in the first half but then hit eight in a row in the second half to build their lead.

CU held the Tigers to 35 percent shooting and had a 38-26 edge on the boards. The Buffs are now 85-6 under Boyle when holding an opponent to 40 percent or less shooting and having at least a plus-8 rebounding edge.

Colorado finished with 21 assists on 26 baskets, with the only downside of the night 16 turnovers.

"That was a good first game," Boyle said. "A tale of two halves, obviously. I thought we fought adversity in the first half offensively and came out in the second half and figured things out a little bit. I was really proud of our defensive effort that first 20 minutes. We really guarded at a high, high level and we did that pretty much the whole game. I'm really happy with this team's defense and rebounding."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado led 28-24 at the half after the Tigers sliced a 13-point deficit to four with a late 11-2 run.

"It's not how we wanted to start offensively," Simpson said. "There was a lot of standing around and not moving the ball. But we got better in the second half."

Indeed, the Buffs needed just a few minutes after intermission to blow the game open.

After missing all seven of their 3-point tries in the first half, the Buffs drained eight in a row to start the second half. Simpson hit two in the first three minutes of the period and da Silva and O'Brien each hit one in the span as Colorado quickly rebuilt its lead to double digits, 40-24.

Towson never threatened again as Colorado steadily built its lead. Another da Silva 3-pointer pushed Colorado's edge to 20 less than six minutes into the period and the cushion ballooned to 28 with 5:26 to play.

Boyle had no gripes about the Buffs' defense in this one. Colorado held Towson to just four points in the first seven minutes of the second half and limited the Tigers to under 30 percent shooting for much of the period.

"We have a chance to be a really good defensive team," Boyle said. Colorado's defense established the tempo early as the Buffs jumped out to a 14-4 lead in the first eight minutes. The Buffs forced a 6-minute scoring drought from the Tigers in that stretch and got six points from Simpson on the offensive end.

The Buffs continued to apply the pressure and with 6:39 left in the half, pushed their lead to 13 when an **Eddie Lampkin Jr.** bucket inside gave Colorado a 24-11 edge.

But CU's offense then went stagnant and Towson put together an 11-2 run, thanks in part to a handful of Colorado turnovers. A 3-pointer from Messiah Jones with 1:34 left in the half pulled the Tigers to within 26-22 and the two teams traded buckets in the final minute to send Colorado into the break with just a four-point lead, 26-24.

Along with eight turnovers in the opening half the Buffs also shot 0-for-7 from 3-point range.

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. —

Colorado's KJ Simpson scored 23 points and the No. 18 Buffaloes survived a tough shooting night Monday to take a 64-59 win over scrappy Richmond in the Sunshine Slam semifinals.

Tad Boyle's Buffs, who jumped seven spots in the AP poll released Monday, improved to 4-0 while Richmond fell to 2-2.

The Buffs will next face Florida State in Tuesday's championship game at 2 p.m. (CBSSN) at Ocean Center.

Monday's game, CU's first away from home this season, wasn't decided until the final minutes.

Colorado led for the majority of the game, jumping out to a quick 6-0 lead and taking a 28-25 edge into intermission. But the Spiders wouldn't go away and took their second lead of the game, 44-42, with nine minutes to play.

The Buffs, though, responded with a quick 6-0 run to regain control. Richmond managed to cut the deficit to one point again before the Buffs finally put the game away. A Tristan da Silva basket with just more than a minute to play bumped CU's edge to five and following a pair of defensive stops, Simpson, da Silva and J'Vonne Hadley each hit two free throws to give Colorado a nine-point edge, 62-53, with 32 seconds remaining.

Simpson had three rebounds and a pair of assists to go with his 23 points, bolstered by a 9-for-10 effort from the free throw line. Da Silva added 15 points and eight rebounds while Hadley had six points and six boards.

Jordan King led Richmond with 23 points.

Colorado entered the game as the nation's leading 3-point shooting team (51.7 percent) and the sixth-best field goal shooting team (55.7 percent). But the Buffs struggled to find their shooting eye all night, finishing just 20-for-47 from the floor. They did, however, hit 21 of their 25 free throw tries while also holding a 32-26 rebound edge.

Richmond hit 23 of its 51 field goal tries but was just 5-for-20 from long range.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led 28-25 at the break and pushed the cushion to seven early in the second half on four Simpson free throws.

But the Buffs could never shake the Spiders. Richmond stayed within range and finally took its second lead of the game, 44-42, when King hit two of three free throws at the 9:07 mark.

Colorado answered with a 6-0 run, getting a Simpson 3-pointer and a Cody Williams layup in transition for a 48-44 lead.

But Richmond stayed within striking range and with just more than four minutes to play, cut Colorado's lead to one on a long King 2-pointer.

Colorado then pushed its lead back to five on a pair of free throws from Simpson and Hadley before Richmond narrowed the gap to three one more time.

CU's defense then stepped up. Eddie Lampkin Jr. forced a turnover, then found da Silva underneath with a beautiful pass. Da Silva rammed it home and Colorado had a 58-53 lead with 1:29 to play.

Colorado then recorded back-to-back stops and the Spiders had to foul. Simpson, da Silva and Hadley all hit free throws in the final 1:03 to keep the Spiders at bay and give Colorado the win.

Colorado jumped out to a quick 6-0 lead, sparked by a pair of buckets from Tristan da Silva.

But the Spiders answered with an 8-0 run to take their only lead of the half. Colorado endured a three-minute scoring drought that covered five straight empty possessions, including two turnovers.

CU finally ended the drought on a Lampkin bucket, then regained the lead when RJ Smith drained a long 3-pointer to give Colorado an 11-8 lead.

Richmond did manage to tie the game again at 13-13 before the Buffs took the lead on a Simpson 3-pointer. The Buffs then used a 6-0 run to take their biggest lead of the half, 22-15, on the heels of a Cody Williams steal and basket, two free throws from Julian Hammond III and a Lampkin basket inside.

But Richmond once again battled back to close the gap to two and Colorado led by just three, 28-25, at the break.

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. —

Colorado overcame a 10-point second-half deficit Tuesday to force overtime but the No. 18 Buffaloes came up short in the extra period, falling 77-71 to Florida State in the Sunshine Slam championship game.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 4-1 overall while the Seminoles improved to 4-1.

Cold shooting doomed the Buffs, as CU shot just 35 percent from the floor (25-for-72), including 5-for-20 from 3-point range. Colorado also committed 20 turnovers, which the Seminoles converted into 19 points.

The Seminoles shot 47 percent from the game (25-for-57), but were 15-for-28 in the second half and overtime, including 4-for-4 in the extra period.

Cody Williams led CU with 17 points on 6-for-10 shooting. Colorado's two leading scorers for the young season, KJ Simpson and Tristan da Silva, both suffered poor shooting nights. Simpson finished with 15 points on 5-for-22 shooting (1-for-6 from long range) while da Silva had eight points on 2-for-9 shooting.

FSU had four players in double figures, led by Jalen Warley with 19.

In a game that featured nine lead changes and 13 ties, Colorado held a 30-27 edge at the break. FSU used a 20-7 run early in the second half to take a 10-point lead, but Colorado quickly put together a 10-0 run to tie the game.

The Buffs fell behind again but used an 8-0 surge to regain the lead, only to go scoreless over the last 2:48 of regulation as FSU rallied to force overtime.

Florida State then scored the first nine minutes of the extra period to take control for good.

"We gave one away," a disappointed Boyle said after the game. "We were not very good. We knew Florida State was going to pressure, but when you have 20 turnovers against anybody, it's going to be hard to win. ... When something like this happens, it's hard to blame anyone but the coach. I've got to do a better job."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led 30-27 at the half but a cold start and some hot Seminole shooting from long range resulted in FSU taking a 10-point lead early in the second half. Florida State opened the period with a 20-7 run that included four 3-pointers and CU trailed, 47-37, less than seven minutes into the half.

But the Buffs rallied. Colorado put together a 10-0 run, capped by a Simpson 3-pointer, to tie the game at 47-47.

FSU then regained the lead, taking a 55-49 edge before Colorado staged another rally. J'Vonne Hadley sparked an 8-0 run with a pair of baskets and two da Silva free throws gave CU a 57-55 edge with 4:24 to play in regulation.

CU then took a 60-57 lead on a 3-pointer from Julian Hammond III before the Seminoles tied it with 1:15 on the clock — and that's how regulation play ended, with both teams coming up empty on offensive possessions in the final minute.

Florida State then took control early in the overtime, scoring the first nine points of the period and a CU rally in the final minute came up short.

"Our guys battled, our guys competed," Boyle said. "It's not a toughness factor, it's not a competitiveness factor, it's not not being ready to play. It was just simply taking care of the basketball and taking great shots and the ability to finish and we weren't good enough with that tonight."

Shooting woes hounded the Buffs for nearly the entire game. CU was just 4-for-17 from the floor to open the first half and while the Seminoles were also having a tough time finding the bucket, FSU finally put together a 6-0 run to take an 18-12 lead with 7 minutes to play in the half.

But the Buffs finally found their shooting eye coming out of a timeout. Williams hit a bucket from the lane to start a 9-0 run that included a pair of Simpson buckets (both off feeds from da Silva), a Williams free throw and two charity tosses from da Silva.

With four minutes to go in the half, Colorado held a 21-18 lead, and they extended the margin to 23-19 on a Luke O'Brien dunk at the 3:31 mark.

Florida State rallied to tie the game at 27-27 before Hammond III drained a 3-pointer just before the halftime buzzer to give Colorado a 30-27 lead at the break.

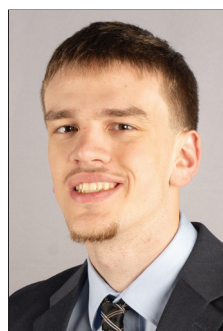

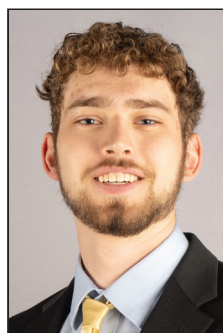

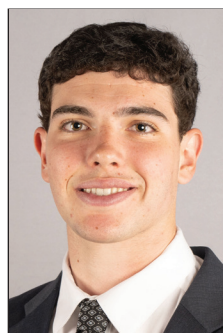
