

The programs have split the past 12 meetings Siena has played Iona more times than any other opponent

The Saints are 37–29 vs. the Gaels in MAAC Regular Season action (18–40 in all other games) Iona is in search of its first regular season series sweep since 2014–15 (went 3–0 that season)

Carmen Maciariello is 4-4 vs. Iona

Tobin Anderson is 1-0 vs. Siena (1-0 at Iona)

Last Meeting

Iona led 41–16 at the half and by as many as 30 later on The Gaels dished out 20 assists to just five turnovers Siena committed 20 turnovers

Zek Tekin led the Saints with 17 points

Jeremiah Quigley paced Iona with 20 points on 8-12 shooting

Siena vs. the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference

Now in their 35th season as a MAAC member, Siena has won at least a share of nine MAAC Regular Season Championships and six MAAC Tournament titles (1999, 2002, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2020) 385-299 (.563) all-time overall in MAAC competition 345-272 (.559) all-time in MAAC Regular Season action 443-390 (.532) all-time vs. the 10 other programs which currently comprise the MAAC

Fifth Season 68-70 (.493)



Siena Basketball alumnus has led his alma mater to four straight winning seasons and top-three Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference records, highlighted by at least a share of a pair of MAAC Regular Season Championships, and the awarding of an outright MAAC Tournament Championship in his first year

His 50 wins through his first 76 MAAC Regular Season games coached entering this season is tied for the sixth-best start in the league' 43-year history

Finalist for the 2020-21 Hugh Durham (top Division I mid-major coach) and Skip Prosser Man of the Year awards

The only one of the 61 new Division I head coaching hires during the 2019-20 season to lead his team to an outright conference regular season championship

Named one of the "Top-12 Most Immediately Successful Hires of the 2019-20 Season" by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander

Became the first rookie head coach in program history to lead Siena to an outright MAAC Regular Season Championship in his first season, while his 20 wins tied for the most of any first-year Siena head coach

Native of nearby Clifton Park, NY was promoted to be the 18th head coach in program history on Mar. 25, 2019

45-year-old signed a three-year contract extension on Mar. 26, 2021 which runs through the 2025-26 season

Maciariello and his wife, Laura, are the proud parents of a six-year-old daughter, Reese, a threeyear-old son, Matteo, and a one-year old son, Caden

Siena is assured of either the No. 10 or 11-seed in the MAAC Tournament, and will play a First Round game Tuesday in Atlantic City
The Saints would be the No. 10 seed with a win today AND a Manhattan loss vs. Canisius (4 PM) by virtue of tying for 10th
Siena holds the tie-breaker over the Jaspers (split regular season series, but Siena has the "best" win vs. Rider)
The Saints will be the No. 11 seed with a loss today OR a Manhattan win

Siena has never finished last and been seeded 11th since the MAAC expanded to 11 teams 10 years ago (2013–14)

The Saints four possible First Round opponents are Marist or Niagara as potential 6-seeds in a 6-11 matchup, or Iona or Mount St. Mary's as potential 7-seeds in a 7-10 matchup

Siena has gone 1-6 collectively vs. those four teams so far this season (won at Niagara)

Siena looks to build momentum heading into the MAAC Tournament

The Saints have dropped six straight after snapping a seven-game losing streak on Feb. 10 at Manhattan

Siena has lost 32 of its past 36 games overall dating back to last season

10 of the 30 defeats have been by two possessions or fewer (14 of the other 22 losses have been by 15 points or more) The 26 total losses this season are the most in program single-season history (previous: 24 in 2004-05, 2012-13, and 2017-18) The Saints dropped a program-record 11 consecutive home games to close out their slate at MVP Arena

Through Thursday, the Saints rank in the bottom-10 nationally in turnover margin (-6.0 - last), scoring (60.5 - fourth worst), assist-to-turnover ratio (0.67 - fourth worst), scoring margin (-14.4 - fifth worst) fastbreak points (4.4 - fifth worst), and turnovers (16.0 - fifth worst)

Siena had also ranked in the bottom-10 nationally in free throw percentage all season until recently, but has connected at a

76% (81-106) clip over the past six games to raise their season average to 66%

The Saints have lost players for a total of 77 games so far this season due to injury or illness Four of Siena's top-six scorers have combined to miss 40 games due to injury or illness

Leading scorer and rebounder **Sean Durugordon** (19.4 points, 7.6 rebounds) has missed 17 games total (seven due to injury/illness), reigning MAAC Rookie of the Year and Preseason Second Team All-MAAC selection **Michael Eley** (13.1) has missed 13 full games and all but 2:17 of a 14th, starting point guard **Zek Tekin** (9.0 points, 3.0 assists) has missed eight games, and key reserve **Michael Evbagharu** (5.8 points, 5.7 rebounds) has missed 12 games

As a result, Siena has used 18 different starting lineup combinations - third most nationally The Saints haven't use any one lineup combination more than three times this season

Siena has received a scoring boost from Durugordon, who made his debut on Dec. 19

Averaging 19.4 points and 7.6 rebounds spanning his first 13 games as a Saint 252 points through first 13 games is 38 more than anyone else in program history

Achieved a program Division I record six straight 20-plus point performances to begin his Siena

career (Dec. 19 – Jan. 15)
Scored in double figures 11 times, eclipsed 20 points seven times, 30–plus points twice, and tallied

three double-doubles spanning his first 13 games

Two-time undegraduate transfer (Austin Peay, Missouri) was cleared to play with the

13 federal court ruling

Had request for a waiver seeking immediate eligibility this season denied by NCAA on

Nov. 8, and was awaiting decision on appeal when federal court ruling came down

Led Austin Peay in scoring (12.4) while appearing in 27 games (23 starts) last season Ranked second in the ASUN in offensive rebounding (2.44), sixth in double-doubles

(four), and 10th in rebounding (6.0)

Siena leads the MAAC averaging 4.2 blocks per game

The Saints achieved a season-high 10 blocks at Brown (Dec. 22), and have eclipsed eight or more blocks on five occassions. Siena is the tallest team in the MAAC (T-66th nationally) with an average height of 77.88 inches, or nearly 6-6, on average. Killian Gribben (1.2) and Michael Ojo (1.0) currently rank second and tied for third in the MAAC in blocks, respectively

The Saints are 47-12 (.797) when scoring 70 or more points under head coach **Carmen Maciariello**Siena has failed to hit the 70-point mark in 31 of its past 36 games - including 13 straight - going 4-32 during that span Siena snapped streaks and racked up the accolades in their 93-88 win at Niagara on Jan. 15

Secured first win in 45 days dating back to a conference-opening 67-65 victory over Rider on Dec. 1 at MVP Arena Snapped an eight-game losing streak - the program's longest since dropping 11 straight from Nov. 8, 2012 - Jan. 6, 2013

Signa had entered play second-to-last nationally in free throws percentage (50.8%)

Siena had entered play second-to-last nationally in free throw percentage (59.8%)
Four three-point field goal attempts - fewest since not attempting a three-point shot in a 72-56 win at Hartford on Feb. 27, 1987

(first year of college three-point line)

Durugordon erupted for a collegiate career-high 36 points and shot a program record 16-16 from the free throw line

Most points by a Saint since **Jalen Pickett** scored 46 in a 30T loss vs. Quinnipiac on Feb. 17, 2019

Most points by a Saint in a regulation game since **Doremus Bennerman** scored a program-record 51 vs. Kansas State in the NIT Third Place Game on Mar. 30, 1994 at Madison Square Garden

Most made free throws without a miss in program history – previous record: 15–15 by **Frank Ryan** on Dec. 4, 1963 vs. RPI Second Division I player this season with at least 16 made free throws without a miss – **Kobe Sanders** (Cal Poly) 17–17 vs.

The Saints pulled down a whopping 54 rebounds on Dec. 6 vs. Bryant Most rebounds in a game since 55 in a 40T loss at Youngstown State on Dec. 14, 2004

Two separate Saints recorded double-doubles

Siena also grabbed 50 rebounds in its next home game vs. Cornell (Dec. 19)

The Saints posted season-highs in rebound margin (+16) and offensive rebounds (22)

Siena is in the midst of the program's 35th season of Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference competition The Saints have won at least a share of nine MAAC Regular Season Championships and claimed six MAAC Tournament titles

Siena is 385-299 (.563) all-time overall in MAAC competition

The Saints 345 MAAC Regular Season wins are second most in conference history, trailing only Iona (446) who entered the conference eight years prior

Siena has more wins than Manhattan, Saint Peter's, and Fairfield, despite joining the MAAC eight years after all three

The Saints played just four times in a 32-day span between Dec. 10 - Jan. 11 due to final exams, the holidays, and a conference bye

Siena posted a 1-10 record during the non-conference portion of their schedule (season-opening two-point win vs. Holy Cross)

The one non-conference win is the program's fewest since joining the MAAC in 1989-90 (previous: 2-9 in 2004-05)

The 10-game non-conference losing streak is the program's longest since dropping 12 straight from Dec. 2, 2003 to Dec. 5, 2004 Eight of the 10 defeats were by double digits, including five by 20 or more points

Siena returns no starters and only one of its top-nine scorers (Michael Eley) from a year ago

The Saints welcome back seven letterwinners

Siena returns just 20% of their total scoring output from last season

Eley is the only returnee who averaged more than 11.5 minutes and 2.2 points last season

The Saints return a total of only seven combined starts from last year (**Żek Tekin** - 5, Eley - 2), tied for ninth fewest nationally Siena graduated six players among its nine departures from last season's roster

Jackson Stormo (Israel by way of Portugal) and **Andrew Platek** (Azerbaijan) both signed professional contracts Third Team All-MAAC pick and leading scorer **Javian McCollum** (15.9) transferred to Oklahoma

Two-year starter and defensive stalwart **Jared Billups** matriculated to George Mason

The Saints welcome nine newcomers including seven true freshmen to its 16-member 2023-24 roster

The diverse roster features 10 domestic players from seven different states and six internationals hailing from five different

countries (Canada, England, Iceland, Ireland, and Turkey)

The youthful Siena roster features no scholarship seniors and no true juniors

The Saints have a total of 13 true underclassmen, featuring six sophomores and seven freshmen Siena is tied with Marquette for the third youngest roster nationally, based on average age (19.75)

The roster features just one player with more than five collegiate starts entering this season The Saints welcome transfers **Sean Durugordon** (Austin Peay) and **Giovanni Emejuru** (Sam Houston)

Siena snapped a six-game losing streak to close out 2022-23 with their season-opening victory

Five of the six setbacks had been by two possessions or less, with four of the losses decided by three

points or fewer

The Saints were in the midst of the program's longest losing streak since dropping 11 straight from Nov. 18, 2012 - Jan. 6, 2013

A pair of Saints showcased their talents on the global stage this summer

Rising sophomore Killian Gribben co-captained his native Ireland at the FIBA U20 European Championships in North Macedonia Gribben led entire Tournament in both double-doubles (five) and blocks (4.1), and ranked third in rebounding (10.7) Gribben also averaged 13.0 points spanning seven games

Incoming freshman Michael Evbagharu played a key role for his native Canada at the FIBA U19 World Cup in Hungary

Evbagharu averaged 4.3 points and 4.0 rebounds (2.3 offensive) in 15.0 minutes over seven games Recent Siena star **Jalen Pickett** (2018-21) was drafted in the 2023 NBA Draft

Pickett was selected in the Second Round by the Indiana Pacers (draft rights traded to the Denver Nuggets)

Selected 32nd overall, Pickett is the highest-ever drafted former Saints player

Pickett is the 10th former Siena player drafted, and only the second-ever in the current two-round format that began in 1989 Former Saint Jack McClinton was drafted out of Miami (FL) with the 51st overall pick in the 2009 NBA Draft by San Antonio Pickett starred for three seasons at Siena, and was the 2018-19 MAAC Rookie of the Year and 2019-20 MAAC Player of the Year Pickett played his final two collegiate seasons at Penn State

Former Siena teammate and 2020–21 MAAC Player of the Year **Manny Camper** is also continuing to pursue his NBA dream Camper was chosen with the 20th pick in the 2023 NBA G-League Draft by the Sioux Falls Skyforce, a Miami Heat affiliate Camper previously played two years in the NBA G-League for the Grand Rapids Gold, a Denvér Nuggets affiliate

Siena posted a 17-15 overall record last season, and finished tied for third in the MAAC with an 11-9 league mark

The Saints achieved a season-long seven-game win streak from Dec. 19 - Jan. 13

Marked program's longest winning streak since a program-record tying 16 straight from Feb. 7, 2020 - Jan. 16, 2021

All seven wins came by 10 points or less, and by an average of just 6.6 points

Siena also won four straight road games - the most since a program-record eight straight from Feb. 23, 2020 - Jan. 16, 2021

The Saints achieved a program-record fifth consecutive top-three MAAC record

Siena sat atop the MAAC at 9-2 in conference action through the end of January

The Saints dropped eight of their final 10 games from the start of February Six of the eight losses were by a single possession and/or in overtime

Three players earned All-MAAC honors, highlighted by MAAC Rookie of the Year Eley Stormo was a Second Team All-MAAC selection, while McCollum was named to the Third Team

The Saints played to a number of tight finishes, with 15 of their 32 games (47%) decided by two possessions or fewer (6-9 record) Siena was just 1-6 in games decided by three points or less

Siena posted its first winning non-conference record (6-5) in seven years

The Saints finished third at the ESPN Events Invitational, which included high-major wins over Florida State and Seton Hall Siena defeated multiple high-major programs in the same regular season for the first time since turning DI in 1976-77 The Saints had multiple high-major wins in the same season for the first time since 2007-08 (Stanford, Vanderbilt - NCAA) The Florida State win was the Saints' first over a high-major since a 54-52 win vs. Penn State (Big Ten) on Mar. 24, 2014 The FSU win was Siena's first vs. an ACC foe since a 62-57 triumph vs. Georgia Tech on Dec. 22, 2010 in Albany

The 17-point (80-63) win over FSU was the Saints' largest margin of victory over a high-major since a 21-point (83-62) win over Vanderbilt on Mar. 21, 2008 in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament

Siena snapped an 11-game losing streak vs. the 11 current BIG EAST members with their win over Seton Hall







Last Time Out: Niagara 66, Siena 59 (Mar. 7 - Albany, NY)

Niagara led for nearly 36 minutes and jumped out to a 16-5 lead to start Siena tied the game five separate times in the second half

The Purple Eagles scored eight straight down the stretch to push their lead back to 10 with 4:43 to go

The Saints shot 8-16 from three, but just 12-36 on two-point attempts Siena received a season-high 39 bench points

The Saints held the hot-shooting Niagara three-point attack to just 5-20 **Brendan Coyle** scored a career-high 19 points on a perfect 6-6 shooting (5-5 from three)

Giovanni Emejuru posted his fourth double-double with 14 points and 10 boards

Siena and MVP Arena

Officially renamed on Jan. 1, 2022, MVP Arena in downtown Albany has served as the exclusive home court for Siena Men's Basketball since 1997. Over that time, Siena's attendance has soared to new heights, bringing national acclaim to the mid-major program that competes in a major basketball setting. The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in average home attendance for a milestone 25 consecutive seasons, and have been the most highly attended Northeast mid-major three years running.

Siena ranked 75th nationally out of 363 Division I programs in average home attendance during the 2022–23 season, marking the program's second-highest ever ranking after checking in at 66 in both 2002–03 and 2009–10. The Saints average home attendance of 6,415 over 13 total home dates at MVP Arena last season also reflected the program's highest mark in 11 years, dating back to 6,509 in 2011–12. Siena achieved a record 16.2% increase in its average home attendance from the prior 2021–22 season (5,519), marking the program's highest–ever annual increase since making the full–time move downtown in 1997–98.

The Saints average home attendance last winter was 24% greater and 16 spots higher in the national rankings than its nearest Northeast mid-major competitor, Rhode Island, which checked in 91st with an average of 5,158. The Northeast comprises nine states according to the United States Census Bureau: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. Mid-major teams are defined as programs from the 25 conferences which do not comprise "high majors," which are the Power 5 (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, and SEC), AAC, and Big East.

Siena impressively out-drew, on average, 22 high-major programs nationally including 14 Power Fives last season: Boston College (ACC), California (Pac-12), Colorado (Pac-12), Georgia Tech (ACC), Miami (ACC), Northwestern (Big Ten), Notre Dame (ACC), Ole Miss (SEC), Oregon (Pac-12), Oregon State (Pac-12), Stanford (Pac-12), TCU (Big 12), USC (Pac-12), and Washington State (Pac-12).

The Saints average home attendance also once again out-ranked the national NCAA Division I average home attendance of 4,354 by a whopping 47% – a 19% increase from the season prior.

Additionally, Siena ranked 10th nationally out of 276 mid-major programs in average home attendance last season. The Saints were also 10th among all Northeast programs overall – trailing only high-major schools – and third out of 22 Division I programs in the State of New York behind only Syracuse and St. John's.

Siena's 25-season streak of ranking in the top-100 nationally in average home attendance has coincided with the program's full-time move downtown to what is now known as MVP Arena beginning in 1997-98. The 25-season run does not include the 2020-21 COVID impacted season in which fans were not permitted to attend most if not all games nationwide due to the pandemic.

The Saints have now drawn 2,782,351 fans – an average of 6,411 fans – over 434 all-time games at MVP Arena, dating back to the program's first home contest in the facility during the 1990–91 season. Siena welcomed their two-millionth fan on Dec. 23, 2014 vs. Cornell, and have drawn crowds in excess of 10,000 on 33 occasions. The Saints hold a 280–154 (.645) all-time record at MVP Arena, including a stellar 265–132 (.660) mark since permanently making the facility its home beginning with the 1997–98 season.

"JoJo is a do-it-all guard who can attack defenses in a variety of ways," said Maciariello. "He can play and guard multiple positions. He is a student of the game who will not only be an ambassador for our basketball program, but our entire Siena College community and beyond. We are excited to welcome JoJo and his family to our program."

Moore stars for Rouse High School in Leander, Texas for head coach Shane Krause. During his junior season this past winter, Moore averaged 14.8 points, 7.9 rebounds, 6.8 assists, and 2.1 steals while leading the Raiders to the District 25–5A title. For his exploits, he earned both Class 5A All–State and TABC Region 4 All–Region honors.

Moore plays his AAU basketball for NBA Hall of Famer Tracy McGrady on One Time Legends on the Adidas circuit.

Moore comes from a strong athletic pedigree, as his father, Eric Moore, played quarterback at the University of Oklahoma, and his mother, Andrea (Miller), ranks in the top-10 all-time in University of Alabama Volleyball history in attack percentage, blocks, and service aces.
