The Saints have dropped three in a row in New Rochelle by an average of 21.3 points
Last Siena win at the Hynes Athletics Center: 87-64 on Jan. 31, 2020
Saints are 37-31 all-time vs. Iona in MAAC Regular Season action (18-40 in all other games)
Gaels Head Coach **Tobin Anderson** was a Siena assistant under **Mitch Buonaguro** from 2011-13
Gerry McNamara is 0-1 vs. Iona
Anderson is 3-0 vs. Siena (3-0 at Iona)

Last Meeting

The teams combined for 49 turnovers and 47 personal fouls
Adam Njie was awarded the winning free throw with 2.7 ticks to go
Iona forced 25 turnovers and swiped 16 steals
The Gaels were +11 on the glass including 17 offensive rebounds
Iona reserves accounted for 47 points (Njie led the way with 13)
Brendan Coyle scored a then career-high 20 points for Siena

Syracuse legend and 2003 National Champion was named the 19th head coach in Siena College Men's Basketball history on Mar. 29

Now 41-year-old spent previous 15 years on staff with the Orange, and was elevated to Associate Head Coach last season

In 15 seasons on staff, "G-Mac" helped guide Syracuse to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, highlighted by trips to the Final Four in both 2013 and 2016

Primarily charged with recruiting, scouting, and guard development, McNamara mentored current NBA performers Buddy Boeheim (Detroit Pistons) and Cole Swider (Miami Heat), and former NBA players Michael Carter-Williams, Tyler Ennis, Michael Gbinije, Elijah Hughes, and Dion Waiters

One of the most decorated players in the storied Syracuse history, McNamara is the program's all-time career record holder for made threes (400), free throw percentage (.888), and minutes played (4,799), and ranks second all-time in steals (258), third in assists (648), fourth in scoring (2,099), and sixth in made free throws (435)

Started all 135 career games played spanning his illustrious career from 2002-06, and had his No. 3 jersey retired by Syracuse on Mar. 4, 2023

2006 Syracuse graduate with Bachelor's degree in Speech Communications

Scranton, Pennsylvania native was a two-time Associated Press Pennsylvania State Player of the Year (2001, 2002) and the 2002 Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year and Parade Fourth Team All-American while starring at Bishop Hannan (now known as Holy Cross)

Finished scholastic career seventh all-time in scoring in Pennsylvania state history with 2,917 career points

McNamara and his wife, Katie, are the proud parents to four children: sons Gerry and Patrick, and daughters Maggie and Grace





QUICK HITS



Siena has already more than doubled (nine wins) its win total from all of last season (four)

The Saints needed just 10 games to surpass their win total from all of last season with their fifth victory on Dec. 8 at Canisius

Siena has more wins in 19 games this season (nine) than they had in their previous 45 games (eight)

The Saints enter the weekend in a four-way tie for fourth place in the MAAC Standings, three games behind the current tri-leaders

Picked ninth according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll, Siena is a perfect 4-0 vs. the teams picked below them

Conversely, the Saints have dropped all four games so far against teams predicted to finish ahead of them

Siena returns to the road to continue a stretch where they play four of six away from home to close out January

Three of the four road games are against the current top-three teams in the MAAC Standings (Marist, Merrimack, Quinnipiac)

The Saints also hosted Mount St. Mary's during the stretch, which opened 4-1 in league action

Siena has mostly weathered the storm thus far, splitting their first four game during the stretch

The Saints will play five of seven at MVP Arena during the month of February

Siena secured the program's milestone 1,200th all-time win Thursday night vs. Mount St. Mary's

Now in the midst of the program's 84th varsity season, the Saints have now achieved an all-time record 1,200-1,046 (.534)

Siena also previously secured the program's 800th Division I victory on Jan. 3 vs. Manhattan (49th DI season)

The offense has been clicking at MVP Arena over the past month

The Saints have averaged 84.2 points over their past five home games

Siena shot a season-high 56% from the field in their 82-68 victory over Mount St. Mary's Thursday

The Saints connected for 14 threes in a game for the first time in six years (Jan. 14, 2019 vs. Monmouth)

Siena matched its highest regulation game point total in six years in a 93-75 win vs. Sacred Heart (Jan. 16)

Matched highest regulation point total (93-88 win at Niagara on Jan. 15, 2024) since a 96-80 win vs American on Nov. 5, 2019

18-point margin of victory was largest since a 77-55 victory vs. Niagara on Mar. 4, 2020

Season-high 54-point second half

The Saints erupted for 103 points in their double overtime victory vs. Manhattan (Jan. 3)

First time eclipsing the century mark in six years (107-100 triple overtime loss vs. Quinnipiac on Feb. 17, 2019)

Highest single-game point total in a quarter century (107-91 win vs. Fordham on Dec. 23, 2000)

Equaled program's most points scored in a MAAC game since a 104-92 win vs. Iona on Feb. 11, 1998

The Saints have been led by the dynamic backcourt tandem of junior transfer guards **Justice Shoats** and **Major Freeman**

Shoats ranks fifth in the MAAC in assists (4.3) and seventh in scoring (15.0)

Shoats posted his first Siena double-double with 16 points and a collegiate career-high tying 10 assists at Cornell (Dec. 30)

First Saint with a double-digit assist game since **Jalen Pickett** on Mar. 6, 2020

Shoats scored his 1,000th collegiate point at Niagara (Dec. 6) and swiped his 100th steal at Quinnipiac (Jan. 10)

The Division II Lock Haven transfer became the first player to reach 1,000 points while wearing a Siena uniform since Pickett on Jan. 9, 2021

The junior amassed 878 points in just 58 career games with the school

Shoats was one of five Division I players named a USBWA Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week on Nov. 12

Shoats came off the bench to average 27.0 points, 3.0 assists, and 3.0 steals, while shooting 51% from the field in a pair of overtime victories against Brown and Bryant to open the season

Shoats also secured the first MAAC Player of the Week honors of the season that following Monday

First Siena player to earn MAAC Player of the Week since **Michael Baer** on Jan. 30, 2023

Shoats is averaging 20.6 points and 5.3 assists in nine Siena wins (10.0 points and 3.4 assists in 10 losses)

Freeman ranks sixth in the MAAC in threes (2.4) and eighth in scoring (14.6)

The Mid-Major Madness MAAC Preseason Newcomer of the Year has scored in double figures a team-high 17 times

The Preseason Second Team All-MAAC selection tallied his 100th collegiate three on Jan. 3 and is also closing in on both 1,000 points and 100 steals

Fort Myers Tip-Off All-Tournament Team after averaging 13.5 points and 3.0 assists (Nov. 25-26)

The JUCO transfer was an NJCAA Region 10 First Team selection after averaging 15.4 points, 5.1

rebounds, 4.4 assists, and 1.4 steals last season for Spartanburg Methodist

Siena has also been buoyed by the continued emergence of junior **Brendan Coyle**

The only three-year Saint on the roster, the local product from Niskayuna is averaging 12.5 points

Coyle ranks 30th nationally averaging 3.1 made threes while shooting 41% from distance

Coyle laid the groundwork to end last season, averaging 8.5 points over the final six games

Coyle had totaled 15 points spanning his first 16 collegiate games last season (did not see any action as a freshman)

Siena leads the MAAC and ranks 29th nationally averaging 5.0 blocks

The Saints registered 11 blocks at BIG EAST foe Xavier (Nov. 20), just three off the program single-game record

Eight different Siena players registered at least one rejection in the contest

Peter Carey ranks third in the MAAC in blocks (1.4), while **Myles Wilmoth** stands seventh (1.2)

Gavin Doty was named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Rookie of the Week on Jan. 6

Came off the bench to average 14.7 points and 9.3 rebounds in three games (two wins)

Clutch freshman went 4-4 from the free throw line in the final 13 seconds of six-point win at Cornell, scored 14 of his 19 points in the overtime periods in victory vs. Manhattan, and swiped three straight steals in 12 seconds of late comeback bid vs. Iona

First Siena player to be named MAAC Rookie of the Week since **Michael Eley** on Feb. 27, 2023

Averaging 11.1 points and 8.1 rebounds past nine games (Averaged 3.4 points and 1.9 rebounds over first 10 games)

Overtime has been Siena time this season

The Saints improved to a perfect 3-0 in overtime games with their double overtime triumph vs. Manhattan (Jan. 3)

The double overtime affair was the program's first multiple overtime game since a triple OT loss at Yale on Nov. 20, 2019

Siena had dropped nine of its previous 11 overtime contests dating back to late in the 2017-18 season

The Saints have overcome six-point deficits with 2:35 or less remaining in regulation in all three games

Went down by six to Manhattan with 43.2 seconds left

Went down six at Bryant with 2:35 to go (Nov. 8)

Went down six vs. Brown with 1:41 remaining (Nov. 4)

The three-game overtime win streak is the program's longest since winning four straight from Mar. 4, 2011 to Feb. 24, 2013

The Saints opened the New Year with the resumption of MAAC action for the remainder of the regular season

Siena previously tipped off the program's 36th season of MAAC competition to begin December

The Saints opened with the annual Western New York swing (Niagara/Canisius), splitting the trip for the third straight season

Siena snapped a nine-game losing streak vs. MAAC opponents with their Dec. 8 victory at Canisius

Siena played as many games in six days the week of Dec. 30 as they had in the previous 21 days combined
 The Saints returned to action on Dec. 30 at Cornell following a season-long, 10-day span between games for the holiday break
 Siena also had a separate nine-day break between games just prior (Dec. 8-17) due to final exams
 Siena went exactly five weeks between home games Nov. 13 vs. American to Dec. 17 vs. St. Bonaventure
 The 35-day span is tied for the fifth longest nationally this season (Buffalo, Kennessaw State)
 The Saints went during 2-5 during the stretch, which featured four true road games and three neutral site contests
 Siena finished 5-6 in non-conference action, falling one game short of achieving a winning mark
 The Saints posted a losing non-conference record for the seventh time in the past nine seasons (6-5 in 2022-23)
 Siena did not end up playing any non-conference opponents during the COVID-affected 2020-21 season
 The Saints have now gone just 31-56 (.356) against non-conference opponents since the start of the 2016-17 season
 Siena posted an 8-24 record during the 2024 calendar year
 The Saints suffered their most losses in any calendar year in the program's 86-year history
 Siena's eight wins and .333 win percentage were both program worsts for a calendar year since going 6-19 (.240) in 1996
 The Saints opened the "McNam-Era" with three straight wins
Gerry McNamara was the first coach to begin his Siena tenure 3-0 in 42 years since **John Griffin** also started 3-0 in 1982-83
 The Saints had been led by 10 different head coaches between Griffin and McNamara
 Siena achieved the program's first 3-0 November start in 21 years (2003-04)
 The Saints had dropped their final eight games to end last season
 Siena began the McNamara Era with consecutive overtime victories
 First time in the program's 84 seasons in which Siena has played consecutive overtime contests to open a season
 First time the Saints had played consecutive overtime games since bridging the final game of 2016-17 and first game of 2017-18
 First time Siena had both played in and won consecutive overtime games since Nov. 24-28, 2015 at Bucknell and vs. Loyola (MD)
 The Saints officially tipped off an exciting new era in the program's storied history on Nov. 4
 The Syracuse legend and 2003 National Champion McNamara was named the 19th head coach in program history Mar. 29
 "G-Mac" made his collegiate head coaching debut after spending the past 15 years on staff with the Orange
 McNamara helped guide Syracuse to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, highlighted by trips to the Final Four in 2013 and 2016
 One of the most decorated players in the storied Syracuse history, McNamara is the program's all-time career record holder for made threes (400), free throw percentage (.888), and minutes played (4,799), and ranks second all-time in steals (258), third in assists (648), fourth in scoring (2,099), and sixth in made free throws (435)
 Siena tipped off the program's 84th varsity season and 49th at the Division I level with a 72-71 overtime win over Brown Nov. 4
 Nov. 4 marked the earliest calendar season-opener in program history (previous earliest - Nov. 5, 2019)
 The Saints played their first season-opening overtime contest since the 2017 lid-lifter at College of Charleston
 Siena snapped an eight-game losing streak overall, and a program-record 11-game home losing streak with the victory
 Siena was projected to finish ninth (13 teams) according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll after finishing last (11th) in 2023-24
 Newcomer **Major Freeman** was named a Preseason Second Team All-MAAC selection
 The junior college transfer was also heralded as the Mid-Major Madness MAAC Preseason Newcomer of the Year
 The Saints welcomed 12 newcomers as part of their 17-member 2024-25 roster
 Siena added nine scholarship additions and three walk-ons
 Five of the newcomers are true freshmen, and eight of the 12 had never before played a game at the Division I level
 Freshmen **Tajae Jones** (sixth youngest) and **Gavin Doty** (12th youngest) are amongst the youngest DI freshmen nationally
 Siena holds the 13th least Division I playing experience nationally (0.62 years) according to Ken Pom
 The Saints returned just five players from their 16-member 2023-24 roster, and none of their top-seven scorers from a season ago
 Siena welcomed back just 18% of their scoring and 17% of their rebounding from last winter
 McNamara appointed juniors **Brendan Coyle**, Freeman, and **Marcus Jackson** as team captains for the 2024-25 season
 Coyle entered the season as the only current Saint who had been on the roster for more than two seasons
 Both Coyle (Niskayuna) and Jackson (Amsterdam) are local products
 Freeman (Spartanburg Methodist) and Jackson (UAlbany) are both first-year transfers
 Jackson is the younger brother of Milwaukee Bucks guard and former UConn star **Andre Jackson**
 There is nowhere to go but up for Siena as it looks to turn the page in the first season under McNamara
 The Saints posted a 4-28 overall record last season, and finished last out of 11 teams in the MAAC at 3-17 in league action
 The 28 defeats were the most in the 83-season program history
 Siena ranked in the bottom-10 nationally in turnover margin (-5.8 - last), three-point field goal percentage (.280 - third worst), scoring (60.4 - fourth worst), assist-to-turnover ratio (0.68 - fifth worst), fast break points (4.7 - fifth worst), scoring margin (-14.0 - sixth worst), and turnovers (15.8 - sixth worst)
 The Saints had players miss a combined 79 games due to injury or illness, leading to 19 different lineup combinations
 Siena entered this season having dropped 34 of their previous 38 games overall dating back to Feb. 2023
 The Saints have ranked in the top-100 nationally in average home attendance for 26 consecutive seasons
 Siena boasted the nation's top average home attendance amongst all Northeast mid-major programs for three straight non-COVID impacted seasons from 2019-23 (2019-20, 2021-22, 2022-23)
 The Saints have drawn more 2.8 million fans spanning 441 games played at MVP Arena, marking an average of 6,382 spectators
 Siena is in the program's 36th season of MAAC competition, since joining the conference for the start of the 1989-90 season
 The Saints have won at least a share of nine MAAC Regular Season Championships and claimed six MAAC Tournament titles
 Siena's 349 all-time MAAC Regular Season wins are second only to Iona (451), who entered the conference eight seasons prior

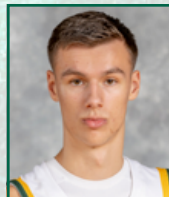

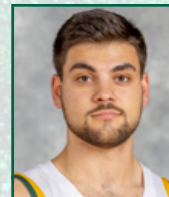

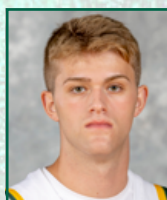
