The Iona University men's basketball team (0-0) takes on Hofstra (0-0) in its 2025-26 season opener at the Hynes Center Friday night. The Gaels and Pride square off in a matchup of two of the New York Metropolitan Area's most successful programs.

IONA VS. HOFSTRA - SERIES HISTORY

- Iona meets Hofstra for the 46th time in history with the Pride taking a 23-22 series following three straight wins.
- Prior to 2020, it was nine seasons since the last meeting between the two most successful NY metro area program in the last 25+ years.
- Iona is 12-9 all-time on its home floor.
- It will be the sixth straight season the teams will meet. The series will continue in 2026 in Hempstead.

SCOUTING HOFSTRA (0-1)

- Hofstra began the 2025-26 campaign on opening night Monday with a loss at UCF.
- Two former Gaels were a part of a quartet scoring double-figures with **Cruz Davis** leading with 17 and **Silas Sunday** chipping in 10. **Preston Edmead** added 16 points and **German Plotnikov** had 13 in the defeat.
- A third former Gael, **James Patterson** posted three points in 12 minutes of play.
- Hofstra was selected to finish eighth in the 13-team Coastal Athletic Association.

IONA VERSUS THE CAA

- Iona has posted an all-time 54-39 mark vs. current Colonial Athletic Association opponents.
- Nearly 3/4 of the Gaels' games played vs. the CAA have been against Hofstra and Monmouth.
- Iona is 17-8 vs. CAA squads not named Hofstra or Monmouth.

IONA IN SEASON OPENERS

- The Gaels are 52-26 record in their first game of the season since 1945.
- Iona opens the season at home for the first time in three seasons.
- For the 43rd time in 81 seasons Iona opens the season at home.

- The Gaels are 37-5 in those instances and 19-2 at the Hynes Center with seven straight wins dating back to 2008.
- It is the third time the Maroon & Gold opens with Hofstra following a win at home in 1984 and a win on the road in 1966.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER

- Prior to the Gaels tip off vs. Hofstra, they are one of just nine Division I teams yet to play their first game of the 2025-26 season.
- Iona joins Alabama State, Brown, Cornell, and Penn tipping off at 7 p.m., with Yale following at 8:30 p.m.
- Princeton and Memphis open their seasons on Saturday, while Dartmouth is the final Division I team to tip off, making its debut Sunday at 2 p.m.

KING OF THE HILL, TOP OF THE LIST

- No team among the 13 NYC Metropolitan Area Division I basketball programs within 30 miles of the center of NY College basketball, Madison Square Garden has won more games than Iona University in the 31 seasons (562; Hofstra #2, 545).
- Over the last decade-plus, Iona's 308 wins and .630 win percentage are also the best in both categories. (Seton Hall, 276 wins; .585 win pct.)
- Since 1995-96, the Maroon & Gold hold the lead in wins (562), 17 more than Hofstra, 47 more than No. 3 Seton Hall and the top win percentage (.592).
- Iona's 12 postseason appearances (eight NCAA, three NIT, one CIT) since 2010-11 are the most during the time frame, four more than Seton Hall (six NCAA, two NIT) and six more than St. John's (four NCAA, two NIT).

BRAND NEW (ROCHELLE)

- Iona's roster features 15 newcomers for the second straight season along with nine new additions to the coaching and administrative staff.
- **Dan Geriot** and staff completed their roster with a talented mix of transfers and first-year players.
- Three graduate transfers are featured including veteran point guard **CJ Anthony** from Cincinnati, sharpshooter **Toby Harris** from D-III Brandeis and

scoring guard **Keshawn Williams** from Colorado State.

- Senior wing **Lamin Sabally** joins the Gaels from Incarnate Word in the Southland Conference.
- A trio of junior-transfer guards in **Kosy Akametu** (Santa Clara), **Denver Anglin** (Rice) and **Chase Cormier** (Wofford) along with forward **Matt Reed** (Tulsa) look to make an immediate impact on the lineup.
- Sophomore wing **Khalil Badru** (New Hampshire) is the ninth NCAA transfer making an Iona debut.
- Iona's incoming freshmen class is five deep with **Alliou Fall** (Sweden), **Deondrea Lindsey** (Tennessee) and **Ore Odutayo** (New York) joining walk-ons **Oscar Hourrutiner Jr.** and **Marko Pandiloski**.
- Geriot's new staff includes assistant coaches **Kris Saulny** (Penn), **Ronald Ramon** (Fordham), **Michael Thompson** (first-year), general manager **Craig Moore**, assistant GM and former Iona player **James Carey**, and graduate managers **Jack Ruhanen** (Grinnell), **Danny Dolan** (Loyola-Chicago), and **Thomas Malone** (Hofstra).

WHO'S BACK?

- Senior **Luke Jungers** and red-shirt freshman walk-on **Connor Horan** are the lone student-athletes returning for the 2025-26 campaign.
- Full-time staff members returning include with assistant coach **Patrick Wallace** and promoted graduate managers **Patrick Buckley** (Director of Operations) and **Parker Weiss** (Video Coordinator).
- Graduate managers **Robert Gerity** and **Jules LeJamtel** also return for the new season.

COACHING STAFF GOT BUCKETS

- Four members of Iona's bench achieved high milestones during their Division I athletic career, scoring over 1,000 points.
- Assistant Coach **Michael Thompson** was the highest achiever, scoring 1,689 points in a stellar career at Northwestern.
- Head coach **Dan Geriot** poured in 1,389 at Richmond and made a NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance as a senior.
- Not to far behind the head coach, general manager **Craig Moore** reached 1,294 points, also at Northwestern in the Big Ten Conference.
- Assistant coach **Ronald Ramon**, a Big East and NYC scholastic standout guard tallied 1,096 points at Pitt.
- **The Iona quartet joins Stony Brook and North Carolina to have four members in the Division I 1,000-point club. UConn features five.**

APPROACHING A MILESTONE

- **Graduate guard Keshawn Williams stand just 11 points shy of 1,000 for his collegiate career.**
- Williams scored 182 points last season at Colorado State, 748 points in two-plus years at Northern Illinois and 59 as a freshman at Tulsa.

GAELS PICKED SIXTH IN MAAC PRESEASON POLL

- Iona was selected No. 6 in the preseason poll of the league's 13 head coaches.
- The Maroon & Gold has captured a league best 13 regular season championships in 44 MAAC seasons.

DAN GERIOT YEAR 1

- **Dan Geriot** enters his first season as head coach of the Iona program in 2025-26.
- Geriot arrives in New Rochelle after spending the past 10 seasons in the NBA, where he developed a reputation for player development, tactical preparation, and building winning cultures at both the NBA and G League levels with the Cleveland Cavaliers and New Orleans Pelicans.
- He served several head coaches at the NBA level including Willie Green, J.B. Bickerstaff, John Beilein, Larry Drew, and Tyronn Lue.
- Before joining the NBA, Geriot began his coaching career at the collegiate level. He was an assistant coach at Campbell University from 2013-2015 under Kevin McGeehan, and at Princeton University from 2011-2013 under head coach Mitch Henderson.
- As a player, Geriot enjoyed a decorated career at the University of Richmond from 2006 to 2011. He helped lead the Spiders to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2010 and 2011, including a Sweet 16 berth in his senior season.
- Geriot finished his career ranked 17th on Richmond's all-time scoring list with 1,386 points. He earned Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team honors as a freshman and third-team All-Atlantic 10 recognition as a sophomore.
- He went on to play professionally for one season in Belgium with Verviers during the 2011-12 campaign.
- A native of Springfield, Pennsylvania, Geriot starred at Springfield High School, where he was named Delaware County Player of the Year. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science and history from Richmond.

- Iona has earned six regular season titles in the last 14 seasons.
- The Gaels regular season titles have come in 1982-83, 1983-84, 1984-85, 1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 2000-01, 2011-12, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19, 2021-22, 2022-23.

20/20 VISION

- Iona has posted 24 20+ win season in the 79-year history of the program.
- The Gaels have 11 such campaigns since 2009-10, spanning the last 16 seasons.
- Iona won 25+ games, the seventh and eighth time in history and fifth in the last 13 seasons - in 2021-22 and 2022-23.

LET IT RAIN

- Entering the 2025-26 campaign, Iona has made a three-pointer in **547** straight and **1,000** out of its last **1,002** games.
- In 2019-20, the Gaels eclipsed their previous program record of 386 straight from Jan. 5, 1994 - Dec. 16, 2006.
- The Gaels have failed to hit a three-pointer in just 18 of their **1,220** games played since the line was adopted for the 1986-87 season.

HYNES DOMINANCE

- The Gaels are **40-14 (.741)** in the last 3+ seasons.
- Iona is **141-41 (.775)** since 2009.
- The Maroon & Gold are **22-8 (.733)** over the last 10+ seasons in non-conference home games.
- Iona had a 21-game Hynes Center winning streak snapped vs. Rider on Jan. 15, 2023.
- The 21-game streak tied the second longest home winning streak in program history, behind 2014-16 (26) and matching 1979-80 and 1951-53.

JIMMY V TO THE RAFTERS

• Iona Athletics celebrated Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Inductee **Jim Valvano** with a recognition ceremony on Sunday, January 7, 2024.

• Valvano served as head coach of the men's basketball program from 1975-1980, as Director of Athletics from 1977-1980, and was inducted into the Iona University Arrigoni Hall of Fame in 1994.

• Valvano led the Gaels to a 95-46 (.674) record in five seasons remains top-five all-time in program history in wins and win percentage.

• Valvano taught Iona to "Dare to Dream" while recruiting some of the Maroon & Gold's finest talent ever and the results showed.

• Iona's 1979-80 team finished 29-5, setting a program record for wins that stands to this day.

• The Gaels were ECAC Champions and defeated eventual national champion Louisville, 77-60, in front of sold-out Madison Square Garden in February 1980, while advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to Georgetown.

RICHIE GUERIN'S #14 HANGS IN THE RAFTERS

• Iona honored the legacy of **Richie Guerin '54** by retiring his number 14 on Jan. 31, 2014 the first ever in school history.

• Guerin is an Iona University Goal Club (1983), Marine Corps Sports (2004), and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame (2013) inductee who starred for the Maroon & Gold from 1951-1954.

• He rewrote the basketball record books at Iona, scoring 1,375 points and graduated as the leading scorer in school history.

• A two-time All-Metropolitan selection with the Gaels, he scored a then school-record 40 points against John Carroll in 1954 and was the first Gael to score 40 or more points in a game.

• Following his playing days at Iona, Guerin played with the National Basketball Association's New York Knicks from 1956-1963 and was a player-coach of the St. Louis/Atlanta Hawks franchise for nine years.

• In 13 years as a professional player, Guerin accumulated 14,676 points (17.3 per game), 4,278 rebounds (5.1 per game), and 4,211 assists (5.0 per game) over 848 games.

GAEL GREATS

In addition to Naismith Hall of Famers **Richie Guerin '54** and **Jim Valvano** here are additional significant names in Iona basketball history:

• **Jeff Ruland '91** - All-American during his time at Iona and, two-time NBA All-Star with the Washington Bullets, Philadelphia 76ers and Detroit Pistons. Following his career, returned to Iona and served as head coach from 1998-2007 where he won three MAAC Championships.

• **Tim Cluess** - head coach from 2010-2020. At the helm during one the Gaels' most successful decades in program history. Cluess won 199 games in nine seasons on the sideline including six NCAA appearances, five MAAC tournament championships, and four MAAC regular season titles. He is the all-time MAAC leader in MAAC tournament victories.

• **Pat Kennedy** - head coach from 1980-86. Went on to coach at Florida State, DePaul, Montana, and Towson following a highly successful tenure in New Rochelle.

• **Warren Isaac '65** - Iona's only 50-point scorer, Isaac played six seasons in Europe following his tenure at Iona. A New York City school legend, Isaac started for Power Memorial paving the way for NBA Hall of Famer Kareem Abdul-Jabbar a 1965 graduate of the high school.

• **Tim Welsh** - head coach from 1995-98 who went on to coach in the Big East with Providence for 10 seasons. Currently an ESPN college basketball analyst. Holds the highest career winning percentage ever at Iona.

• **Kevin Willard** - Iona coach from 2007-10, now head coach at Big 10's Maryland. Helped turn around a program which won two games in the season prior to his arrival to 20 wins in his final season in Maroon & Gold.

• **Steve Burt '84 & Steve Burt '06** - All-time NCAA father/son scoring leaders, both netting over 2,000 career points. Burt, the father, had a four-season NBA career and most notably appeared off the bench for the Phoenix Suns in the 1992 NBA Playoffs. He was inducted into the prestigious NYC Basketball Hall of Fame this past fall. Burt, the son, continues to play professionally in Europe.

• **Sean Green '91** - Played 84 NBA games over three seasons for the Indiana Pacers, Philadelphia 76ers and Utah Jazz from 1991-94. Currently a high school basketball coach in Southern California.

• **Scott Machado '12** - The last Gael to appear in an NBA game. Machado played in regular season NBA contests in 2012-13 with the Houston Rockets and postseason with the Golden State Warriors. Played the majority 2018-19 season in the NBA G-League for the South Bay Lakers and played four games with the Los Angeles Lakers. The MAAC & Iona's all-time assist leader. He currently plays professionally in Australia.

• **Daniss Jenkins** - upon completion of his NCAA career, Jenkins signed a two-way contract with the Detroit Pistons of the NBA in 2024-25 and appeared in seven games as a rookie. He remains a two-way player for 2025-26 and has appeared in four of the Pistons first eight games.

• **Walter Clayton Jr.** - a former MAAC Player of the Year, he transferred to Florida and was named the NCAA Final Four's Most Outstanding Performer leading the Gators to the 2025 title. He was drafted 18th overall by the Washington Wizards and traded to the Utah Jazz where is signed to a rookie contract.

• **Bob Santini '53** - Iona's first NBA player, appeared in four games with the New York Knicks in 1955-56.

NOTABLE ALUMNI (ATHLETICS/POP CULTURE)

- **Brendan Malone '62** - longtime NBA assistant coach, last with the Detroit Pistons from 2014-16. Coach Malone passed away in 2023 at age 88. **Malone's grandson, Thomas, is a graduate manager for the Gaels this season.**
- **Don McLean** - Singer-songwriter noted most famous for his 1971 single "American Pie".
- **Dennis Leonard** - Kansas City Royals Hall of Famer and 12-year MLB veteran who won 20 games on three occasions from 1977-80. He was inducted in May 2015 into the New York Baseball Hall of Fame.
- **Kyle Flood '93** - Former head football coach at Rutgers, current offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Texas.
- **Maggie Timoney '89** - The Iona women's basketball Hall of Famer recently became the first female CEO of Heineken USA.
- **Jason Motte** - Major League Baseball relief pitcher recorded the final out of the 2011 World Series with the world champion St. Louis Cardinals. Has also appeared in Major League games with the Chicago Cubs, Colorado Rockies and Atlanta Braves.
- **Leonard Korir '12** - a two time NCAA track and field champion while at Iona, Korir represented Team USA in the 2016 Rio Olympic Games in the 10,000-meters and 2024 Paris Games in the Marathon.

- **Ignacio Maganto** - was selected by the LA Galaxy with the 21st pick in the first round of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft, the first Major League Soccer draft pick in Iona history. Maganto scored his first MLS goal with the Galaxy in the spring of 2015.
- **Mariano Rivera III '15** - Earned his degree in May 2015 and was selected in the fourth round by the Washington Nationals.
- **Emma Hayes** - Iona's women's soccer coach from 2003-2005, Hayes was named the 10th full-time United States Women's Soccer National Team head coach in November 2023 and won Gold in the 2024 Paris Olympic Games.
- **Juana Camilion** - Two-time MAAC Defensive Player of the Year and 2023 MAAC Player of the Year, Camilion represented Spain the 3x3 women's basketball at the 2024 Paris Olympics, earning a silver medal.

Dan Geriot enters his first season as head coach of the Iona University men's basketball program in 2025-26. He arrives in New Rochelle after spending the past 10 seasons in the National Basketball Association (NBA), where he developed a reputation for player development, tactical preparation, and building winning cultures at both the NBA and G League levels.

Geriot completed his 10th NBA season and first with the New Orleans Pelicans in 2024-25, serving as an assistant coach on Willie Green's staff. He joined the Pelicans after two seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers, where he held the dual role of assistant coach and director of player development. In that position, he was responsible for supporting head coach J.B. Bickerstaff in all facets of game preparation, opponent scouting, and individual development—particularly among the team's frontcourt players.

Over the course of nine seasons with the Cavaliers organization, Geriot steadily rose through the coaching ranks. His roles included assistant coach (2019–21), head coach of the G League's Canton Charge (2021–22), assistant/player development coach (2018–19), assistant video coordinator/coaching assistant (2016–18), and seasonal video coordinator during Cleveland's 2015–16 NBA Championship season. Across his time with the Cavs, Geriot was part of multiple playoff runs and contributed to 99 wins in his final two seasons with the club.

Before joining the NBA, Geriot began his coaching career at the collegiate level. He was an assistant coach at Campbell University from 2013 to 2015 under Kevin McGeehan, and at Princeton University from 2011 to 2013 under head coach Mitch Henderson. During his time in college basketball, he contributed to recruiting, scouting, and player development, with a focus on frontcourt skill work.

As a player, Geriot enjoyed a decorated career at the University of Richmond from 2006 to 2011. He helped lead the Spiders to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2010 and 2011, including a Sweet 16 berth in his senior season. Geriot finished his career ranked 17th on Richmond's all-time scoring list with 1,386 points, and also tallied 266 assists and 4.1 rebounds per game while shooting 37.3 percent from three-point range. He earned Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team honors as a freshman and third-team All-Atlantic 10 recognition as a sophomore. He went on to play professionally for one season in Belgium with Verviers during the 2011-12 campaign.

A native of Springfield, Pennsylvania, Geriot starred at Springfield High School, where he was named Delaware County Player of the Year after averaging 24.8 points and 10.8 rebounds as a senior. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science and history from Richmond.
