The Series With Iona

129th Meeting: Iona leads, 73-55

Of Note

The archrivals meet for the third time in five years at MVP Arena on national TV. Siena won both of those games, but Iona has won the last six overall in the series since. Past three matchups have each been decided by three points or less and by a total of eight. Last Saints win: 70-53 on Jan. 27, 2023 in Albany on ESPN. Siena is 37-33 all-time vs. the Gaels in MAAC regular season action (18-40 in all other games). **Gavin Doty** averages 20.0 points, 8.3 rebounds, and 3.3 steals in three career games vs. Iona. **Gerry McNamara** is 0-3 vs. Iona. **Dan Geriot** is 1-0 vs. Siena.

Last Meeting

C.J. Anthony had 13 assists and scored the go-ahead basket (1:31). Siena erased a 12-point deficit with 12:41 left before falling. Iona shot 11-28 from three (39%) and dished out 22 assists. The Saints held a 20-5 advantage in points off turnovers. **Toby Harris** led the Gaels with 25 points (6-12 from three). Doty posted career-highs of 31 points, 12 rebounds, and five assists.



Siena vs. the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference

Now in their 37th season as a MAAC member, Siena has won at least a share of nine MAAC Regular Season Championships and six MAAC Tournament titles (1999, 2002, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2020). 403-316 (.561) all-time overall in MAAC competition. 363-287 (.558) all-time in MAAC Regular Season action. 471-417 (.530) all-time vs. the 12 other programs which currently comprise the MAAC.

2025-26 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year nominee (top mid-major head coach)

Named one of 16 finalists nationally for CollegeInsider.com Joe. B Hall Award (top first-time head coach) after leading Siena to 10-win improvement - tied for ninth best nationally - in first season at the helm.

Syracuse legend and 2003 National Champion was named the 19th head coach in Siena Men's Basketball history on Mar. 29, 2024.

Now 42-year-old spent previous 15 years on staff with the Orange, and was elevated to Associate Head Coach in final season.

In 15 seasons on staff, "G-Mac" helped guide Syracuse to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, highlighted by trips to the Final Four in both 2013 and 2016.

Primarily charged with recruiting, scouting, and guard development, McNamara mentored current NBA performers Buddy Boeheim (Detroit Pistons) and Cole Swider (Miami Heat), and former NBA players Michael Carter-Williams, Tyler Ennis, Michael Gbinije, Elijah Hughes, and Dion Waiters.

One of the most decorated players in the storied Syracuse history, McNamara is the program's all-time career record holder for made threes (400), free throw percentage (.888), and minutes played (4,799), and ranks second all-time in steals (258), third in assists (648), fourth in scoring (2,099), and sixth in made free throws (435).

Started all 135 career games played spanning his illustrious career from 2002-06, and had his No. 3 jersey retired by Syracuse on Mar. 4, 2023.

2006 Syracuse graduate with Bachelor's degree in Speech Communications.

Scranton, Pennsylvania native was a two-time Associated Press Pennsylvania State Player of the Year (2001, 2002) and the 2002 Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year and Parade Fourth Team All-American while starring at Bishop Hannan (now known as Holy Cross).

Finished scholastic career seventh all-time in scoring in Pennsylvania state history with 2,917 career points.

McNamara and his wife, Katie, are the proud parents to four children: sons Gerry and Patrick, and daughters Maggie and Grace.

Siena returns to the Capital Region for the first time in two weeks

The Saints are in the midst of a stretch where they play five of seven on the road

Remaining three road games during the stretch are against the other three teams currently in the top-four in the standings

Siena looks to build upon a five-game win streak

The Saints are averaging 77.6 points while shooting a scintillating 56% from the field and 45% from three during the streak

Siena leads the MAAC in field goal percentage (.467)

The Saints had shot 28.4% from three (352nd - 10th worst nationally) prior to the recent stretch

Siena is however shooting 37.1% from three - second best in the MAAC - in conference action

The dynamic duo of **Justice Shoats** (19.2) and **Gavin Doty** (19.0) have combined to average 38.2 points during the stretch

Saints posted a season-long seven-game win streak spanning just 17 days earlier this season (Nov. 21 - Dec. 7)

Equalled longest winning streak (Dec. 19, 2022 - Jan. 13, 2023) since program record-tying 16 from Feb. 7, 2020 - Jan. 16, 2021

Siena swept the the Capital Thanksgiving Classic, winning three games in three days at American (Nov. 28-30)

Saints have already surpassed their win total (16) from all of last season (14) with their victory at Niagara (Jan. 30)

In Year One under **Gerry McNamara** last season, posted a 10-win improvement (tied for the ninth best turnaround nationally)

Siena ranks 20th nationally in scoring defense (65.5)

Saints are 14-1 when holding the opposition under 70 points (2-6 when the opponent scores 70 or more)

Allowed just 59.4 points per game during seven-game win streak earlier this season

Siena is a perfect 9-0 in day games (before 5 PM start)

The Saints defense has been the biggest difference in the day time, allowing 8.3 fewer points, and is 8.4% better in three-point defense and 6.3% better in overall field goal defense

Individually, Shoats averages 3.7 more points and shoots 13.4% better in the afternoon

Siena is also an unblemished 5-0 on Sundays

Saints have won five straight road games and are 10-4 overall away from home (8-4 road)

Longest streak since winning a program-record eight straight (Feb. 23, 2020 - Jan. 16, 2021)

10 wins away from home (eight road, two neutral) equals most in 27 years (12 in 1998-99)

Won just seven games away from home total the previous two seasons combined (7-29

overall —> 6-23 road, 1-6 neutral)

Siena has been paced by the dynamic duo of Doty and Shoats

The duo has accounted for the last two MAAC Player of the Week awards (Jan. 26, Feb. 2)

This week's honoree, Shoats also previously earned MAAC Player of the Week honors Dec. 1

Doty ranks fifth in the MAAC in scoring (16.6) and seventh in rebounding (6.8)

Doty has registered team-highs of seven 20-plus point performances and four double-doubles

Shoats is third in the MAAC in assists (4.8) and 10th in field goal percentage (.487)

Shoats averaged 13.7 points, fueled by four 20-plus point performances (two straight)

Freshman **Francis Folefac** has emerged as a two-time MAAC Rookie of the Week (Dec. 1, Jan. 12)

Currently ranks fourth amongst all players in the MAAC in field goal percentage (.560)

Averaging 10.8 points and 4.6 rebounds, while adding 14 double-digit scoring performances

First won MAAC Rookie of the Week in a Siena weekly award sweep on Dec. 1 (Shoats - MAAC Player of the Week)

First time Saints swept MAAC weekly awards since Nov. 28, 2022 (**Javian McCollum** - Player, **Michael Eley** - Rookie)

Siena dished out 20 or more assists in three straight games - averaging 21.0 - from Jan. 14-19

Had averaged 12.5 assists spanning first 17 games

22 assists at Manhattan (Jan. 17) was most in six years (23 vs. Niagara - Mar. 4, 2020)

As a result, Saints averaged 79.7 points during three-game stretch

Doty set the Division I program record for most field goals made without a miss, shooting a perfect 9-9 vs. Fairfield (Jan. 19)

Previous record was 8-8 shared by **Isaiah Stewart** (Feb. 1, 2001 at Rider) and **Brian Biddlingmyer** (Dec. 4, 1993 vs. Holy Cross)

Siena shot a scintillating 67.4% (31-46) from the field

Highest shooting percentage since the addition of the three-point line (1986-87 season)

Highest single-game shooting percentage in 45 years (shot 68.3% in 75-70 win at Wagner on Feb. 21, 1981)

Fourth-highest shooting percentage during the program's 50-season Division I Era

Siena secured the program's milestone 400th all-time overall Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference win vs. Fairfield (Jan. 19)

In their 37th MAAC season, the Saints now have 363 regular season wins and 40 MAAC Tournament victories

Siena has won at least a share of nine MAAC Regular Season Championships and claimed six MAAC Tournament titles

403-316 (.561) all-time overall in MAAC competition, including 363-287 (.558) in regular season action

363 all-time MAAC Regular Season wins are second only to Iona (465), who entered the conference eight years prior

Saints have more wins than Manhattan, Saint Peter's, and Fairfield, despite joining the

MAAC eight years after each of those three league rivals

Siena swept its annual Western New York trip for the first time in 10 years (Jan. 24-26, 2016)

Saints swept their MAAC Opening Weekend for the first time in five years (2020-21 season)

Siena played six times in just a 14-day stretch (Jan. 9-22), posting a solid 4-2 record

Saints had played just four times in the 32 days prior

Went 11 days between games due to the holiday break (Dec. 22 - Jan. 2) and 10 due to final exams (Dec. 7-17)

Played just four games total in the 31-day month of December

Conversely, played seven times in 17 days (Nov. 21 - Dec. 7), including four during the final week of November alone (went a perfect 7-0)

Siena returned home to make its 2026 MVP Arena debut on Jan. 9 vs. Merrimack

Went a span of 32 days since their previous home game Dec. 7 vs. Canisius

Saints salvaged a season-long four-game road trip with a victory at Rider (Jan. 4)

Was first time playing four consecutive true road games since Jan. 30 - Feb. 21, 2021

Also played four straight away from home Nov. 24-30 (two road, two neutral), going 4-0

Finished 2025 calendar year with 17-15 record, program's best in three years (19-13 in 2022)

Siena posted a 7-4 non-conference record, achieving first winning non-conference mark in three seasons (6-5 in 2022-23)

Seven non-conference wins equaled (2015-16, 2009-10, 2008-09, 2000-01) program's most since going a perfect 9-0 in 1998-99

Saints had posted losing non-conference records in seven of previous eight seasons, going just 31-56 (.356) from 2016-24

Siena opened the season 9-2, matching the program's best 11-game start in 75 years (10-1 to open the 1950-51 season)
Saints previously posted five other 9-2 starts since then, most recently to open the 1998-99 MAAC Championship season
Hot start earned McNamara Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year nomination on Dec. 16
Award presented annually to the nation's top mid-major head coach
Siena was ranked 25th nationally in consecutive CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top-25 Polls (Dec. 8, Dec. 15)
Dec. 8 poll marked first ranking since Jan. 15, 2021 (#23)
Siena has either been ranked or received votes in seven of the first 13 polls
The Saints opened the season with consecutive 16-point wins
The 32-point combined margin of victory was the program's largest through its first two games of a season since 2008-09 (48)
Siena tipped off the program's 85th varsity season and milestone 50th at the Division I level Nov. 3
Nov. 3 marked the earliest-ever calendar season-opener in program history, surpassing the previous record of Nov. 4 last year
Saints have earned seven NCAA Tournament bids, five NIT appearances, and won the College Basketball Invitational in 2014
Siena has ranked in the top-100 in average home attendance for 27 consecutive seasons
Saints has boasted the nation's top average attendance amongst all Northeast mid-major programs for five straight non-COVID impacted seasons (2019-20, 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24, 2024-25)
Siena has drawn nearly 2.9 million fans spanning 457 games played at MVP Arena, marking an average of 6,339 spectators
Expectations were high for the Saints entering the 2025-26 season
Siena was amongst teams also receiving votes in the CollegeInsider.com Preseason Men's Mid-Major Top-25 Poll
Siena was listed as a "Potential March Cinderella" by ESPN.com
The Saints were projected to finish second according to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Preseason Coaches' Poll
Siena received 152 points and three first-place votes, trailing only Quinnipiac (158 points, eight-first place votes)
The Saints finished tied for eighth in the MAAC last season, but had strong roster retention coupled with impact additions
Highest preseason prognostication in five years, since begin picked as the unanimous favorite heading into 2020-21 season
Senior **Justice Shoats** was one of only three conference players to earn unanimous Preseason First Team All-MAAC acclaim
Shoats made an immediate impact in his first season with the Saints last winter, earning Second Team All-MAAC
One of just five players named a USBWA Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week last Nov. 12
Ranked fourth in the MAAC in assists (4.7), fifth in scoring (16.1), and eighth in steals (1.8)
Scored in double figures in 28 of 32 games, highlighted by nine 20-plus point performances
Averaged 17.3 points, 5.2 assists, and 2.0 steals in MAAC regular season play
Gavin Doty earned Preseason Second Team All-MAAC recognition
Unanimous MAAC All-Rookie Team honoree after earning a league-high five MAAC Rookie of the Week awards
Ranked fifth amongst all players in the MAAC with six double-doubles and eighth in free throw percentage (.802)
Overall, averaged 11.3 points and a team-high 6.1 rebounds while shooting at a 49.2% clip from the field
Led all MAAC freshmen in league action in scoring (14.1), rebounding (7.9), field goal percentage (.480), and free throw percentage (.815)
Siena returns nine letterwinners, three starters, and four of its top-five scorers from a season ago
The Saints rank eighth nationally, returning 68.1% of their total points scored from last season
Siena is one of nine teams to bring back at least 65% of its scoring, rebounding, and assists
The Saints welcome eight newcomers, highlighted by three impact transfers and five true freshmen
Transfers **Tasman Goodrick** (Gannon) and **Antonio Chandler** (Southern Connecticut) ranked second and eighth in double-doubles at the Division II level last season, respectively
Chandler also ranked seventh nationally in DII in rebounding, while Goodrick was 12th
Fellow transfer and Capital Region native **Riley Mulvey** returns home after four seasons playing for former Siena coach **Fran McCaffery** at Iowa
Mulvey's uncle, **Jack Mulvey** '65, HOF '71 holds the Siena career record of 15.0 rebounds and single-season record of 19.2 rebounds (1964-65)
His father, **Martin Mulvey** '86, is second all-time in Siena soccer history in both points (62) and goals (27)
Freshman floor general **Christian Jones** was named one of ESPN's "16 Sleeper Newcomers" by **Jeff Borzello**
The Saints first commitment for the Class of 2025, Jones was a 2025 McDonald's All-American Games nominee, and was rated a three-star prospect and ranked as the 44th best point guard nationally in his class by 247 Sports
Seniors **Brendan Coyle**, **Marcus Jackson**, and Shoats have been appointed team captains
Both Coyle (Niskayuna) and Jackson (Amsterdam) are local products
Coyle and Jackson are both captains for the second straight season
Coyle enjoyed a breakout junior campaign, averaging 12.8 points while finishing tied for third in program single-season history with 94 made threes
Coyle ranked 43rd nationally in threes per game (2.94) and 49th in three-point field goal percentage (.393)
Jackson started the first 15 games before suffering season-ending MCL injury in left knee vs. Iona (Jan. 5)
Jackson is the younger brother of Milwaukee Bucks guard and former UConn star **Andre Jackson**
Siena is looking to take the next step in Year Two under **Gerry McNamara**
The Syracuse legend and 2003 National Champion led the Saints to a 10-win improvement in his first season, which was tied for the ninth best turnaround nationally
McNamara was one of 16 finalists nationally for CollegeInsider.com Joe B. Hall Award (top first-time head coach)
The Saints averaged 72.2 points, equaling the 2019-20 team for the program's highest mark in nine years (75.0 in 2016-17)
Siena eclipsed the 80-point mark nine times, four players averaged double figures, and six recorded a 20-point game
The Saints ranked 18th nationally averaging 5.0 blocks
Siena registered 11 blocks at BIG EAST foe Xavier last Nov. 20, just three off the program single-game record
The Saints top-three in blocks from a season ago are no longer with the program
Siena was just 1-10 against MAAC opponents in games decided by two possessions or less (8-2 in all other league contests)
The Saints suffered three league losses by a single point, and fell twice to Rider on buzzer-beaters, including to end the year

He has that fast twitch change of pace that you can't teach, but the thing that separates him most is his elite eyesight and the ability to read defenses to control a game. I love that Ryan doesn't care if he has to score to beat you or do it with the pass, just as long as his team wins."

A four-star recruit according to both ESPN and 247 Sports, Moesch is ranked the 137th best player overall in the Class of 2026 by 247 Sports, including the 14th ranked point guard, and fourth best player in Massachusetts. He is also ranked the 39th best point guard nationally, 63rd best overall player in the East Region, and seventh best overall recruit in Massachusetts by ESPN's SportsCenter NEXT.

Moesch eclipsed 2,000 career high school points as a junior in his first season at Cushing Academy in Massachusetts last winter, while averaging 17 points and six assists to lead the squad to the New England Basketball League Championship and National Prep Championship Semifinals. He averaged over 36 points per game the previous season while playing for his hometown, Chittenango.

Moesch earned Second Team honors on the Under Armour Association circuit after averaging 11.8 points and 4.3 assists while leading the Middlesex Magic to a third-place finish and a top-15 national ranking.

Bol Wieu Thet

6-10 | 195 | C | Aweil, South Sudan/Springdale Prep (MD)

"Bol has huge upside. His ability to guard defensively in space with both length and athleticism allows him to potentially guard any position. Bol still plays physically and has elite rim shot blocking presence. Offensively, he has great touch and can stretch to the three-point line with expanded ball-handling ability. His best days are ahead of him, and all the tools are there to continue to improve."

Thet plays for Springdale Prep in North Windsor, Maryland, where he averaged 14 points and nine rebounds last season. Thet broke out for Global Squad this past summer, averaging a double-double with 17 points, 11 rebounds, and two blocks.
