TOLEDO, OHIO - Toledo (0-1) will look to bounce back from a season-opening loss when the Midnight Blue & Gold entertains Iona (0-2) this morning in its home opener. The game is slated for 11:00 a.m. in Savage Arena and will be shown on ESPN+.

Toledo produced a 12-4 (.750) mark in home contests in 2017-18. In 10 years under head coach Tricia Cullop, UT is 124-36 (.775) in home games, including 55-16 (.775) against non-conference foes.

UT will also host Rocket Women's Basketball's Education Day in conjunction with today's match-up against the Gaels. A crowd of at least 2,500 students, teachers and fans are expected to be in attendance.

The Rockets are coming off a 73-59 season-opening setback at Maine on Saturday in the Cross Insurance Center.

The Black Bears (1-0) buried 13 three-point field goals and had four players in double figures to avenge last year's 65-64 overtime setback at Toledo on Nov. 30.

Senior Kaayla McIntyre led the Rockets with a game-high 24 points and seven rebounds. Sophomore Tanaya Beacham and senior Sarah St-Fort were UT's next high scorers with nine and six points, respectively.

The trio of Blanca Millan, Parise Rossignol and Dor Saar accounted for 11 of Maine's 13 treys and paced the 2017-18 America East Conference champions with 18, 15 and 15 points, respectively.

Iona has dropped its first two games this year, most recently suffering a 61-35 loss vs. St. John's on Friday at home.

Morgan Rachu led the Gaels with a game-high 16 points, a squad-best seven boards and

two thefts while playing all 40 minutes.

Toledo and Iona will meet for the second-consecutive year and fifth time overall. The Rockets lead the series, 4-0, most recently claiming a 74-57 road triumph on Nov. 27, 2017. UT also secured a 92-36 home victory on Nov. 23, 2002, a 68-60 win in the championship game of the 2010 Iona Thanksgiving Tournament on Nov. 28 in New Rochelle, N.Y. and a 54-42 home triumph on Dec. 1, 2011.

A season ago, senior Mikaela Boyd paced three Rockets in double figures with 14 points and 11 caroms, followed by McIntyre and Jada Woody with 10 points each to help the Rockets claim the 17-point victory in the Hynes Center.

As a team, UT connected on a respectable 54.2 percent (26-of-48) from the field, including a sensational 54.5 percent (6-of-11) from beyond the arc, and 76.2 percent (16-of-21) from the charity stripe.

Treyanna Clay led Iona with a game-high 15 points and 10 boards, while Alexis Lewis had 12 and Amelia Motz and Tilasha Okey-Williams chipped in with 10 points each, respectively.

UT is a perfect 11-0 all-time against teams from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (2-0 vs. Canisius, 4-0 vs. Iona, 3-0 vs. Niagara, 2-0 vs. Saint Peter's), including 4-0 under coach Cullop.

Following today's home opener, the Rockets will entertain Atlantic 10 member Duquesne on Sunday, Nov. 18 at 2:00 p.m.

TOLEDO TO HOST ROCKET WOMEN'S BASKETBALL EDUCATION DAY THIS MORNING

Toledo will host Rocket Women's Basketball Education Day this morning in conjunction with its match-up against Iona.

Sophomore Tatyana Davis totaled a career-high two assists in a collegiate-best 21 minutes as a reserve ... Davis' previous-best effort were one helper on four occasions and 11 minutes twice, most recently against Wright St. in the first round of the 2018 Postseason WNIT (March 16) ... Freshman Jaela Johnson dished out a squad-tying best three assists in nine minutes in her Rockets' debut ... Senior Mikaela Boyd was held to five points in a squad-best 31 minutes ... A two-time third-team All-MAC selection, Boyd averaged 12.1 points per game in 2017-18, the third-highest mark on the team ... She scored at least 10 points on 28 occasions

a season ago ... Toledo finished with a plus-three (39-36) advantage on the glass ... The Rockets were 12-3 when they won the battle on the boards a season ago ... Senior Kaayla McIntyre was tabbed to the 2018-19 Preseason All-MAC West Division Team. Voting for the squad was done according to a vote of the conference's 12 head coaches and SIDs. McIntyre was selected to the preseason all-league team for the first time.

TOLEDO TABBED TO FINISH SECOND IN MAC WEST DIVISION

Toledo was selected to finish second in the Mid-American Conference's West Division in 2018-19, according to a vote of the league's 12 head coaches and SIDs.

The Rockets received 52 points and trailed only defending MAC champion Central Michigan in the West Division voting with 72 points. The Chippewas received all 12 first-place tallies in the division. Eastern Michigan (41 pts.) was tabbed third in the MAC West, followed by Northern Illinois (38), Ball State (34) and Western Michigan (15) to round out the division.

Buffalo (62 pts., four first-place votes) was picked to successfully defend its East Division crown, followed by Miami (61, five first-place votes), Ohio (57, three first-place votes), Kent State (28), Bowling Green (27) and Akron (17).

Three different squads also received votes to capture the MAC Tournament at Quicken Loans Arena in Cleveland, led by the Chippewas with eight votes. The Bulls also collected three votes and the Huskies had one.

The Rockets, who finished fourth in the MAC West Division standings, made their 11th overall appearance in the 2018 Postseason WNIT and sixth in 10 years under head coach Tricia Cullop.

UT defeated Horizon League member Wright St., 64-50, in the first round (March 16) before falling at Big Ten foe Michigan St., 68-66, in the second round (March 19).

Guided by 11th-year coach Cullop, the Rockets welcome back 66.7 percent of their scoring, 69.3 percent of their rebounding, 76.0 percent of their assists, 78.2 percent of their blocks and 83.5 percent of their steals.

TOLEDO AWARDED 11TH POST-SEASON WNIT BERTH IN 2018

Toledo made its 11th overall appearance in the Postseason WNIT in 2018 and sixth in 10 years under head coach Tricia Cullop.

In addition, Bravo-Harriott and Rasmussen were two of four MAC student-athletes who finished up the 2017-18 campaign with a perfect 4.0 cumulative GPA.

**BRAVO-HARRIOTT SELECTED
FIRST-TEAM ACADEMIC ALL-
AMERICA**

Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott was named to the 2017-18 College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America First Team. Bravo-Harriott became only the fourth player in school history to earn this prestigious honor and first since Kim Knuth during the 1998-99 campaign.

A three-time Academic All-District selection, Bravo-Harriott graduated last December with a degree in communication and a minor in general business and a perfect 4.0 GPA.

Bravo-Harriott was joined on the first team by New Mexico's Cherise Beynon, Idaho's Mikayla Ferenz, Ball St.'s Carmen Grande and Kent St.'s Jordan Korinek.

WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE

Toledo produced a 12-4 (.750) mark in home games in 2017-18. In 10 years under head coach Tricia Cullop, UT is 124-36 (.775)

in home match-ups, including 55-16 (.775) against non-conference foes.

Individually, senior Kaayla McIntyre tallied a team-high 16.4 points in home games last season, followed by Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott and junior Mikaela Boyd at 13.1 and 11.9 ppg, respectively.

The Midnight Blue & Gold has won at least 11 home games in eight of 10 seasons under Cullop, including a school-record 19 victories during the 2010-11 campaign.

SAVAGE ARENA SPLENDOR

Toledo led the MAC in attendance an unprecedented 28th-consecutive season in 2017-18 and ranked No. 31 in the NCAA, averaging a league-best 3,420 fans per home game.

The Rockets drew at least 4,000 fans in four of their 16 home contests last year, including a season-high 5,024 against Western Michigan (Feb. 17).

UT has ranked in the Top 30 nationally in home attendance in six of the last seven years under head coach Tricia Cullop. Toledo also finished No. 28 (3,748) in 2011-12, No. 25 (4,012) in 2012-13, No. 24 (3,932) in 2013-14, No. 28 (3,636) in 2014-15, No. 24 (4,050) in 2015-16 and No. 27 (3,744) in 2016-17.

Senior Mikaela (*mih-KAY-luh*) Boyd emerged as UT's most dynamic player two years ago and that pattern continued in 2017-18. Boyd averaged 12.1 points, a squad-high 8.0 rebounds, a team-best 4.2 assists and a squad-high 2.2 steals in a team-best 33.2 minutes per contest. The 2017-18 third-team All-MAC selection ranked sixth in the MAC in overall rebounding, seventh in thefts, assist/turnover ratio (1.7, 139-81) and defensive boards (5.8 rpg), ninth in helpers and minutes played, 13th in offensive caroms (2.2 rpg), 15th in

Earlier on the year, Boyd pulled down a career-high 19 caroms vs. Ohio (Jan. 10), tied for fifth most in UT history and the most since Inma Zanoguera had 21 against Idaho in the first round of the Glass City Classic (Dec. 13, 2014).

The two-time team captain led the Rockets in rebounding and steals on a team-high

stripe against the Black Bears to tally at least 20 points for the eighth time as a Rocket.

A season ago, McIntyre contributed a team-best 16.0 points, 7.7 rebounds, 2.4 assists, team-high 1.4 blocks and 0.8 steals in 31.7 minutes per contest. She led the MAC in overall field-goal percentage (.632, 215-of-340, **SEVENTH IN NCAA**), as well as ranking fifth in rejections, sixth in defensive caroms (6.0 rpg), eighth in overall rebounding and 11th in scoring.

The 2017-18 third-team All-MAC honoree concluded the year fourth in UT history in overall field-goal percentage, fifth in blocked shots (46) and sixth in overall field-goals made (215) in the single-season record book.

One of three Rockets to start every game last season, McIntyre scored in double figures on a squad-best 31 occasions, including a career-high 30 points against MAC East Division champion Buffalo (Feb. 3).

She led the Rockets in blocked shots on a squad-best 21 occasions, scoring a team-high 15 times, rebounding on 14 occasions, steals seven times and assists once.

In MAC contests, McIntyre tallied a team-high 17.2 ppg, 7.2 rpg, 2.4 apg, a squad-best 1.2 bpg and 0.8 spg in 33.0 mpg. She finished first in overall field-goal percentage (.624, 126-of-202) for a third-consecutive year, as well as standing eighth in scoring.

The 2018-19 Preseason All-MAC West Division Team selection currently sits second in school history in career overall field-goal percentage (.622, 454-of-730), fourth in rejections (103) and 25th in scoring (1,063).

SANTUCCI FILLS UP BOX SCORE

Mariella Santucci (*mar-E-ell-uh SAN-too-chee*) returned for her sophomore season in 2017-18 following an impressive freshman campaign. Santucci started 21 of the 33

games last year, contributing 6.4 points, 2.5 rebounds, 4.1 assists and 1.6 steals in 27.3 minutes. The Bologna, Italy native ranked 10th in the MAC in assist/turnover ratio (1.4, 135-95) and 11th in helpers.

The second-year letterwinner scored in double figures on eight occasions in 2017-18, the fourth-highest total on the team, including a season-high 15 points and a squad-best six helpers in 34 minutes at Northern Illinois (Feb. 28).

The 2017-18 Academic All-MAC honoree also dished out at least seven dimes on four occasions during the year, including a season-high eight against Wright St. (March 16) in the first round of the Postseason WNIT.

She led the Rockets in assists on 13 occasions, steals 12 times, blocked shots on three occasions and rebounding twice.

In MAC contests, Santucci tallied 6.7 ppg, 2.2 rpg, 4.1 apg and 1.4 spg in 26.9 mpg.

Two years ago, Santucci started 33 games and averaged 7.7 points, 3.1 rebounds, a team-high 4.6 assists and 1.9 steals in 29.5 minutes.

The 2016-17 MAC All-Freshman Team honoree finished sixth in the league in helpers, ninth in assist/turnover ratio (1.4, 156-110) and 10th in thefts.

UTOR FOR TOLEDO**

Senior Sarah St-Fort had six points, a team-high eight caroms and one steal at Maine in Saturday's season opener.

81 and marked the 13th time the Midnight Blue & Gold has held an opponent under 40 points in the tenure of head coach Tricia Cullop.

In addition, UT restricted 11 opponents to 10 points or less in a quarter on 16 occasions in 2017-18, including SBU to a season-low six in the first period.

In MAC games, UT ranked eighth in scoring defense (71.4 ppg), 11th in overall field-goal percentage defense (.436, 466-of-1,070) and 10th in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.352, 103-of-293).

SHOOTING THE ROCK

Toledo shot 43.1 percent (836-of-1,938) from the field in 2017-18, averaging 67.5 points.

The Rockets finished eighth in the MAC in scoring offense, as well as ranking fifth in overall field-goal percentage and 10th in three-point field-goal percentage (.293, 178-of-608).

UT shot at least 50 percent from the floor on seven occasions last year, including a season-high 56.0 percent (28-of-50) at Michigan St. in the second round of the Postseason WNIT (March 19).

Individually, senior Kaayla McIntyre knocked down a MAC-best 63.2 percent (215-of-340, **SEVENTH IN NCAA**) from the field.

McIntyre concluded the year fourth in UT history in overall field-goal percentage and sixth in overall field-goals made (215) in the single-season record book.

Earlier in the year, McIntyre shot a near perfect 12-of-13 (92.3 percent) from the field against Western Michigan (Feb. 17), the second-highest mark in school history in a game (*minimum 10 attempts*).

Additionally, McIntyre led three Rockets scoring at least 12.0 ppg at 16.0, the 11th-best mark in the league. The three-year letterwinner scored at least 10 points on a team-high 31 occasions during the year, including a career-best 30 vs. MAC East Division Champion Buffalo (Feb. 3).

As a team, UT topped the 70-point plateau on 14 occasions in 2017-18 (*10-4 record in those contests*), pouring in a season-high 81 points against Southern in the second round of the West Palm Invitational (Dec. 18) and Detroit Mercy (Dec. 21).

In MAC contests, the Rockets ranked eighth in scoring offense (71.4 ppg), sixth in overall field-goal percentage (.427, 460-of-1,077) and 11th in three-point field-goal percentage (.278, 89-of-320). Individually, McIntyre paced the league in overall field-goal percentage for the third-consecutive year at 62.4 percent (126-of-202) from the floor and tallied a squad-best 17.2 ppg, the eighth-highest mark

A 2017-18 third-team All-MAC selection, McIntyre currently sits first in school history in career overall field-goal percentage (.624, 443-of-710), fourth in rejections (103) and 26th in scoring (1,039).

As a team, Toledo is 113-24 (.825) under head coach Tricia Cullop when scoring at least 70 points in a contest, including a 10-4 (.714) ledger in 2017-18.

GIVING IT A SHOT FROM WAY DOWNTOWN

Toledo shot 29.3 percent (178-of-608) from three-point land and averaged 5.4 treys in 2017-18, the third-worst marks in the MAC.

The Rockets connected on a season-best 54.5 percent (6-of-11) from three-point range at Iona (Nov. 27) and made a season-high 11 triples at arch-rival Bowling Green (Jan. 27).

Individually, Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott led UT's long-range effort with 79 three-point field goals, followed by junior Sara Rokkanen, junior Mariella Santucci and Jada Woody with 29, 24 and 23, respectively. Bravo-Harriott ranked seventh in the MAC in three-point field-goals made (24) and 10th in three-point field-goal percentage (.376, 79-of-210).

Bravo-Harriott concluded last year tied for fifth in UT history in three-point field-goals made (79) and tied for seventh in three-point field-goal attempts (210) in the single-season record book.

The two-time team captain knocked down at least four treys on eight occasions during the year and 22 times in her UT career, including a program-tying best eight against the Falcons to become only the fourth player

in school history to accomplish that feat.

In MAC games, the Rockets ranked 11th in three-point field goal percentage (.278, 89-of-320) and three-point field-goals made (89, 4.9).

The 2017-18 first-team Academic All-America honoree wrapped up her collegiate career third in school history in three-point field-goals made (245) and three-point field-goal attempts (684) and 10th in three-point field-goal percentage (.358, 245-of-684).

HELPING HAND

Toledo dished out 17.5 assists in 2017-18, the third-highest total in the MAC **22ND IN NCAA**.

The Rockets also ranked fourth in the league in assist/turnover ratio (1.1, 17.5-16.3) and seventh in turnover margin (-0.27, 16.3-16.1).

UT handed out at least 20 helpers on 11 occasions during the year, including a season-high 25 against Louisiana in the consolation round of the Preseason WNIT (Nov. 18) and Eastern Michigan (Feb. 21).

In addition, Toledo totaled more assists than miscues 17 times in 2017-18 (10-7 record in those games).

Individually, senior Mikaela Boyd finished ninth in the MAC in helpers (4.2 apg) and seventh in assist/turnover ratio (1.7, 139-81), while junior Mariella Santucci was 11th (4.1 apg) and 10th (1.4, 135-95) in the same categories, respectively.

Boyd dished out at least seven dimes three times during the year, including a season-high eight against Ohio (Jan. 10) and Western Michigan (Feb. 17).

In MAC games, UT ranked third in assists (17.1 apg), fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.1, 17.1-16.2) and seventh in turnover margin (-1.06, 16.2-15.1). Individually, Boyd was ninth in helpers (4.3 apg) and sixth in assist/turnover ratio (1.6, 78-48).

CHARITY CASES

The Rockets drained at least 75 percent at the charity stripe on 12 occasions during the year, including a season-high 86.4 percent (19-of-22) at Western Michigan (Jan. 31).

UT also knocked down a season-high 25 free throws in a season-best 30 attempts from the line at Ohio (Dec. 31).

Individually, Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott and junior Mariella Santucci were the most consistent Rockets at the free throw line in 2017-18, converting 80.3 percent (57-of-71) and 70.3 percent (52-of-74), respectively.

Earlier in the year, senior Kaayla McIntyre and Santucci each converted 18-consecutive free throws.

In MAC games, Toledo shot 63.0 percent (204-of-324) from the charity stripe, the worst mark in the league.

Individually, Bravo-Harriott and Santucci knocked down 80.0 percent (28-of-35) and 73.7 percent (28-of-38) against conference opponents, respectively.

TOLEDO ON THE GLASS

Toledo held a 39-36 advantage on the boards at Maine in Saturday's season opener. Three different Rockets pulled down at least six rebounds against the Black Bears, including a team-high eight by senior Sarah St-Fort.

A season ago, UT averaged 35.9 rebounds and had two players pulling down at least 7.5 caroms (senior Mikaela Boyd, 8.0; senior Kaayla McIntyre, 7.7). Despite standing only 5-foot-7, Boyd ranked sixth in the MAC in overall rebounding and seventh in defensive caroms (5.8 rpg), while McIntyre was eighth and sixth (6.0 rpg) in the same categories, respectively.

UT also handed out at least 20 helpers on 11 occasions last year, including a season-high 25 against Louisiana in the consolation round of the Preseason WNIT (Nov. 18) and Eastern Michigan (Feb. 21).

In addition, Toledo totaled more assists than miscues 17 times in 2017-18 (10-7 record in those games).

Individually, senior Mikaela Boyd finished ninth in the MAC in helpers (4.2 apg) and seventh in assist/turnover ratio (1.7, 139-81), while junior Mariella Santucci was 11th (4.1 apg) and 10th (1.4, 135-95) in the same categories, respectively.

Boyd dished out at least seven dimes three times during the year, including a season-high eight against Ohio (Jan. 10) and Western Michigan (Feb. 17).

In MAC games, UT ranked third in assists (17.1 apg), fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.1, 17.1-16.2), seventh in turnover margin (-1.06, 16.2-15.1) and ninth in miscues (16.2 tpg). Individually, Boyd was ninth in helpers (4.3 apg) and sixth in assist/turnover ratio (1.6, 78-48).

DOUBLE FIGURE SCORERS

Toledo had nine players score in double figures on 99 occasions in 2017-18. Senior Kaayla McIntyre tallied at least 10 points on a team-high 31 occasions during the year, followed by senior Mikaela Boyd and Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott with 23 and 22 double-digit efforts, respectively.

McIntyre contributed a squad-best 16.0 points per game, the 11th-highest total in the MAC, while Bravo-Harriott and Boyd tallied 12.8 and 12.1 ppg, the 19th- and 23rd-best marks in the conference, respectively.

As a team, the Rockets produced a season-high four players in double digits on nine occasions, including six times against MAC opponents.

There were plenty of minutes to go around for Toledo in 2017-18. Four Rockets averaged at least 27.0 minutes per game during the year, while two others logged better than 31.5 minutes. Senior Mikaela Boyd averaged a team-high 33.2 mpg, the ninth-best total in the conference, followed by senior Kaayla McIntyre at 31.7 mpg.

Boyd logged at least 35 minutes on 14 occasions in 2017-18, including a career-best 43 minutes vs. Western Michigan (Feb. 17), the most time played by a Rocket since Brenae Harris logged 44 minutes vs. Akron on March 9, 2016.

In MAC contests, Boyd averaged a team-best 35.0 mpg, the sixth-highest mark in the league.

Toledo played three overtime contests in 2017-18, tallying a 2-1 (.667) win-loss ledger in those games.

UT claimed a thrilling 69-68 triumph against Western Michigan (Feb. 17) and secured a 65-64 win over Maine (Nov. 30), along with dropping an 80-76 decision against Kent St. in the first round of the MAC Tournament (March 5).

The Rockets are 25-17 (.595) in overtime contests in the 43-plus year history of the program, including a 9-5 (.643) mark under head coach Tricia Cullop.

Toledo holds an impressive 48-31 (.608) ledger in contests decided by five points or less under head coach Tricia Cullop.

THREE-TIME MAC COACH OF THE YEAR



Entering her 11th year at the helm of the Toledo women's basketball program, head coach Tricia Cullop has rebuilt a Mid-American Conference powerhouse.

UT has hung seven postseason banners in Cullop's time patrolling the sidelines, including a 2011 Postseason WNIT championship, one MAC Championship, two MAC regular-season and four MAC West Division banners from the rafters of Savage Arena. Considering the Rockets experienced five-consecutive losing campaigns prior to Cullop's arrival, Toledo's turnaround has truly been a testament to her coaching ability.

Under Cullop's guidance, the Midnight Blue & Gold has amassed an impressive 220-112 overall record and a 116-54 conference mark. UT is averaging a MAC-best 22.0 wins over the last 10 seasons. Individually, 12 Rockets have earned All-MAC honors on 27 occasions.

Cullop, who has a 343-222 record in her 18-year coaching career, was named the Toledo head coach on April 18, 2008, becoming the ninth coach in the program's history.

A 1993 graduate of Purdue University, Cullop received a bachelor's degree in communications. As a four-year letterwinner with the Boilermakers, she was part of three-straight NCAA Championship teams (1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92) that won Purdue's first-ever Big Ten championship. Cullop was a team captain in 1992-93 and a three-time academic All-Big Ten selection under head coach Lin Dunn. A 2018 Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame honoree, she

was named the Purdue Mortar Board Female Student-Athlete of the Year in 1993.

A native of Bicknell, Ind., Cullop was a 1989 High School All-American at North Knox High School. She was also a member of the North Squad in the 1991 U.S. Sports Festival.

Cullop, who will serve as vice president of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association during the upcoming 2018-19 membership year, is the daughter of Theodore (deceased) and Jannette Cullop, and has two sisters, Tammy and Tracy.

MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE BRILLIANCE

Cullop has led Toledo to one MAC Championship (2017), two MAC regular-season titles (2010-11, 2012-13), four MAC West Division crowns (2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13) and two championship game appearances (2010, 2017). Cullop is currently tied for fifth in league history in overall winning percentage (.663) and ninth in conference winning percentage (.682).

HOME COURT DOMINANCE

Toledo has been nearly unbeatable in Savage Arena over last 10 seasons under Cullop, compiling stout 124-36 (.775) ledger. UT has also been dominant against MAC opponents on home court, winning 69 of 89 contests (.775). The Rockets have won at least 11 home contests in eight of 10 seasons, including school-record 19 victories during 2010-11 campaign. Toledo has led MAC in attendance each of last 10 years and ranked Top 30 nationally in six of

last seven years.

UT posted school-record and MAC-best 7,301 fans vs. USC in 2011 Postseason WNIT Championship Game.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Sixteen Toledo players have been selected Academic All-MAC on 28 occasions and total of 31 players have made University's Dean's List (3.5 GPA or higher) on 105 occasions. Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott was named 2017-18 first-team Academic All-America, becoming only fourth player in school history to earn this prestigious honor. In addition, Bravo-Harriott was school-record three-time Academic All-District selection. Rockets have posted team grade-point average above 3.2 in 13 of 20 semesters. UT was recently honored by NCAA for ranking in Top 10 percent in Academic Progress Rate (APR) with perfect score of 1,000 for four-year period from 2013-14 to 2016-17 (second time in last three years UT posted MAC's top APR score). Toledo's success in classroom has also been recognized by WBCA for having Top 25 team GPA nationally, posting 3.443 overall GPA during 2014-15 academic year to rank No. 18.

TEAMS EXCEL IN MARCH

Cullop has posted 26-15 (.634) win-loss record in postseason play (12-9 in MAC Tournament, 14-5 in the Postseason WNIT and 0-1 in NCAA Championships) while patrolling Toledo sidelines. Eleventh-year head coach led Rockets to first MAC Championship since 2001 and appearance in 2017 NCAA Championships. Cullop has also guided Toledo to Postseason WNIT on six occasions, including spot in 'Sweet 16' three times. Rockets have won at least one game in Postseason WNIT in each of last six appearances.

STRONG COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Rockets have also been very active in community during Cullop's time at UT, helping with projects such as Habitat for Humanity, Walk to Defeat ALS, Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure, Buddy Walk for Down Syndrome Association of Greater Toledo and Sponsor a Family for Christmas. Toledo also made outstanding contributions at annual "Rockets for the Cure" game, raising at least \$10,000 nine straight seasons.
