## The Series With Iona 70th Overall Meeting

(Siena leads 42-27) Last Meeting - Siena 70, Iona 48 Jan. 20, 2018 - New Rochelle, NY





#### Of Note

**Ali Jaques** is 6-10 against the Gaels as a head coach (all with Siena) - but is 4-1 over Iona in the last two years (2016-17, 2017-18)

Siena and Iona met for the first time in 1979-80, with the Saints taking the first matchup 79-67.

#### Last Meeting vs. Hofstra

Twenty-two points would be the difference in a Siena Women's Basketball 70-48 rout of Iona last January. Nine separate Saints would score in the victory over the Gaels. Senior guard Kollyns Scarbrough led Siena with 23 points in 23 minutes played. Freshman forward Marilena Gerostergiou came off the bench and knocked down a then career-high 11 points while going three-for-three from the charity stripe. Sabrina Piper also added 12 points off the bench. Iona was led by Alexis Lewis who came off the bench and tallied a double-double with 21 points and 13 rebounds. Treyanna Clay added 12 points for the Gaels while going six-for-eight from the field.

## **HEAD COACH ALI JAQUES**



New York University '98 (Seventh Season at Siena) Overall Record: 94-108

In just six short seasons Ali Jaques has put Siena Women's Basketball back on the map. Under her leadership the Saints enter the 2018-19 season with a second straight third place ranking in the MAAC Preseason Coaches Poll, after putting up the most overall wins in the program in four years.

Prior to their success last season, the Saints recorded 13 conference wins for the most victories since 2003–04 following a MAAC Preseason third place pick.

In 2017-18, Jaques helped collect the program's highest overall win total since 2014-15, when her Saints won 22 games and advanced to the championship game of the Women's Basketball Invitational. Siena won 17 games, and advanced to the MAAC semifinals.

Jaques guided the Saints to a 22-13 overall record during the 2014-15 season which marked the program's first winning season in 11 years and most victories in a dozen seasons. Siena's 13-win improvement from the previous season was tied for the second best turnaround in all of Division I and the Saints' 12 true road wins were tied for the fourth most nationally. Additionally, for the third time in Jaques' first three seasons, the Saints won their MAAC Tournament opener as the lower seeded team.

Siena was rewarded for its success with a trip to the Women's Basketball Invitational and became the first school in MAAC history to win three games in a national postseason tournament and advance to the championship game. The Saints defeated Big East foe Xavier in the quarterfinals in Cincinnati by 20 points, marking the program's largest margin of victory ever over a current member of one of the six major conferences (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12, SEC).

Beginning its 30th season of MAAC competition, Siena began 2019 league play with a statement win over Saint Peter's Friday

evening, routing in the Peacocks in Jersey City, 84-57.

The Saints' point total was their second-most on the season, (86 at Howard on Nov. 19, and marked the second time that the team had eclipsed the 80-point threshold. Siena had not done so multiple times in a season since 2016-17 (4x).

The squad was victorious in its conference opener for the third time in the last four seasons, extending its winning streak over

the Peacocks to 17 straight dating back to 2010.

Four different Saints posted double-digit scoring totals in the win, with redshirt-senior Aaliyah Jones matching her season high of 15 points in her first start of the season. Junior Maddie Sims steadied the team with 11 boards, matching her career high and coming a point away from her third consecutive double-double.

Aside from Sims, Jones tied a career mark in field goals made (7), while junior Sabrina Piper matched collegiate bests in

rebounds (7) and assists (7).

After holding a seven-point lead at the half, the Saints exploded for a 31-point effort in the third quarter, matching a program record for a period since the NCAA switched from halves to quarters prior to the 2015-16 campaign. The team also posted 31 points in the fourth quarter of a conference win at Canisius on Feb. 8, 2017.

Siena's 24 assists in the win were the team's most since having 27 helps in a 79-44 win at Niagara on Jan. 26, 2006.

Additionally, the team's 50 rebounds were its most in a contest since accumulating 63 against Navy on Nov. 27, 2015. In out-rebounding Saint Peter's 50-25, Siena also posted its highest rebounding margin over an opponent (+25) since the Navy contest (+27).

Competing in its 12th game of the season, the team turned in season highs in field goals made (33), field goal percentage (47.8), offensive rebounds (20), total rebounds (50) and assists (24), while tying a season best in three-pointed made (9).

33 field goals made was the most by the Saints in a contest since they made 34 in a win over rider on Jan. 29, 2007. The Saints will now aim for their first 2-0 start to conference play since the 2015-16 season, when they won their first seven

MAAC contests to begin league action.

- Siena has accumulated a 287-211 (.576) record in MAAC play all-time, including a 57-60 (.487) outcome under head coach Ali Jaques

For the second consecutive year, Siena was picked to finish third in the MAAC in the Preseason Coaches' Poll, with Maddie Sims (Second Team) and Aaliyah Jones (Third Team) earning Preseason All-MAAC honors.

The team has won three of its last five contests against MAAC schools, including three straight regular season games dating back to last season.

Adding three assists to her total on Friday, senior Deja Rawls is now tied for 20th all-time with Cori Drummond (267, 1995-99) in program history. She will move into sole possession of 20th with her next help, and needs two to tie Tehresa Coles (269, 2011–15) for 19th

Having swept the regular season series over the last two seasons and won four of the last five matchups over all, Siena holds a

42-27 advantage all-time over Iona.

Winners in their last three MAAC home openers, Siena is 19-10 all-time when hosting its first conference contest of the season.

Junior Maddie Sims became the first Siena player to earn a MAAC weekly honor this season when she was named the conference's Player of the Week on Dec. 17. The accolade came after the Mount Laurel, N.J. native recorded her third double-double of the year, which propelled the team to a non-conference win over UMass on Dec. 16.

In a 64-59 home victory over Massachusetts on Dec. 16, The game's opening period saw the Saints shoot 58.3 percent (7-12) from the field, marking their most efficient quarter in the last 47 played. Siena shot 64.3 percent (9-14) from the field in the second quarter of a victory over Saint Peter's back on Feb. 25, 2018.

Sabrina Piper recorded a career performance in the team's win over Colgate on Nov. 29, dropping 30 points while going 10–15 from the field, 4–6 from three-point range and 6–9 from the free throw line, all personal bests. Piper was the first Saint since Kollyns

Scarborough last season to have a 30-point game and connect on 10 or more buckets.

Piper accounted for 54.5 % of the team's scoring in the contest, believed to be the second-high single output percentage in program history, with Scarborough scoring 56 % of the Saints' points on Jan. 13, 2018. Piper and Sims combined for 45 total points, good for 81.8 % of the team's output, a new program mark for a scoring effort by two players in a game by percentage.

Siena posted several notable team numbers in its 86-81 thriller over Howard on Nov. 19. The team posted its highest point total since defeating Monmouth, 91-86 in double-overtime on Jan. 12, 2017. The team's nine made three-pointers were its most in a contest since draining nine in a win over Canisius on Feb. 18, 2017. Furthermore, four Saints put up double-digit scoring for the first time since a Feb. 32, 2018 win over Saint Peter's since a Feb. 25, 2018 win over Saint Peter's

Down by as many as 17 points in the third quarter, Siena completed its largest comeback since trailing by 20 at Canisius on Jan.

11, 2015, a 71-70 won that came during the year of the "Magnificent Seven", who guided the squad to the WBI Semifinals.

Junior Maddie Sims (21 pts, 11 reb) & freshman Amari Anthony (12 pts, 10 reb) each posted their first career double-double in the contést, marking the first time since Féb. 2, 2016 that multiple Saints have done so in a game. Additionally, Anthony became the first Siena freshman since Margot Hetzke (five during the 2014-15 season) on Feb. 21, 2015 to record the feat.

Siena is competing in its 45th season in program history and 36th at the NCAA Division I level in 2018-19.

The team has compiled a 672-555 (.548) all-time record, including a 321-229 (.583) mark in MAAC play since joining the confer-

ence in 1990

Coach Jaques enters her seventh season at the helm of the program with an 92-106 (.465), including 56-60 (.483) in league

The Saints are looking to improve on a 17–14 record from last season, which featured an 11–7 mark in the MAAC and the squad's eighth conference tournament victory in the last nine seasons.

The team returns four of five starters from 2017–18 after graduating three seniors and seeing three players depart following the

end of the season.

The Saints own a 248-145 (.632) all-time record when playing inside the Alumni Recreation Center, and have posted marks of .500 or better at home in each of the last four seasons. 2017-18's 11-5 home record was the team's best since 2002-03.

Siena's 2018-19 schedule ties a program record with 15 home contests, 14 of which will be played at the ARC and one serving as the matinee of a doubleheader with the Siena men's basketball team at the Times Union Center. Each home game will be played on a weekend (Thur-Sun).

Six freshman signed on to the Saints' roster for the 2018-19 season for their largest incoming class since 2010-11. Three of the top four scorers from last season return to the hardwood for the Saints, including Maddie Sims (9.5 PPG), who led the team in blocks  $(\frac{1}{3}6)$  and ranked second in rebounds (6.3) and assists (52) last year.

Senior Deja Rawls returns to the lineup after steadying the team in assists (91) last season.
Redshirt-seniors Aaliyah Jones and Joella Gibson both sign on for fifth years this season.
Former Saint Peter's standout Antonia Smith joins the Saints' coaching staff as the Director of Basketball Operations in 2018-19. The Bronx, NY native averaged double-figure scoring in the final two seasons of her time with the Peahens, which spanned from

Former Siena Women's Basketball standout Kollyns Scarbrough '18 has been named one of two MAAC nominees for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. The other MAAC nominee is Fairfield University volleyball student athlete Megan Theiller.

Scarbrough was selected from a pool of nine nominees from the MAAC, each from a different institution and spanning six different sports. She will become the sixth Siena female student athlete since 2006 to be named a MAAC nominee, joining Liz Hubbard (volleyball, 2006), Laura Woolgar (women's golf, 2007), Tabitha Tice (women's soccer, 2011), Lesli Akeo (volleyball, 2013), and Taylor Ákana (volleyball, 2014).

Over her career, Scarbrough saw 3,768 minutes, the most of any Siena player in history. She graduated ranking eighth all-time in scoring with 1,515 points and seventh in rebounds with 733. She played in all 128 games during her career, starting all 22 her freshman season. She was an All-Rookie Team, two-time Second Team and First Team All-MAAC Selection over her four years donning the Green and Gold.

In the classroom, Scarbrough graduated from Siena in May of 2018 with a degree in psychology, finishing her time in Green and Gold with a career GPA of 3.41. She was named to the MAAC All-Academic Team three times, each season from her sophomore campaign through senior year. She was a four-time honoree on the MAAC Academic Honor Roll, and a member of the Dean's List all four years at Siena. Scarbrough was also a member of Siena's prestigious

**Siena lost by more than 30 points:** Siena fell to #14/13 Syracuse, 102-65, on Nov. 14, 2016, in Syracuse, NY. The Saints have lost by more than 30 points six times in the Ali Jaques era, including four two teams ranked or receiving votes in the AP Top 25.

**Five Siena players scored in double figures:** Five of Siena's nine active players reached double figures in the Saints' 81-65 win at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 30, 2015 in Hackensack, N.J. It marked the second time in 15 games that five Saints had reached double figures, after Siena had gone the previous 251 games without doing so (Jan. 29, 2007).

Siena grabbed more than 50 rebounds in a game: Siena out-rebounded Saint Peter's to open conference play on Jan, 4, 2019. The Saints grabbed exactly 50 rebounds, collecting a rebounding margin of +27, their biggest margin since a Nov. 27, 2015 win at Navy.

A Siena player scored 30 or more points in a game: Junior Sabrina Piper had a career night when she dropped 30 points on the Colgate Raiders in a Siena 55-53 win at the ARC on Nov. 29, 2018. Piper was 10-for-15 from the field, including a 4-for-6 clip from three-point range.

A Siena player had 10 or more assists in a game: Ida Krogh became the first Saint since Liga Alpe-Luka on Nov. 10, 2007 to post a double-digit assist game with a 10-assist performance in a 62-55 win over Manhattan Jan. 13, 2013 at the Times Union Center.

Siena failed to convert a free-throw: On Dec. 4, 2006 Siena went 0-3 from the line at #1 Maryland.

Siena failed to convert a 3-pointer: Fifth seeded Siena missed all 13 of its three-point attempts in a 64-47 loss to top seed Quinnipiac in the MAAC Semifinals on Mar. 8, 2015 at the Times Union Center. It marked the first time in 118 games that the Saints had failed to make a three-pointer, dating back to a 67-53 loss at North Carolina A&T Nov. 25, 2011.

A Siena opponent failed to convert a 3-pointer: Saint Peter's went o-for-8 from beyond the arc in a 57-40 victory by the Saints on Feb. 19, 2011 at the Yanitelli Center in Jersey City, N.J. It marked the first time in 10 years that Siena held its opponent without a three since Marist went 0-for-9 from distance on Feb. 17, 2001.
