Siena in the MAAC Tournament

Siena makes its 30th appearance in the MAAC Tournament since joining the conference in 1989-90

The Saints are 27-28 all-time in the MAAC Tournament and captured their lone championship in 2001

Siena won its MAAC Tournament opener eight of the last nine years

The Saints are now 22-8 (.733) all-time in MAAC Tournament openers

Siena has advanced to the MAAC Quarterfinals for the 12 of the last 13 years

The Saints have advanced at least as far as the quarterfinal round 28 times in the program's 30 years in the MAAC

Siena is 16-11 (.593) all-time in MAAC Quarterfinals matchups

Siena has advanced at least as far as the semifinal round 17 times in 29 tournaments

The Saints are 3-0 all-time vs. No. 10 seeds in the MAAC Tournament

Siena is 4-4 all-time vs. Iona in the MAAC Tournament

The programs are meeting for the sixth time in the last ten seasons

The Saints defeated Iona in the MAAC Quarterfinals here in Albany back in 2014-15 (last win over Gaels in postseason)

Siena is just 10-17 all-time in MAAC Tournament games played in Albany

The Saints have lost nine of their last 13 MAAC Tournament games at this facility

Siena is 17-11 in MAAC Tournament games held elsewhere

Ali Jaques is 8-10 against the Gaels as a head coach (all with Siena) – but is 6-1 over Iona in the last three years (2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19)

Siena and Iona met for the first time in 1979-80, with the Saints taking the first matchup 79-67.

Last Meeting vs. Iona

With only a three-point lead heading into the fourth quarter, the Siena Saints turned on the jets and took off on offense, scoring 28 points in the final frame in a 66-45 victory over the Iona Gaels. Siena used a 20-6 run midway through the quarter, as well as got to the free throw line 19 times making 17 free throws as the difference in the ballgame.

The Saints (10-13, 6-6) were led by a 19-point performance from junior Maddie Sims, as she went 8-for-13 from the field and added five rebounds and three assists. Freshman Lala Watts had her best game of her collegiate career to this point, as she poured in 11 points with four rebounds. Junior Sabina Piper and sophomore Marilena Gerostergiou each collected 10 points as well, as Gerostergiou added team-highs in rebounds with seven, and assists with four.

SIENA HEAD COACH ALI JAQUES



New York University '98
(Seventh Season at Siena)
Overall Record: 101-118

In just six short seasons Ali Jaques has put Siena Women's Basketball back on the map. Under her leadership the Saints enter the 2018-19 season with a second straight third place ranking in the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll, after putting up the most overall wins in the program in four years.

Prior to their success last season, the Saints recorded 13 conference wins for the most victories since 2003-04 following a MAAC Preseason third place pick.

In 2017-18, Jaques helped collect the program's highest overall win total since 2014-15, when her Saints won 22 games and advanced to the championship game of the Women's Basketball Invitational. Siena won 17 games, and advanced to the MAAC semifinals.

Jaques guided the Saints to a 22-13 overall record during the 2014-15 season which marked the program's first winning season in 11 years and most victories in a dozen seasons. Siena's 13-win improvement from the previous season was tied for the second best turnaround in all of Division I and the Saints' 12 true road wins were tied for the fourth most nationally. Additionally, for the third time in Jaques' first three seasons, the Saints won their MAAC Tournament opener as the lower seeded team.

Siena was rewarded for its success with a trip to the Women's Basketball Invitational and became the first school in MAAC history to win three games in a national postseason tournament and advance to the championship game. The Saints defeated Big East foe Xavier in the quarterfinals in Cincinnati by 20 points, marking the program's largest margin of victory ever over a current member of one of the six major conferences (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12, SEC).

QUICK HITS



- After concluding the 2018-19 regular season with a 12-17 overall record, Siena Women's Basketball heads into the 2019 MAAC Tournament as the No. 7 seed, facing off against No. 10 Iona Thursday at 11:30 AM.
- Competing in the MAAC Tournament for the 30th time in program history, Siena is 27-28 all-time in the event, including 4-4 when facing the Gaels, 5-1 in the first round and 2-2 as the No. 7 seed. The squad is 5-6 in the tournament under Coach Jaques, having won at least one game in five of her first six seasons at the helm.
- Entering at the No. 3 spot in 2018, Siena took down No. 6 Niagara before falling to No. 2 Marist in the semifinal round. The Saints last faced off against Iona in the 2017 edition of the tournament, falling, 67-47 in the quarterfinal round.
- The Saints concluded their regular season slate at home in the ARC Saturday afternoon, falling to Regular Season Champion Quinnipiac, 67-38. Junior Maddie Sims led the squad offensively with 12 points and seven rebounds, while the team's four graduating members were honored prior to tip-off as part of Senior Day activities.
- Having swept the Gaels in a pair of contests during the regular season already, The Saints will look to defeat an opponent three times in a year for the first time since the 2010-11 campaign, when they swept Fairfield in the regular season and beat the Stags in the MAAC Quarterfinals.
- For the fourth time in the last five years, Siena saw multiple players earn MAAC Postseason Awards, with the conference announcing the 2018-19 All-MAAC teams earlier this week. Junior Maddie Sims was named Second Team All-MAAC, while redshirt-senior Aaliyah Jones picked up Third Team All-MAAC honors, matching both of their preseason team nods.
- With a win over Niagara on Feb. 16, Head Coach Ali Jaques became the third coach in program history to ellipse the 100-win threshold, joining Gina Castelli (1990-2012, 336) and Joe Hogan (1980-85, 115) as Siena coaches to do so. Currently in her seventh year at the helm, Jaques holds a 101-118 all-time record.
- Having won the last four games over Iona, Siena is 44-27 all-time against the Gaels, including 8-10 under Coach Jaques.
- Siena has accumulated a 294-220 (.572) record in MAAC play all-time, including a 64-70 (.478) outcome under head coach Ali Jaques.
- Adding one assist to her total last Thursday, senior Deja Rawls sits in 13th place all-time in the category with 306. Rawls needs 16 more helps to tie Siena Athletics Hall of Famer Gunta Basko (1999-03, 322) for 12th.
- Adding two blocks to her career total on Saturday, Maddie Sims is now tied for 8th place all-time with Ann Marie Graney (1981-95, 94). Sims is also currently fifth in program history for the most blocks in a single season with 46 this year.
- Maddie Sims finished the regular season tied with Canisius' Sara Hinriksdottir for first in the MAAC in double-doubles, with seven so far this season, including five in conference play.
- Entering Thursday's game, redshirt-senior Joella Gibson is fifth in career games played with 120, while senior Deja Rawls is sixth with 119.
- For the second consecutive year, Siena was picked to finish third in the MAAC in the Preseason Coaches' Poll, with Maddie Sims (Second Team) and Aaliyah Jones (Third Team) earning Preseason All-MAAC honors.
- Junior Maddie Sims became the first Siena player to earn a MAAC weekly honor this season when she was named the conference's Player of the Week on Dec. 17. The accolade came after the Mount Laurel, N.J. native recorded her third double-double of the year, which propelled the team to a non-conference win over UMass on Dec. 16.
- The team scored 42 points in the paint in the victory over Niagara on Feb. 16, improving to 4-1 this season and 4-0 in MAAC play when producing 40 or more points down low.
- The team went 12-15 (80 %) from the floor in the fourth quarter of a win over Iona on Feb. 7, giving them statistically their best period this season and their most efficient quarter since shooting 88.9 percent (8-9) in the second stanza of a loss against Quinnipiac on Feb. 11, 2018.
- Siena connected on 12 threes in a losing effort to Fairfield on Jan. 29, marking the first time since Dec. 6, 2016 that they compiled double-digit triples in a contest and the most overall in a tilt since Mar. 6, 2014.
- The team registered 10 blocks in their victory over Saint Peter's on Jan. 27, marking the first time since at least the 2001-02 campaign they have gone into double-figures in swats. Maddie Sims registered seven blocks individually in the contest, tying a single-game program record.
- Trailing by as many as 10 points late in the first quarter against Monmouth on Jan. 19, Siena completed its fourth comeback win from a double-digit deficit this season. The team's resiliency marked the first time in at least 18 seasons (2001-02) that they have overcome at least four holes of 10 points or more to win a contest.
- Siena was stellar from the free throw line in its 59-47 victory over Iona, going 27-29 for a 93.1 % effort, the most made in a game since Jan. 28, 2017 (30) and the best completion percentage (min. 10 made) since Dec. 12, 2016 (15-16).
- After holding a seven-point lead at the half, the Saints exploded for a 31-point effort in the third quarter of an 84-57 blowout of Saint Peter's in Jersey City on Jan. 4, matching a program record for a period since the NCAA switched from halves to quarters prior to the 2015-16 campaign. The team also posted 31 points in the fourth quarter of a conference win at Canisius on Feb. 8, 2017.
- Siena's 24 assists in the win were the team's most since having 27 helps in a 79-44 win at Niagara on Jan. 26, 2006.
- Additionally, the team's 50 rebounds were its most in a contest since accumulating 63 against Navy on Nov. 27, 2015. In out-rebounding Saint Peter's 50-25, Siena also posted its highest rebounding margin over an opponent (+25) since the Navy contest (+27).
- 33 field goals made in the contest were the most by the Saints in a contest since they made 34 in a win over Rider on Jan. 29, 2007.
- In a 64-59 home victory over Massachusetts on Dec. 16, The game's opening period saw the Saints shoot 58.3 percent (7-12) from the field, marking their most efficient quarter in the last 47 played. Siena shot 64.3 percent (9-14) from the field in the second quarter of a victory over Saint Peter's back on Feb. 25, 2018.
- Sabrina Piper recorded a career performance in the team's win over Colgate on Nov. 29, dropping 30 points while going 10-15 from the field, 4-6 from three-point range and 6-9 from the free throw line, all personal bests. Piper was the first Saint since Kollyns Scarborough last season to have a 30-point game and connect on 10 or more buckets.
- Piper accounted for 54.5 % of the team's scoring in the contest, believed to be the second-high single output percentage in program history, with Scarborough scoring 56 % of the Saints' points on Jan. 13, 2018. Piper and Sims combined for 45 total points, good for 81.8 % of the team's output, a new program mark for a scoring effort by two players in a game by percentage.
- Siena posted several notable team numbers in its 86-81 thriller over Howard on Nov. 19. The team posted its highest point total since defeating Monmouth, 91-86 in double-overtime on Jan. 12, 2017. The team's nine made three-pointers were its most in a contest since draining nine in a win over Canisius on Feb. 18, 2017.
- Down by as many as 17 points in the third quarter, Siena completed its largest comeback since trailing by 20 at Canisius on Jan. 11, 2015, a 71-70 win that came during the year of the "Magnificent Seven", who guided the squad to the WBI Semifinals.
- Junior Maddie Sims (21 pts, 11 reb) & freshman Amari Anthony (12 pts, 10 reb) each posted their first career double-double in the contest, marking the first time since Feb. 2, 2016 that multiple Saints have done so in a game. Additionally, Anthony became the first Siena freshman since Margot Hetzke (five during the 2014-15 season) on Feb. 21, 2015 to record the feat.
- Siena is competing in its 45th season in program history and 36th at the NCAA Division I level in 2018-19.
- The Saints are looking to improve on a 17-14 record from last season, which featured an 11-7 mark in the MAAC and the squad's eighth conference tournament victory in the last nine seasons.
- The team returns four of five starters from 2017-18 after graduating three seniors and seeing three players depart following the end of the season.
- The Saints own a 253-151 (.628) all-time record when playing inside the Alumni Recreation Center, and have posted marks of .500 or better at home in each of the last four seasons. 2017-18's 11-5 home record was the team's best since 2002-03.
- Siena's 2018-19 schedule ties a program record with 15 home contests, 14 of which will be played at the ARC and one serving as the matinee of a doubleheader with the Siena men's basketball team at the Times Union Center. Each home game will be played on a weekend (Thur-Sun).
- Six freshmen signed on to the Saints' roster for the 2018-19 season for their largest incoming class since 2010-11.
- Three of the top four scorers from last season return to the hardwood for the Saints, including Maddie Sims (9.5 PPG), who led the team in blocks (36) and ranked second in rebounds (6.3) and assists (5.2) last year.
- Senior Deja Rawls returns to the lineup after steadying the team in assists (91) last season.
- Redshirt-seniors Aaliyah Jones and Joella Gibson both sign on for fifth years this season.
- Former Saint Peter's standout Antonia Smith joins the Saints' coaching staff as the Director of Basketball Operations in 2018-19. The Bronx, NY native averaged double-figure scoring in the final two seasons of her time with the Peahens, which spanned from 2011-15.
- 11 of the 14 members of the team have family members that have participated in collegiate or professional athletics. Three players - Maddie Sims (brother, Stonehill College), Deja Rawls (Cousin, Morgan State University) and Margo Peterson (Sister, Stockton University) have relatives who are currently playing college basketball.

Both will enroll at Siena in the fall.

"Julia and Angel are players we targeted as a staff from the first time we saw them play," said head coach Ali Jaques. "We are excited to bring in two New York players who have had tremendous success in their respective catholic high schools throughout their entire careers."

Parker, a 5'6 point guard from Buffalo, comes to Siena from Cardinal O'Hara High School. Ranked as the number 24 point guard in New York State by MaxPreps.com, she was All-WNY Player of the Year and All-WNY First Team. Parker was also named Female Athlete of the Year at Cardinal O'Hara, and garnered Monsignor Martin Player of the Year honors as well. So far in 2018, she is averaging 14.0 points, 4.3 assists, and 6.7 steals per game for the Lady Hawks.

"Angel brings more speed and quickness to our back court," quoted Jaques. "She is an explosive point guard with the ability to break down defenders and get in the lane at will. As a member of I90 AAU program and Cardinal O'Hara High School, Siena fans will enjoy watching her continued success in Green and Gold."

Hauer, a forward from Seton Catholic in Binghamton, is a former high school teammate of current Saint and freshman Hanna Strawn. Hauer, the 15th ranked forward in the state of New York according to MaxPreps.com, is entering her senior year at Seton, where she has been an All-State, All-Region, and Sectional All-Star for the Saints. She also earned Josh Palmer MVP honors as a sophomore, and earned a sportsmanship award to her resume last season. Hauer was a staple in the team's state semifinals appearance, where Seton fell to Jamesville-DeWitt in the Class A bracket.

"Julia is a tremendous basketball player," stated Jaques. "She is one of the most competitive players I've ever had the chance to recruit, and that is saying a lot. She understands how to score the basketball and leaves a lasting impression on whoever she plays against. She is another home grown talent coming from Seton Catholic High School and BNY AAU program. I can't wait to coach her."

Jaques added, "These two players fit Siena College beautifully. They are extremely high academic young women who come from championship programs and will be contributing members of our campus community. Our Assistant Coaches did a tremendous job in signing this class."

The Last Time . . .

Siena scored 100 points in a game: Siena defeated Rider 103-69 on Jan. 13, 2003.

Siena allowed 100 points in a game: No. 14/13 Syracuse defeated the Saints, 102-65, on Nov. 9, 2016 in Syracuse, NY.

Siena scored between 90-99: Siena scored between 90-99: Siena defeated Monmouth, 91-86, in double overtime on Jan. 28, 2017 in West Long Branch, NJ.

Siena won an overtime game: Siena defeated Canisius on the road on Feb. 22, 2019 by a final score of 78-66. The Saints used a 26 point day from Sabrina Piper. It would be the Saints third OT win during the season.

Siena lost an overtime game: The Saints fell, 56-54 in overtime to Monmouth at the ARC on Feb. 9, 2019.

Siena held an opponent to 40 points or fewer: The Saints held Saint Peter's to shooting just 23.2 percent from the floor in a 70-36 Senior Day win on Feb. 25, 2018 at the ARC.

Siena was held to 40 points or fewer: Siena was stifled in a 67-38 loss to Quinnipiac on Mar. 2, 2019. It would be the fourth time in 2018-19 season that the Saints would fail to convert 40-plus points.

Siena won by more than 30 points: The Saints defeated Saint Peter's, 70-36, on Feb 25, 2018 in Loudonville.

Siena lost by more than 30 points: Siena fell to #14/13 Syracuse, 102-65, on Nov. 14, 2016, in Syracuse, NY. The Saints have lost by more than 30 points six times in the Ali Jaques era, including four two teams ranked or receiving votes in the AP Top 25.

Five Siena players scored in double figures: Five of Siena's nine active players reached double figures in the Saints' 81-65 win at Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 30, 2015 in Hackensack, N.J. It marked the second time in 15 games that five Saints had reached double figures, after Siena had gone the previous 251 games without doing so (Jan. 29, 2007).

Siena grabbed more than 50 rebounds in a game: Siena out-rebounded Saint Peter's to open conference play on Jan. 4, 2019. The Saints grabbed exactly 50 rebounds, collecting a rebounding margin of +27, their biggest margin since a Nov. 27, 2015 win at Navy.

A Siena player scored 30 or more points in a game: Junior Sabrina Piper had a career night when she dropped 30 points on the Colgate Raiders in a Siena 55-53 win at the ARC on Nov. 29, 2018. Piper was 10-for-15 from the field, including a 4-for-6 clip from three-point range.

A Siena player recorded 20 or more rebounds in a game: Heather Stec pulled down 23 rebounds on Jan. 21, 2007 at Saint Peter's. She came up one rebound shy of the program record (24) set by Melanie Halker '97 on Feb. 23, 1997.

A Siena player had 10 or more assists in a game: Ida Krogh became the first Saint since Liga Alpe-Luka on Nov. 10, 2007 to post a double-digit assist game with a 10-assist performance in a 62-55 win over Manhattan Jan. 13, 2013 at the Times Union Center.

Siena failed to convert a free-throw: On Dec. 4, 2006 Siena went 0-3 from the line at #1 Maryland.

Siena failed to convert a 3-pointer: Fifth seeded Siena missed all 13 of its three-point attempts in a 64-47 loss to top seed Quinnipiac in the MAAC Semifinals on Mar. 8, 2015 at the Times Union Center. It marked the first time in 118 games that the Saints had failed to make a three-pointer, dating back to a 67-53 loss at North Carolina A&T Nov. 25, 2011.

A Siena opponent failed to convert a 3-pointer: Saint Peter's went 0-for-8 from beyond the arc in a 57-40 victory by the Saints on Feb. 19, 2011 at the Yanitelli Center in Jersey City, N.J. It marked the first time in 10 years that Siena held its opponent without a three since Marist went 0-for-9 from distance on Feb. 17, 2001.

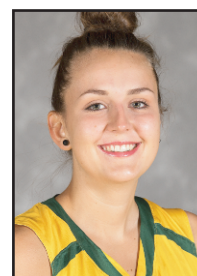
