Last Meeting vs. Iona

The Siena Saints saw their season come to an end in the 2018-19 season as the seventh-seeded Saints fell to the tenth-seeded Iona Gaels by a final score of 75-64 in the First Round of the MAAC Basketball Championship at the Times Union Center. Redshirt senior Aaliyah Jones led the Green and Gold with an 18-point performance.

Jones led the Saints in points, rebounds with five, and steals with six. Redshirt senior Joella Gibson also filled the stat sheet with 11 points, a team-high three assists, and five steals. Senior Deja Rawls tossed in 17 points behind four three-pointers.

In just seven seasons Ali Jaques has put Siena Women's Basketball back on the map. Under her leadership the Saints enter the 2019-20 season ready to bounce back and take on the MAAC after years of back-to-back third place picks in the MAAC Preseason Coaches Poll in 17-18 and 18-19.

Now entering her eighth season, Jaques has compiled a 101-119 (.459) overall record including a 64-70 (.478) mark in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. Prior to their success a couple season ago, the Saints recorded 13 conference wins for the most victories since 2003-04 following a MAAC Preseason third place pick.

In 2017-18, Jaques helped collect the program's highest overall win total since 2014-15, when her Saints won 22 games and advanced to the championship game of the Women's Basketball Invitational. Siena won 17 games, and advanced to the MAAC semifinals.

Jaques guided the Saints to a 22-13 overall record during the 2014-15 season which marked the program's first winning season in 11 years and most victories in a dozen seasons. Siena's 13-win improvement from the previous season was tied for the second best turnaround in all of Division I and the Saints' 12 true road wins were tied for the fourth most nationally. Additionally, for the third time in Jaques' first three seasons, the Saints won their MAAC Tournament opener as the lower seeded team.

Siena was rewarded for its success with a trip to the Women's Basketball Invitational and became the first school in MAAC history to win three games in a national postseason tournament and advance to the championship game. The Saints defeated Big East foe Xavier in the quarterfinals in Cincinnati by 20 points, marking the program's largest margin of victory ever over a current member of one of the six major conferences (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12, SEC).

QUICK HITS



- - Siena return to action on Thursday night as they will square off with the Iona Gaels at the newly renovated Hynes Center. The Saints have won four of the last five matchups with the Gaels.
- Siena's one loss in the previous five matchups was their latest, as they Gaels knocked the Saints out of the 2019 MAAC Tournament in the opening round by a 75-64 final.
- In their last 10 matchups, the Saints have edged the Gaels 6-4 in those games.
- The Saints have a 17.0 average margin of victory over the Gaels in their four wins prior to their loss in the MAAC Tournament last season.
- This matchup between the Gaels and Saints will be the latest point in any season they will face off in either program's history. The previous late date for games between these two would come on Feb. 18 four times, with the last matchup coming back in 1995-96. The other previous years were 1992-93, 1980-81, and 1979-80. Thursday's matchup will set the new "record" by two days.
- Dating back to last season, the Saints are 0-4 in their last four games at the Times Union Center. That streak extended out with a loss to Marist on Sunday afternoon despite a lead at halftime.
- The Saints had a five-game winning streak snapped by Rider last Thursday night. The Saints had defeated Monmouth, Niagara, and Canisius in three straight games, all at home. Then the Saints topped Manhattan and Quinnipiac on the road before getting the streak snapped by the Broncs.
- Prior to their loss to the Broncs on Thursday, the Saints were coming off their first-ever victory as a program over the Quinnipiac Bobcats by a final score of 68-60. The Green and Gold defeated the Bobcats on the road in Hamden, and would be the first win in program history over the program in 15 tires.
- Sophomore Lala Watts has now entered the Top 10 list for blocked shots in a single season. She is currently tied for third all-time with Gunta Basko's 2001-02 season total with 49. She is two blocks away from pulling into a tie with Serena Moore's
- In addition, Watts ranks first in the MAAC in blocked shots, currently averaging 2.1 blocks per game. She is the only player in the MAAC averaging over two blocks per game, as Rider's Amari Johnson ranks second with 36 total blocks and a 1.6 blocks per game average. Watts' 49 blocked shots rank 32nd in the NCAA, while her 2.1 blocks per game ranks 32nd in the country.
- Head Coach Ali Jaques needs just eight more wins to top former head coach Joe Hogan to become the second most winningest coach in program history.
- Siena led Manhattan wire to wire in their last matchup as the Jaspers did not hold a lead. The Green and Gold have led wire to wire in five of their eight victories this season. Both UAlbany (12/7), Niagara (1/30), and Quinnipiac (2/8) each held leads at various points in their matchups.
- Senior Sabrina Piper has now dipped under 100 points until 1,000 career points, standing at 56 total points until the landmark. The Paris, France native has the chance to be Siena's 29th player on the list. She will be the latest since both Kollyns Scarbrough and current Director of Basketball Operations Meghan Donohue each eclipsed the mark in 2016-17.
- Siena is currently 0-5 against teams in the Top 100 RPI. That includes Rider twice (100). The list also includes Colgate (82), Penn (86), and Marist (65).
- The Saints 29-point victory over the Canisius Golden Griffins at home was the Green and Gold's largest margin of victory in a game since they defeated Saint Peter's 70-36 back on Feb. 25, 2018 on Senior Day. Both games were played in the Alumni Recreation Center.
- Sophomore Amari Anthony notched a career-high 22 points in the commanding victory over Canisius. Anthony went 8-for-14 from the floor, including five three pointers.
- Sophomore Lala Watts has been a steady rock in the post as of late, as she recorded her first collegiate double-double last Thursday night. She scored 10 points with 11 rebounds and five blocks on the night.
- Watts is also coming off a record-breaking performance against Monmouth, as she set a new Siena single-game record with eight total blocks back on Jan. 23. She broke the previous record of seven blocks, which was done four times (Katy Sturgis, Kathy Kaczowski - 1990, Maggie Ward - 1990, Maddie Sims - 2019)
- Additionally, 12 total blocks as a team against Monmouth, the Saints also had the most blocks in a game since Jan. 20, 1990 in a 69-59 win against Boston University at home in the ARC.
- Also only giving up 39 points to the Hawks, the Saints held a team to under 40 points for the first time since Feb. 25, 2018 when the Green and Gold defeated Saint Peter's in the ARC 70-36. The Saints held the Peacocks to just 23.2 percent shooting in that game, while the held the Hawks to just 23.9 percent from the field.
- Head Coach Ali Jaques won her 100th game as a head coach last season on Feb. 16, 2019 in a 67-61 win over Niagara. All of her wins as a head coach have come at Siena.
- The Saints saw a near triple-double from senior Sabrina Piper, who snagged a season-high 12 rebounds along with nine points and nine assists at Niagara earlier this season
- Freshman Julia Hauer received the Saints first weekly honor when she was named MAAC Rookie of the Week on Jan. 13. The Binghamton, NY native averaged 12.0 points, 5.3 rebounds, and 2.7 assists per game. She topped out with a new career-high 17 points, adding five rebounds as well at Saint Peter's last Monday.
- As a team, the Saints snagged 21 offensive rebounds at Niagara. That total would be the most rebounds in a game by the team since they nabbed 26 in a 59-58 OT loss at Army back on Nov. 27, 2011. In total that game, the Saints scooped 63 total rebounds.
- Siena went 0-4 to start conference play for the first time since ever, and it is the most since 2014-15 when they began the MAAC slate 0-3. That season, the Saints would also lose to Fairfield then Quinnipiac, and then lose the third game to Marist. Siena would make their run with the "Magnificent 7" later in the season en route to the WBI title game where they would fall to Louisiana-Lafayette. That team would finish the season 22-13 overall with an 11-9 mark in the MAAC.
- The Saints had never begun a MAAC Schedule 0-4 in their history as a program. The Saints just broke their longest MAAC losing streak since 2016 (nine losses), losing eight in a row up until their victory over Canisius.
- With Piper's 12 rebounds and Amari Anthony's 10 rebounds, their Jan. 9 game at Niagara was the first game this season Siena had two players in double-figure rebounds. Anthony's 10 rebounds were the second time she eclipsed double-digits boards in her career.
- Senior Sabrina Piper scored a season-high 24 points against Saint Peter's on Jan. 6. Piper has now scored in double-figures in all but two of Siena's matchups with season. She also leads the team in all offensive categories and sits 177 points away from 1,000 career points.
- With her appearance against Fairfield on Jan. 2, Piper also eclipsed the 100 games mark for her career. If she appears in every game the rest of the season for Siena, she will land fifth all-time on the games played list.
- After back-to-back years of being picked to finish third on the MAAC, the Saints fell this season as they were picked to finish 10th of 11 teams in the MAAC Preseason Coaches Poll. They would chorale 33 points in the poll.
- Junior Marilena Gerostergiou snagged 15 rebounds against UAlbany, which was the most rebounds in a single game by a Siena Saint since Emmanuella Edoka snagged 17 against Sacred Heart on Dec. 17 2017.
- Gerostergiou's total rebounds against UAlbany are the second most in a single game this season of all MAAC programs.
- The Saints sold out The Crosstown Showdown, reaching a capacity crowd of 2,178 fans in the Alumni Recreation Center. It was the first sell out in the new seating configuration in the ARC, and the seventh largest crowd in the building's history.
- Prior to Siena's game at Colgate, Rayshel Brown became immediately eligible to suit up for the Saints after being granted a legislative relief waiver by the NCAA. The Staten Island, NY native averaged 5.6 points and 2.3 rebounds during her first two seasons at La Salle.
- Freshman Julia Hauer became the second freshman in as many years to record a double-double for the season, joining Amari Anthony's 12-10 performance from last season at Howard. She would record her double-double in a strong effort over Sacred Heart.
- Hauer sank 11 points in her collegiate debut versus Binghamton back on Nov. 5. Her total was the most points in a collegiate debut since Margot Hertzke scored 29 against Buffalo on Nov. 14, 2014, in a 58-50 Siena win.
- Siena is competing in its 46th season in program history and 37th at the NCAA Division I level in 2019-20.



2020-21 Siena Women's Basketball Signees

The Siena Saints women's basketball program and head coach Ali Jaques inked two student-athletes to NLI's during the NCAA early signing period beginning on Wednesday, as Ahniysha Jackson and Chantell Gonzalez have each committed to playing for the Green and Gold starting in the fall of 2020. The duo are the first signees of the class.

"We are excited to sign two very unique young ladies to the Siena women's basketball family," said Jaques. "Ahniysha is someone we have had our eye on ever since she attended our summer camp when I was first hired here, and Chantell has god given gifts that many people on this earth do not have."

Jackson, an Albany High School product, made Times Union second-team all-area and first team all-league from the Suburban Council Season Awards last year as a junior. Also referred to by the nickname Baby, she averaged 17 points per game to lead Albany to the Section II Class AA semifinals, where they fell to Saratoga High School. The 5-8 guard is the 49th ranked guard in New York State according to MaxPreps.com.

"As she progressed through high school and AAU she developed on the defensive end of the court, and it became obvious she would be a great fit for our program," added Jaques on Jackson. "Baby and her family really value what it means to be at Siena. Signing a local player with her work ethic, toughness, and character is important. Hopefully she will inspire more local players like her to want to be Saints!"

Gonzalez, a 6-8 center, comes to Loudonville from Miami Country Day school in Florida, the No. 1-ranked girls' basketball team in the nation last season according to ESPN.com. She would average 4.3 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks for the Spartans. She would help the squad to the Class 4A Championship, the sixth straight title the Spartans have won, defeating Carrollwood Day School. In that game, Gonzalez would finish with six points, eight rebounds and five blocks. Her squad would travel to New York City this past April to partake in the Geico National High School basketball tournament.

Jaques said, "I cannot wait to get on the court with Chantell and help her work to be the player she wants to be. She comes from an extremely successful high school program, and after getting to know her through the recruiting process, we knew she would be a natural fit at Siena."

Brown Granted Waiver by NCAA, Eligible to Play

Siena Women's Basketball junior transfer Rayshel Brown has been granted a legislative relief waiver from the NCAA. The Staten Island, New York native is eligible to play immediately, and will have the remainder of this year and all of the 2020-21 season to exhaust her eligibility.

"We are grateful that Rayshel has been cleared," said head coach Ali Jaques. "She adds athleticism and depth to our back court and is an experienced scorer. We are happy to get her out on the floor this season."

Brown appeared in 40 games including 19 starts over her two seasons at La Salle, averaging 5.6 points and 2.3 rebounds spanning 18.1 minutes. She joins the Saints following a breakout sophomore season in which she averaged 8.3 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 1.6 steals over 21 games including 18 starts to garner PhillyCollegeSports.com Honorable Mention acclaim. Brown scored in double figures nine times this past season, including each of her final five games in which she averaged 13.8 points. She posted career-highs of 21 points and eight rebounds on Jan. 16 vs. George Washington.

A two-time Staten Island Advance All-Star, Brown also earned Second Team All-City honors her senior year after guiding Curtis High to the PSAL City Semifinals while averaging 13.5 points per game. She averaged double figures each of her final three years at Curtis, while totaling 1,062 varsity points.

Siena allowed 100 points in a game: No. 14/13 Syracuse defeated the Saints, 102-65, on Nov. 9, 2016 in Syracuse, NY.

Siena scored between 90-99: Siena scored between 90-99: Siena defeated Monmouth, 91-86, in double overtime on Jan. 28, 2017 in West Long Branch, NJ.

Siena won an overtime game: Siena defeated Canisius on the road on Feb. 22, 2019 by a final score of 78-66. The Saints used a 26 point day from Sabrina Piper. It would be the Saints third OT win during the season.

Siena lost an overtime game: The Saints fell, 68-61 in overtime to Niagara on the road on Jan. 9, 2020.

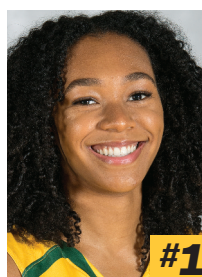
