## FASTBREAK POINTS

In its regular season opener, the Seahawks defeated Manhattan 63-60 in overtime.

In the opening frame, the Jaspers outscored the Seahawks 17-11. Despite being outscored, the Seahawks forced five turnovers along with four blocks.

Wagner put its foot on the gas in the second quarter when they outscored Manhattan 20-12 on 8-15 shooting from the floor. Wagner also shot 2-4 from three-point land in the frame.

Wagner shot 4-14 from the field in the third quarter while going 1-4 from three as the Wagner defense forced two turnovers.

In the fourth quarter, both teams traded chances as Wagner outscored Manhattan 14-11. With Wagner down 54-52, fifth year senior Kem Nwabudu hit a layup with 19 seconds remaining to tie the game at 54.

After the Seahawks tied it, they were able to stop the Jaspers and force overtime.

To open overtime, sophomore Lina Loceniece hit a three to give Wagner the advantage to start the period.

After Manhattan cut the Wagner lead to one, junior Marisa Sanchez Henry put Wagner up four. Down four, the Jaspers fought back to tie the game at 60 and the game remained deadlocked.

before senior Drayah Heyward scored on a layup to give Wagner a 62-60 advantage.

Kem Nwabudu split two free throws to give Wagner a 63-60 advantage with two seconds remaining, the Seahawks stopped the Jaspers on its final possession to preserve the win.

As a team, the Seahawks shot 8-19 from three-point range as Wagner's bench outscored Manhattan's 27-9.

Kem Nwabudu led the way for Wagner with 12 points and 11 rebounds in the contest while graduate student Zhaneia Thybulle had seven points and six assists.

## Milestone Watch

Fifth year senior Kem Nwabudu stands 16 points from the 1,000 point plateau.

The Elmont, NY native would become the 26th member of the 1,000 point club in Wagner women's basketball history.

She would join former teammate Emilija Krista Grava on the list, who tallied her 1,000th career point last season.

## Preseason Favorites

The Wagner women's basketball program was predicted to finish first in the league's annual preseason poll.

Selected by the league's head coaches as the 2022-23 NEC preseason favorite, Wagner has its sights set on claiming the NEC title, a feat that has only occurred just one other time, back in 1989. It marked the first time in 30-plus years — and quite possibly the first time in program history — that the Seahawks earned No. 1 preseason status.

The Seahawks, who came short of reaching the NEC Championship game a year ago after falling in the semifinals, earned five first-place votes to secure the moniker of "preseason favorite".

Behind Wagner is FDU, who received three first-place votes while St. Francis Brooklyn checked in third in the preseason poll. Behind the Terriers is Saint Francis U, who received one first-place vote.

Rounding out the rest of the preseason poll is Merrimack, Sacred Heart, LIU, Central Connecticut State and Stonehill.

The Seahawks have four starters and seven letter winners returning to the hardwood in 2022-23.

Graduate student Zhaneia Thybulle highlights a veteran-heavy group after a senior campaign that saw her average 10.1 points, 5.1 assists, 4.8 rebounds and 1.4 steals per game.

Wagner has been knocking on the doorstep of the NEC Championship game the last few seasons, led by second-year head coach Terrell Coburn.

The Seahawks are in prime position to live up to their preseason expectations. The returning core - which includes the likes of Zhaneia Thybulle (10.1 ppg), red-shirt junior Alex Cowan (9.4 ppg), fifth year senior Kem Nwabudu (8.5 ppg) and Drayah Heyward (5.4 ppg) accounted for 54% of Wagner's offense last season.

The Seahawks also return 2021 All-Rookie selection Lina Loceniece, who nabbed 20.0 minutes per game and shot 40.5% from the floor and 34.4% from three-point land.

## Zhaneia Thybulle Earns Preseason NEC Honors

Zhaneia Thybulle was named to the preseason All-Conference team.

The third team All-NEC selection and Preseason All-NEC pick dished out 5-or-more dimes 16 times last season and had a pair of 11-assist outings to add to her resumé.

Last season, Thybulle averaged 10.1 points per game, 4.8 rebounds per game, 5.1 assists per game, 1.4 steals per game, and a 40.6% field goal percentage.

Thybulle's assist average and 144 assists were tops in the NEC last season.

## The Returners

Wagner returns a veteran led group that is primed to make a deep playoff run this season.

Among the returners is Drayah Heyward, who led all NEC players with 2.3 steals per game and a total of 64 on the season.

The Seahawks return four players that made at least 20 starts last season and seven players who appeared in at least 20 games last season.

Among those players is Zhaneia Thybulle, Alex Cowan, Kem Nwabudu, Drayah Heyward, Lina Loceniece, Rakisha Ballinger and Marisa Sanchez-Henry.

## The Newcomers

Wagner will welcome five newcomers to the 2022-23 roster, including three transfers and two freshmen.

Among the transfers are sophomore Brittney-Shaina Etuka, Julia Fabozzi and Cyan Dyke.

Brittney Shaina Etuka comes to Wagner after spending one season at the University of Hartford. The Brampton, Ontario native appeared in 14 games for Hartford.

Julia Fabozzi comes to Grymes Hill after spending two years at Providence College.

The Staten Island, NY native appeared in 28 games for the Friars while averaging 2.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

Cyan Dyke comes to Wagner after spending two seasons at Furman University.

Dyke appeared in 11 games at Furman in two seasons.

Malia Mpondo and Angelie Ricard round out the newcomers for the Seahawks as the two freshmen on the roster.

## Defensive Mindset

Last season, the Seahawks were first in the NEC in three-point field goal % against at 26.1%. Nationally the Seahawks ranked 10th in three-point field goal % against.

The Seahawks were also first in steals with 248 and steals per game with 8.6

Wagner was also second in scoring defensive while allowing 58.2 points per contest. That mark put them 59th in the nation.

The Seahawks were second in the conference in turnover margin at +2.79.



A 38.0 field goal % defense put them 88th.

### Coburn's Success

In his first season leading the Seahawks, Coburn led the program to its fourth consecutive NEC postseason appearance.

Under Coburn, the Seahawks finished with 17 overall wins, the most wins by a first-year head coach in the history of the program.

Coach Coburn tied for the fifth most wins among all NCAA first-year head coaches and posted the seventh highest win %.

Wagner didn't waste time in getting their first victory under Coburn, as Wagner defeated NJIT 61-49 to open the Coburn era on November 9, 2021.

At season's end, the Seahawks had three All-NEC players and one All-Met player.

It marked the first time since the 1998-99 season that three different players were named to the All-NEC team.

Coburn won his first NEC tournament game on March 7 against LIU as the Seahawks earned a 66-55 victory at the Spiro Sports Center.

### The Schedule

The 12-game non-conference slate features seven road games and five games at the Spiro Sports Center.

Wagner's first official home game is slated for November 13 against Brown before Wagner hits the road on November 16 against Maryland Eastern Shore and Fordham on November 20.

After the two-game road trip, Wagner will welcome Hofstra on November 26 and Saint Peter's on December 1.

On December 5 the Seahawks will travel to New Hampshire before traveling to Syracuse on December 11.

The Seahawks' final non-conference home game will be against NJIT on December 17 before Wagner wraps up its non-conference slate at St. John's on December 21.

Wagner's 16-game NEC slate will begin on January 2 at Saint Francis U in Loretto, PA.

The Seahawks will then welcome Merrimack on January 6 and LIU on January 8 at the Spiro Sports Center. Last season, the Seahawks defeated LIU in the NEC quarterfinal, 66-55.

Wagner will hit the road three out of the next four games as they travel to Merrimack on January 16, Central Connecticut State on January 21, and St. Francis Brooklyn on January 26. In between that slate, Wagner will host NEC newcomer Stonehill in the first-ever matchup between the teams on January 19.

The Green & White then open a three-game homestand against Sacred Heart on February 2, Fairleigh Dickinson on February 4, and St. Francis Brooklyn on February 9.

The Seahawks will then take a short trip to Brooklyn to take on LIU on February 11 before hosting Central Connecticut State on February 16. Following the trip to Brooklyn, Wagner hits the road to take on Fairleigh Dickinson on February 16 before heading to Stonehill on February 23.

Wagner will host Saint Francis U in its final regular game at the Spiro Sports Center on February 25 before closing out the regular season at Sacred Heart on March 2.

The 2023 NEC Tournament will take place on March 6, March 9, and March 12.

### Scouting Iona

The Gaels will welcome Wagner in its 2022-23 season opener.

Iona was picked fifth in the MAAC preseason poll headlined by Juana Camillion who was named All-MAAC preseason First Team.

Ketsia Athias was picked to the All-MAAC preseason Second Team.

Last season, the Gaels finished 11-16 and were eliminated in the MAAC quarterfinals by top seeded Fairfield.

### What's Next for Wagner

The Seahawks will host Brown on Sunday, November 13 in its home opener at 5:30 P.M. at the Spiro Sports Center.

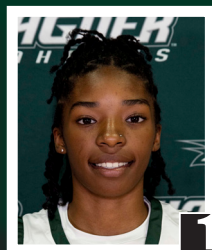

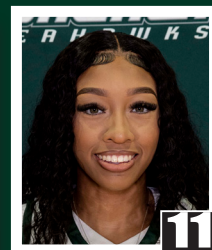

Wagner College President Joel W. Martin and Director of Athletics Walt Hameline announced the promotion of Terrell Coburn as Wagner's tenth head women's basketball coach back on April 27, 2021.

"Coach Coburn has earned this position through his leadership and unyielding commitment to the student athletes of Wagner College," President Martin commented. "I have attended many games and it has been a great joy to see the growth of Wagner Women's Basketball. I'm excited for its future under Head Coach Coburn."

"We are thrilled to announce that Terrell Coburn has been named the head women's basketball coach at Wagner," said Hameline. "In elevating Coach Coburn, we are continuing to build on the foundation that he has helped establish. He has an incredible work ethic, enthusiasm, and commitment to student-athlete development, both on and off the court. He will provide our program with great leadership and a strong vision."



Coburn, who becomes the first African American head coach in program history, has been a major contributor to the Seahawks' recent success, serving as an assistant coach over the past five seasons, where he oversaw the team's defensive strategies, opponent scouting, player development and recruiting efforts.

"I am extremely blessed and appreciative for the opportunity to lead the Wagner women's basket-



ball program," Coburn said. "Thank you to President Martin and Walt Hameline for entrusting me with this position. I would like to thank my family, friends, and mentors for their unwavering amounts of love and support. I am thrilled and excited to continue to build upon the foundation we have established and we will continue to grow as a team to reach new heights."

Coburn, the top assistant under Heather Jacobs, was instrumental in the turnaround of the women's basketball program. The Seahawks ranked in the top two in the Northeast Conference (NEC) in several statistical categories, while finishing 21st nationally in turnovers forced, as the Wagner defense created 19.8 opponent mishaps per contest this season.

Inheriting a team that won ten games in two seasons, Jacobs led the Seahawks to three consecutive NEC Tournament berths in the last three seasons. This year, Wagner clinched the No. 2 seed and played for the league title for the first time in nearly 20 years.

Coach Coburn has been a driving force of improvement for several Seahawks, most notably Emiliya Krista Grava, who was named to her second straight All-NEC First Team this past season. Krista Grava finished third in league scoring (14.3 ppg) and among the top-20 in rebounding (5.6 rpg). In addition to Krista Grava, Khaleah Edwards and Kem Nwabudu were among the top-25 in scoring, while Zhaneia Thybulle finished second in the conference in assists, averaging nearly 5.0 helpers per game.

Coburn began his coaching journey as a graduate assistant before moving into a director of player development role at his alma mater, the University of Central Arkansas. In his two seasons with the Sugar Bears, the team went a combined 42-22, while qualifying for the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) in 2011.

Following his time at Central Arkansas, Coburn accepted an assistant coaching position at Long Island University, where he spent five seasons.



While at LIU, the Blackbirds qualified for the NEC Tournament in four of the five seasons while notching the biggest win in program history, defeating Big 12 member, Oklahoma State.

A large part of the Blackbirds success was thanks to the recruiting efforts by Coburn. In 2013 and 2014, LIU ranked among the nation's top-50 recruiting classes, according to Dan Olsen's Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. Coburn targeted student-athletes from California, Florida, Texas, New Jersey and New York to attend the Downtown Brooklyn institution.

Before accepting the assistant coaching position at Wagner, Coburn was on the sidelines as an assistant at ASA College in Downtown Brooklyn. There he helped guide the Avengers to a 22-4 record in 2015-16. ASA reached the Elite Eight of the NJCAA National tournament that season.

In his first season as head coach, Coburn earned his first victory in his first ever game as a head coach on November 9, 2021 at NJIT.

After winning four out of the first five games in the 2021-22 season, Coburn guided the Seahawks to a NEC Tournament appearance. Coburn notched his first NEC Tournament victory on March 7 against LIU at the Spiro Sports Center.

Under Coburn's guidance, Emilia Kriska, Grava earned First Team All-NEC honors along with Third Team All-Met honors. Zhaneia Thybulle was named Third Team All-NEC while Lina Loceniece was named to the NEC All-Rookie Team.

With 16 regular season wins in his first season, Coburn finished sixth in the nation in wins for a first-year head coach. As a team, Wagner finished tenth in the nation in three point field goal percentage against.

ASSISTANT COACH

Alycia Gervais embarks on her second season on the Wagner women's basketball staff in 2022-23.

Gervais came to Wagner College following a three-year stint as the head coach of the Dean College Bulldogs in Franklin, MA. She took over the program that was transiting from a junior college to an NCAA Division III program as a member of the New England Collegiate Conference (NECC).

Under Gervais' guidance, the Bulldogs made two consecutive trips to the NECC Tournament while combining for 39 wins. In their first season in the NECC in 2017-18, Dean tied for the regular-season title with a 12-2 record in league contests.

Gervais was instrumental in the development of several student-athletes during her time at Dean. She coached Makayla Rudder and India Pina, who both went on to eclipse the 1,000-point threshold while earning First Team All-NECC honors and USCAA All-America accolades in 2018-19. Alexah Rudder paced the NECC in blocks as well.

Before accepting the position at Dean, Gervais spent two seasons as the head coach at Pine Manor College in Chestnut Hill, MA. Under her leadership, the Gators went to back-to-back American Collegiate Athletic Association (ACAA) championship games with the 2017-18 finals contested on Pine Manor's home court.

Erica Jones led the Gators offense and Shaquanda Middleton, who both netted their 1,000 career points in 2017-18, as both players excelled in Coach Gervais' up-tempo style of play as the team averaged more than 70.0 points per contest.

Before her stint with Pine Manor, she was the assistant coach at the University of Virginia College at Wise. Gervais was instrumental in laying the foundation for what turned out to be a team that went 21-11 and advancing to the Mountain East Conference semifinals in 2016-17.

Gervais began her collegiate coaching career at Adelphi University in 2012 under former Wagner head women's coach, Heather Jacobs. While with the Panthers, Gervais helped lead the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in more than a decade in 2013-14 as well as etching their name on the USA Today Sports Division II National Top-25 Poll.

Gervais was a standout four-year letterwinner at Daniel Webster College in Nashua, NH. Among her athletic accolades include being selected as a two-time All-Region selection by D3Hoops.com, a two-time NECC Conference Player of the Year (2011, 2012), and a four-time all-conference honoree, who led the Eagles to the program's first-ever NECC Tournament Championship and NCAA Tournament berth in 2011.

In addition to being a standout on the hardwood, Gervais spent four seasons as a member of the Eagles' cross-country team, serving as captain for two years and played a season of softball (2011) and soccer (2012).

A former highly-decorated four-year letter winner at Daniel Webster College in Nashua, N.H., Gervais is a two-time all-region selection by D3Hoops.com, a two-time NECC Conference Player of the Year (2011, 2012) and four-time all-conference honoree who led the Eagles to the program's first-ever NECC Tournament Championship and subsequent NCAA Tournament berth (2011).

In addition to her basketball exploits, Gervais spent four seasons as a member of the Eagles' cross-country team, serving as captain for two years. She also played a season of softball (2011) and soccer (2012). Away from the playing field, Gervais was a four-year member of the Daniel Webster's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) and was a two-time recipient of the College's Female Student-Athlete of the Year award (2011, 2012).

In December 2020, Gervais was named to the Noontime Sports All-Decade Team as well as the New Hampshire Division III Women's Basketball All-Decade team.

Gervais graduated from Daniel Webster with a degree in Sport Management and earned her Master's degree in Sport Management from Adelphi in 2014.

Carter, a native of Queens, NY, concluded her first season at Division III member, John Carroll University, as the Blue Streaks posted a 23-5 overall record and a 15-2 mark in the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC). John Carroll reached the OAC Championship game this past season and earned a bid to the NCAA Division III National Championship as they advanced to the second round.

In addition to John Carroll's success on the court, the Blue Streaks finished as the No. 7 ranked team in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) 2021-22 Academic Top-25, and Carter was selected to participate at the WBCA Final Four Convention this past year. She previously attended the convention in 2018 when she was a senior at Michigan State University.

Carter previously coached at St. Xavier's University, an NAIA institution in Chicago, IL. Serving as an assistant coach would assist with the day-to-day operations as well as help with individual skill development. On the court, she was directly responsible for offensive breakdown drills.

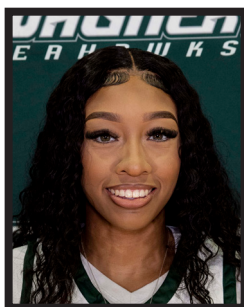
