Last Time Out

Wagner dropped its fourth consecutive contest to begin the season with a 63-46 loss at Northeastern on November 21.

Junior Semie Brar notched a career-high 23 points on 9-13 shooting from the floor and 5-8 shooting from three-point range.

Freshman Kiera Edmonds chipped in with nine points and seven rebounds in the contest for the Green & White.

Defense Continues To Impress

Wagner's 11.0 steals per contest is good for 56th in the nation.

Junior Rakisha Ballinger ranks first in the NEC and

63rd nationally with 2.75 steals per contest.

Relentless On The Boards

Wagner's 13.2 offensive rebounds ranks first in the NEC and 142nd in the nation.

Freshman Kiera Edmonds' 7.5 rebounds per contest ranks first in the NEC.

Semie Brar's Emergence

Semie Brar tallied 23 points at Northeastern, a career-high and a team-high through the first four games of the season.

Brar is the first Seahawk to score at least 20 points since Julia Fabozzi tallied 20 at Stonehill on February 23, 2023.

The Fresno, CA native's 23 points is the highest point

total since Alex Cowan tallied 26 points against St. Francis Brooklyn on February 9, 2023.

Brar's five three-pointers is the most in a contest since Lina Locieniece launched five against New Hampshire on November 28, 2021.

Brar leads the Seahawks with 10.0 points per game.

Back Home

After beginning the 2023-24 season with four consecutive road games, Wagner will welcome lona for its home opener at the Spiro Sports Center.

Following their contest with lona, Wagner will welcome Navy on November 30.

Scouting Iona

lona comes to the Spiro Sports Center with a 1-3 record this season.

lona's lone victory came against NEC member LIU on November 12 as the Gaels earned an 80-59 victory.

The Gaels were selected seventh in the MAAC preseason poll, lona captured the MAAC title last season.

The Gaels return seven players from the 2023 MAAC Championship squad including top returning scorers in graduate Natalia Otkhmezuri, junior Judith Gomez and sophomore Noa Givon.

The Series

Wagner has lost six consecutive contests to lona and is 1-6 in the all-time series.

Last season, Iona defeated Wagner 87-62. Wagner's last win against Iona came back in 2003.

No Stranger To The NEC

After four seasons at FDU, Iona head coach Angelika Szumilo led the Knights two back-to-back NEC regular season titles in 2022-23 and 2023-24.

Szumilo was also named the NEC Brenda Reilly Coach of the Year the two seasons the Knights captured the NEC regular season crown.

Szumilo brings 2022-23 All-NEC Second Team performer Sierra DeAngelo, DeAngelo tallied 13.4 points per game in NEC contests last season.

Szumilo also brings Ella Fajardo to Iona from FDU, Fajardo tallied 7.8 points per

game on 38.8 percent shooting from three-point range.

Seahawks Claim Third In NEC Preseason Poll

The NEC head coaches picked the Seahawks to finish third in the league behind defending champion Sacred Heart. Merrimack was picked second in the poll.

Sacred Heart was a unanimous choice to claim the NEC crown.

This is the third consecutive season the Seahawks have been picked in the top-three of the NEC preseason poll. The Seahawks were picked second ahead of the 2021-22 season before being named preseason favorites ahead of last season.

Success Under Coburn

In his first season leading the Seahawks during the 2021-22 season, Coburn led the program to its fourth consecutive NEC postseason appearance.

Under Coburn, the Seahawks finished with 17 overall wins, the most wins by a first-year head coach in the history of the program.

Coach Coburn tied for the fifth most wins among all NCAA first-year head coaches and posted the seventh highest win % during his first season at the helm.

Wagner didn't waste time in getting their first victory under Coburn, as Wagner defeated NJIT 61-49 to open the Coburn era on November 9, 2021.

At season's end, the Seahawks had three All-NEC players and one All-Met player.

It marked the first time since the 1998-

99 season that three different players were named to the All-NEC team.

Coburn won his first NEC tournament game on March 7, 2022 against LIU as the Seahawks earned a 66-55 victory at the Spiro Sports Center.

Last season, the Seahawks were chosen first overall in the NEC preseason poll. Wagner started 6-0 in NEC play for the first time in program history.

Coburn oversaw the development of Alex Cowan and Zhaneia Thybulle.

Cowan was named Second Team All-NEC. She finished the regular season averaging 14.0 points per game, good for fifth in the NEC. Cowan also averaged 15.6 points per game in NEC play while scoring in double figures in 20 out of 27 contests last season.

Zhaneia Thybulle joined elite company last season as the sixth player to earn All-NEC honors in consecutive seasons.

Thybulle finished the season with 4.2 assists per game, good for first in the NEC and 91st in the nation.

New Faces On The Sidelines

Wagner's coaching staff for the 2023-24 season consists of two new faces. Alexis Lloyd joins the Wagner staff after three seasons at Texas Southern from 2019-2022. Lloyd worked under Basketball Hall of Famer Cynthia Cooper.

Jasmine Brunson also joins the Seahawks staff as a director of basketball operations.

Rounding out the assistant coaches for Wagner is Alycia Gervais and TiAna Jones. This will be the third season on Grymes Hill for Gervais and the second for Jones.

The Returners

The Seahawks feature returners Rakisha Ballinger, Brittney-Shania Etuka, Malia Mpondo, Marisa Sanchez-Henry, Angelie Ricard, Julia Fabozzi, and Cyan Dyke.

Julia Fabozzi appeared in all 28 games while making 17 starts. The Staten Island, NY native averaged 7.2 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. four starts.

Rakisha Ballinger appeared in 24 contests while making four starts. Ballinger averaged 1.1 steals per game and 0.5 blocks per contest.

Marisa Sanchez Henry and Malia Mpondo appeared in 21 games, Angelie Ricard appeared in all 28 games, and Cyan Dyke appeared in 19 games last season.

The Newcomers

Wagner's newcomers include Taleah Washington, Semie Brar, Paige Lyons, Shamique Cummings, Drew Jordon, Kiera Edmonds, Maite Lara Garcia, and Lijirin Doyinsola Modesayor.

Taleah Washington comes to Wagner after stops at Syracuse and Old Dominion. At Syracuse, Washington appeared in 24 contests.

At Old Dominion, Washington appeared in 39 games while making two starts during the 2021-22 season.

Semie Brar comes to Wagner after transferring from JUCO Laney College. She averaged 19.2 points per game on 49.4 shooting from the field and 39.4 shooting from three. Semie also averaged 4.7 assists per game while being named CCCWBCA All-State.

Paige Lyons comes to Wagner after

spending two seasons at East Carolina. As a freshman, Lyons appeared in 14 contests.

At Detroit Mercy during the 2022-23 season, Maite Lara Garcia saw action in 26 games off the bench. She tallied a season-high 11 points against NIU on November 22, 2022.

The Schedule

Wagner's 13-game non-conference slate consists of five games at the Spiro Sports Center and one exhibition contest...

Following its first home stand of the season, Wagner will hit the road on December 6 to Take on Saint Peter's before playing at Columbia on December 10.

Wagner will host Maryland Eastern Shore on December 16 before traveling to Philadelphia, PA to play against UAB on December 20 and Saint Joseph's on December 21 at the Saint Joseph's Tournament.

Wagner will wrap up non-conference play at the Spiro Sports Center on December 30 when they welcome Saint Elizabeth.

The Seahawks will open the conference portion of its schedule on Saturday, January 6 in Loretto, PA against Saint Francis U. This is the second consecutive season Wagner will open NEC play at Saint Francis U.

The Seahawks will then host their first conference contest against LIU on Monday, January 8 at the Spiro Sports Center.

Five days later, Wagner will again hit the road and will travel to Easton, MA to take on Stonehill on Monday, January 15.

Following the trip to Stonehill, Wagner will host three consecutive NEC opponents. The home stand will begin against Merrimack on Friday, January 19. The Seahawks will then play host to Sacred Heart on Sunday, January 21.

The home stand will end on Saturday, January 27 as the Seahawks welcome Central Connecticut State.

Wagner will begin the month of February with its first contest at NEC newcomer Le Moyne on Thursday, February 1 before hosting Stonehill on Saturday, February 3.

The Seahawks will travel to Teaneck, NJ on Friday, February 9 to take on Fairleigh Dickinson before hosting Saint Francis U on Thursday, February 15.

Following the contest against Saint
Francis U, Wagner will begin a stretch of
three consecutive road games beginning on Saturday, February 17 at Sacred
Heart. Wagner will then travel back to
Connecticut to take on Central Connecticut State on Thursday, February 22.

The Green & White will wrap up the stretch at LIU on Saturday, February 24.

Wagner will host its final two home games of the regular season against Le Moyne on Thursday, February 29 and Saturday, March 2 against Fairleigh Dickinson.

Wagner will wrap up the 2023-24 regular season at Merrimack on Thursday,
March 7.

TERRELL COBURN

HEAD COACH

Terrell Coburn became the first African American head coach in program history ahead of the 2021-22 season. Prior to be named head coach, Coburn was an assistant coach on Grymes Hill for five seasons.

"I am extremely blessed and appreciative for the opportunity to lead the Wagner women's basketball program," Coburn said. "Thank you to Walt Hameline for entrusting me with this position. I would like to thank my family, friends, and mentors for their unwavering amounts of love and support. I am thrilled and excited to continue to build upon the foundation we have

established and we will continue to grow as a team to reach new heights."

Coburn began his coaching journey as a graduate assistant before moving into a director of player development role at his alma mater, the University of Central Arkansas. In his two seasons with the Sugar Bears, the team went a combined 42-22, while qualifying for the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) in 2011.

Following his time at Central Arkansas, Coburn accepted an assistant coaching position at Long Island University, where he spent five seasons.

While at LIU, the Blackbirds qualified for the NEC Tournament in four of the five seasons while notching the biggest win in program history, defeating Big 12 member, Oklahoma State.

A large part of the Blackbirds success was thanks to the recruiting efforts by Coburn. In 2013 and 2014, LIU ranked among the nation's top-50 recruiting classes, according to Dan Olsen's Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. Coburn targeted student-athletes from California, Florida, Texas, New Jersey and New York to attend the Downtown Brooklyn institution.

Before accepting the assistant coaching position at Wagner, Coburn was on the sidelines as an assistant at ASA College in Downtown Brooklyn. There he helped guide the Avengers to a 22-4 record in 2015-16. ASA reached the Elite Eight of the NJCAA National tournament that season.

In his first season as head coach, Coburn earned his first victory in his first ever game as a head coach on November 9, 2021 at NJIT. Coburn also led Wagner to one of the biggest wins in program history as they defeated St. John's 62-59 at the Spiro Sports Center on December 12, 2021.

After winning four out of the first five games in the 2021-22 season, Coburn guided the Seahawks to a NEC Tournament appearance. Coburn notched his first NEC Tournament victory on March 7 against LIU at the Spiro Sports Center.

Under Coburn's guidance, Emilja Krista Grava earned First Team All-NEC honors along with Third Team All-Met honors. Zhaneia Thybulle was named Third Team All-NEC while Lina Loceniece was named to the NEC All-Rookie Team.

With 16 regular season wins in his first season, Coburn finished sixth in the nation in wins for a first-year head coach. As a team, Wagner finished tenth in the nation in three point field goal percentage against.

Coach Coburn has been a driving force of improvement for several Seahawks, most notably Emilija Krista Grava, who was named to three-straight All-NEC First Teams.

In his first season at the helm of the Seahawks, Coburn led the Seahawk defense a top-10 finish nationally in three-point field goal percentage against. Along with the team's three-point percentage, the 2021-22 Seahawks defense finished 29th in the nation with 19.21 turnovers forced per game. Wagner finished 59th in the nation as they allowed 58.2 points per game during the 2021-22 season.

Wagner finished in the top-75 in the nation with a +2.79 turnover margin and 74th with 9.0 steals per game.

Along with Emilija Krista Grava, Coburn watched Zhaneia Thybulle earn back-to-back All-NEC Third Team honors as she finished first in the conference in assists during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons. Thybulle also finished 91st in the nation in assists per game in the 2022-23 season.

Coburn also saw the development of Alex Cowan, who was named All-NEC Second Team for the 2022-23 season, Cowan finished top-five in the NEC in scoring.

Coburn guided Wagner to a 6-0 start to begin NEC play during the 2022-23 season, the best conference start in program history.

During the 2022-23 season, Wagner finished the season 52nd nationally with 9.4 steals per game, 11th with 20.46 turnovers forced per game and 15th with a +5.54 turnover margin.

Coburn currently resides in Brooklyn with his wife, Geneen, his daughter, Taylor, and the newest addition to the Coburn family, his son, Taj.



ALYCIA GERVAIS

ASSISTANT COACH

Alycia Gervais embarks on her third season on the Wagner women's basketball staff in 2023.

Gervais came to Wagner College following a three-year stint as the head coach of the Dean College Bulldogs in Franklin, MA. She took over the program that was transiting from a junior college to an NCAA Division III program as a member of the New England Collegiate Conference (NECC).

Under Gervais' guidance, the Bulldogs made two consecutive trips to the NECC Tournament while combining for 39 wins. In their first season in the NECC in 2017-18, Dean tied for the regular-season title with a 12-2 record in league contests.

Gervais was instrumental in the development of several student-athletes during her time at Dean. She coached Makayla Rudder and lindia Pina, who both went on to eclipse the 1,000-point threshold while earning First Team All-NECC honors and USCAA All-America accolades in 2018-19. Alexah Rudder paced the NECC in blocks as well.

Before accepting the position at Dean, Gervais spent two seasons as the head coach at Pine Manor College in Chestnut Hill, MA. Under her leadership, the Gators went to back-to-back American Collegiate Athletic Association (ACAA) championship games with the 2017-18 finals contested on Pine Manor's home court.

Erica Jones led the Gators offense and Shaquanda Middleton, who both netted their 1,000 career points in 2017-18, as both players excelled in Coach Gervais' up-tempo style of play as the team averaged more than 70.0 points per contest.

Before her stint with Pine Manor, she was the assistant coach at the University of Virginia College at Wise. Gervais was instrumental in laying the foundation for what turned out to be a team that went 21-11 and advancing to the Mountain East Conference semifinals in 2016-17.

Gervais began her collegiate coaching career at Adelphi University in 2012 under former Wagner head women's coach, Heather Jacobs. While with the Panthers, Gervais helped lead the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in more than a decade in 2013-14 as well as etching their name on the USA Today Sports Division II National Top-25 Poll.

Gervais was a standout four-year letterwinner at Daniel Webster College in Nashua, NH. Among her athletic accolades include being selected as a two-time All-Region selection by D3Hoops.com, a two-time NECC Conference Player of the Year (2011, 2012), and a four-time all-conference honoree, who led the Eagles to the program's first-ever NECC Tournament Championship and NCAA Tournament berth in 2011.

In addition to being a standout on the hardwood, Gervais spent four seasons as a member of the Eagles' cross-country team, serving as captain for two years and played a season of softball (2011) and soccer (2012).

A former highly-decorated four-year letter winner at Daniel Webster College in Nashua, N.H., Gervais is a two-time all-region selection by D3Hoops.com, a two-time NECC Conference Player of the Year (2011, 2012) and four-time all-conference honoree who led the Eagles to the program's first-ever NECC Tournament Championship and subsequent NCAA Tournament berth (2011).

In addition to her basketball exploits, Gervais spent four seasons as a member of the Eagles' cross-country team, serving as captain for two years. She also played a season of softball (2011) and soccer (2012). Away from the playing field, Gervais was a four-year member of the Daniel Webster's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) and was a two-time recipient of the College's Female Student-Athlete of the Year award (2011, 2012).

In December 2020, Gervais was named to the Noontime Sports All-Decade Team as well as the New Hampshire Division III Women's Basketball All-Decade team.

Gervais graduated from Daniel Webster with a degree in Sport Management and earned her Master's degree in Sport Management from Adelphi in 2014.

ALEXIS LLOYD

ASSISTANT COACH

Alexis Lloyd was named assistant coach of the Wagner women's basketball team ahead of the 2023-24 season.

"I am thrilled to have Alexis join our staff," Coburn said. "She brings a relentless and substantial skill set to our program. She expresses and displays commitment relationships with our players, growth and winning mentality that will continue to enhance our program. I'm very excited to be working with her."

A graduate of the University of Southern California, Alexis played for the Trojans from 2014 to 2017. Prior to her time at USC, Alexis played her freshman season at Virginia Tech.

Prior to her collegiate career, Alexis was a four star, top-100 recruit by ESPN HoopGurlz out of Whitney Young High in Chicago, IL. She was ranked no. 81 overall and the no. 31 guard in the country.

Following graduation, Lloyd played professionally in Europe Malta Basketball Association. Following her playing career, Alexis joined the Texas Southern University under Basketball Hall of Famer Cynthia Cooper. Lloyd worked at Texas Southern from 2019 to 2022.

Alexis was also the Director of Rookie League (K5-12th grade boys & girls) at Showcase Basketball. At Showcase Basketball Alexis was responsible for organizing and managing operations of the league, leading all practices and games while leading with semi-private and group training sessions. He played a tremendous role in the development of members of the coaching apprenticeship.

Alexis also worked at DTermined Basketball Organization and was the head coach for players in the age range of 8 to 10. At DTermined, she organized and led practice sessions, led private and group workouts and organized travel and game plans.

JASMINE BRUNSON DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

Jasmine Brunson joined the Wagner College women's basketball staff as the Director of Basketball Operations in August 2023.

A graduate of the University of Minnesota, Brunson appeared in 122 games while making 70 starts. The Queens, NY native started 55 out of 59 over her last two seasons at Minnesota. As a junior during the 2018-19 season, Brunson averaged 8.4 points per game, 2.7 assists per game and 2.5 rebounds per game. As a senior, Brunson tallied 9.8 points per game, 3.0 assists per game and 2.5 rebounds per game.

A two-time captain, Brunson was named Minnesota's 2020 All-Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree twice. During her senior season, Brunson led the Big Ten in free throw percentage during conference play with a .875 mark. In the classroom, Brunson was an Academic All-Big Ten honoree twice.
