### GAELS VISIT BETHUNE-COOKMAN TO START ROAD SWING





Iona coming off its first win of the season in Sunday's home opener nows embark on a five-game road stretch. A matchup at Bethune-Cookman in Daytona Beach kicks off a two-game trip for the Gaels in Florida. Wednesday night is the second meeting all-time between the two schools with the Gaels earning a 60-57 win on December 13, 2022 in New Rochelle, NY.

#### SCOUTING THE GAELS

•The Gaels picked up their first win of the season with a 80-59 win over LIU in the home opener. Iona shot 56.6% from the field and 56.5% from downtown. As a team they connected on 13 three-pointers and assisted on 27 of 30 made field goals against the Sharks.

 Iona has won its last three home openers at the Hynes Athletic Center.

Petra Oborilova had a breakout performance for Iona, scoring a career-high 17 points on 6-of-8 shooting including five three-pointers along with career-high six boards.

 Natalia Otkhmezuri added 14 points and Judith Gomez and Sierra DeAngelo also finished in double figures with 13 and 11 points respectively. Gomez added five rebounds and a career-high six steals. Ella Fajardo recorded a near double-double with nine points and career-high 10 assists.

- Bethune-Cookman was selected to finish seventh in the SWAC preseason poll.
- The Wildcats have opened the 2023-24 season with a pair of road losses to UCF and Florida.

# **Head Coach**

### LIU Brooklyn 'O3 - First Season

Iona University women's basketball head coach Angelika Szumilo enters her first season at the helm of the program in 2023-24.

Szumilo joins the Maroon & Gold after a successful four-year tenure at Fairleigh Dickinson. In four seasons at the helm of the FDU program, Szumilo compiled a 72-45 overall record and a 50-20 mark in league play. She leaves as the second-winningest coach in program history.

She started her head coaching career in 2019-20 when she took the Knights from 8-22 the year prior to her arrival to a .500 record in league play and the program's first NEC Tournament victory since 1992. Szumilo guided the Knights back to a second consecutive NEC semifinal game in 2020-21 before capturing back-to-back NEC regular season championships in 2021-22 and 2022-23. She was awarded the NEC's Brenda Reilly Coach of the Year by her peers in both 2021-22 and 2022-23. The Knights were represented with 12 All-NEC honorees in her tenure including 2021-22 NEC Player of the Year honors by Madison Stanley.

Fairleigh Dickinson enjoyed its most decorated season in program history under Szumilo's tutelage in 2022-23, leading the entire nation in three-point percentage defense and finishing seventh in Division I in scoring defense. The Knights finished the season with a 24-8 overall record, a 14-2 mark in conference play, and earned a trip to the NEC Championship against Sacred Heart. Despite the championship game loss to SHU, FDU made a second consecutive trip to the WNIT, facing the eventual runner-up Columbia in the first round.

In 2021-22, the Knights recorded a program record 15 conference wins en route to winning the NEC regular season title for first time since 1992. FDU recorded 12 home wins on the season and held opponents to under 60 points a night. FDU played host to the conference semifinal for the first time in program history. Szumilo was named NEC Coach of the Year and led the Knights to the program's first-ever appearance in the WNIT, facing Seton Hall.

In her second season with the Knights in 2020-21, the Knights rolled to a 16-8 record, and a 12-6 conference record, earning the No. 4 seed in the NEC Tournament. The Knights finished the season winning their final seven regular season games, and won of eight of their last nine in conference play. FDU finished in the top four in back-to-back seasons for the first time since the 1991-92/1992-93 seasons. The Knights continued to play stout defense, allowing just 58.5 points per game.

Her first season with the Knights in 2019-20, Szumilo led the Knights to their first NEC Tournament victory since 1992 after posting a 9-9 conference record, which earned FDU the No. 3 seed in the NEC Tournament. The Knights hosted their first home NEC Tournament contest since 1997 and defeated Bryant 57-43. With the win over Bryant, that went down as the 10th NEC win of the year, which is the most since the 2003-04 season. Szumilo earned her first head coaching victory on December 10, 2019 with a 68-59 victory over NJIT. FDU finished the season 13-17 overall, which was a five-game improvement from the 2018-19 campaign.

Prior to arriving at Fairleigh Dickinson, Szumilo was an Associate Head Coach at Fordham University from 2011-19. During her time in the Bronx, the Rams won two Atlantic 10 Championships, made two NCAA tournament appearances, and enjoyed four trips to the WNIT. Szumilo also served as the recruiting coordinator with the Rams, helping recruit four first team All-A10 players and one A10 Defensive Player of the Year.

Szumilo came to Fordham from Monmouth University, where she was an assistant coach from 2008-10 before being promoted to associate head coach for the 2010-11 season. She helped the Hawks to the program's first 20-win season since 1983, culminating with a trip to the WNIT.

Szumilo's coaching career began at LIU Brooklyn, where she was a two-sport athlete (basketball and lacrosse). As a basketball student-athlete, she had 136 assists in her first season and helped the Blackbirds capture the 2001 NEC title. The following season Szumilo was named the school's Scholar Athlete of the Year. A two-year starter at LIU, she played for former Iona women's basketball head coach Anthony Bozzella. Szumilo graduated in 2003 with a Bachelor of Science in Sport Science with specialization in Adapted Physical Science.

She transferred to LIU Brooklyn after receiving an Associate in Arts degree from Mercer County Community College in 2000. She co-captained the Mercer County team that won the Region XIX Championship in back-to-back years and was named Region XIX Player of the Year in 2000. She was inducted into the MCCC Athletics Hall of Fame in June of 2023.

### IONA SEVENTH IN PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

- Iona was selected by the league's coaches to finish seventh in 2023-24.
- The Niagara Purple Eagles were selected as the preseason favorites to win the MAAC, receiving seven of 11 first place votes. Niagara's Aaliyah Parker was voted the MAAC Preseason Player of the Year.
- Siena, Fairfield and Marist rounded out the top four of the preseason poll.

### STEPPING UP TO SCORE

- Iona graduated 76% of its scoring from last season's MAAC Championship team.
   The Gaels return seven players from last season's team.
- Junior Judith Gomez is the lone returning starter from last season. She started 32 contests, averaging 5.6 points, 1.7 rebounds and 1.1 assists per game across 28 minutes per game. Gomez shot 42.6% from the floor and 37.9% from distance.
- Graduate student Natalia Otkhmezuri appeared in all 33 games last season for the Gaels, averaging 6.5 points per game and shot 43.2% from the floor and 37.9% from three in 19 minutes per game. Her 47 made three-pointers ranked second on the team.

#### WHATS NEW?

- The 2023-24 Iona roster features nine newcomers.
- Iona's four transfers include Sierra DeAngelo (FDU), Ella Fajardo (FDU), Talia DePetrillo (UC Colorado Springs) and Ally Carman (Boston College).
- The Gaels also welcome five first-year players who look to make an impact this season: Daniela Ciscar, Emma Donnelly, Taliya Heron, Zoey Ward and Mya Zaccagnini.

### MERRIMACK AND SACRED HEART JOIN THE MAAC IN 2024-25

- The MAAC announced on October 23, 2023 the addition of Merrimack College and Sacred Heart University as its newest full member institutions effective July 1, 2024.
- Merrimack College sponsors an athletics program of 28 teams. Merrimack enjoyed unprecedented success during the four-year transition to D1, winning multiple Northeast Conference championships, including regular season men's basketball championships in 2019-20 and 2022-23 and the tournament championship in March 2023.
- Sacred Heart University is home to 33 varsity sports. The Pioneers have captured 73 Northeast Conference team championships and a league-best nine Commissioner's Cups for overall league supremacy since joining the league in 1999. Pioneer teams, which earned four NCAA Tournament bids in 2022-23, have accumulated five national championships.

### MAAC TOURNAMENT CONTINUES ON IN ATLANTIC CITY, NEW JERSEY FOR 2022-23
