### Notables:

Siena looks for revenge over the team that ended its season last year, with the Gaels winning a battle in the MAAC Semifinals and also taking home a sweep during the regular season. Having won six of the last eight matchups, Iona erased a late 16 point deficit en-route to winning the MAAC title last year. The Gaels also narrowly missed the NCAA single game record for field goal percentage by shooting 75.5 percent from the field in a 91-64 win on February 16, 2023.

Head Coach Jim Jabir is 1-5 all-time against Iona over his 36-year head coaching career, with his lone win over the Gaels coming in the form of his first win in his return to Loudonville on January 10, 2022.

Jabir arrived in Boca Raton after a transformative 13-year run at Dayton, where he departed as the winningest coach in program history at 252-155 (.619). He built the Flyers from a 3-25 team in his first season, to a program which achieved a peak national ranking of No. 11 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls in 2013. A two-time Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year (2008, 2013), Jabir led UD to six straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 2010-15, in addition to three WNIT berths (2008, 2009, 2016).

Jabir guided Dayton to eight straight 20-win seasons while compiling a stellar 194-68 (.740) record from 2007-15. The Flyers captured the program's first A-10 Tournament Championship in 2012, and their initial two A-10 Regular Season Championships in both 2013 and 2014 under his leadership.

Jabir mentored the sixth youngest team in the country to a program Division I best 28-3 record in 2013, which culminated with Dayton's second trip to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament in four seasons. The historic 2014-15 UD squad also won 28 games, highlighted by NCAA Tournament victories over Iowa State, No. 11 Kentucky, and No. 8 Louisville to advance to the Regional Final in nearby Albany at the Times Union Center in Jabir's triumphant return to the Capital Region. The Flyers finished the 2014-15 season ranked 17th nationally in the USA Today Coaches' Poll.

Player recruitment and development was key for Jabir at Dayton, where he signed a pair of top-20 recruiting classes (13th in 2015-16, 20th in 2013-14). During his tenure in the Gem City, Jabir recruited 22 A-10 All-Conference and 11 All-Rookie Team selections, including four A-10 Rookies of the Year. He mentored and developed the first three WNBA Draft picks in program history in Saicha Grant-Allen (2017), Andrea Hoover (2015), and Ally Malott (2015). Moreover, Jabir's program achieved unparalleled success in the classroom where they boasted a perfect 100% graduation rate for 11 consecutive seasons as well as 10 A-10 All-Academic Team selections.

Prior to his time at Dayton, Jabir served a pair of six-year stints at both Marquette (1990-96) and Providence (1996-02). He rebuilt Marquette into a program which secured its first three postseason tournament berths, earning a spot in the WNIT in 1993 before winning the Great Midwest Conference and advancing to the NCAA Tournament in both 1994 and 1995. A two-time Reebok/Great Midwest Coach of the Year, Jabir led the Golden Eagles to back-to-back 22-win seasons in 1992-93 and 1993-94. During his tenure at Providence, he recruited and coached a pair of BIG EAST All-Conference and All-Rookie Team selections.

Jabir broke into the Division I head coaching ranks when the late legendary Siena College Athletic Director and Men's Basketball Coach Bill Kirsch '56, HOF '76 appointed the then 24-year-old to take over the reins of the women's basketball program on Apr. 13, 1987. Jabir led Siena to a 50-29 (.633) record over three years (1987-90), including the program's inaugural season in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in 1989-90. He recruited and coached Siena's first three All-MAAC selections in Val Higgins '91, HOF '98, Michelle Collins '92, and Peg Taylor '92, as well as six 1,000-point scorers.

Jabir began his collegiate head coaching career at Division III Buffalo State, which he led to a SUNYAC Championship and NCAA Regional appearance during his lone season at helm in 1986-87. He previously served as an assistant coach the year prior with the Bengals, following one season as an assistant at his alma mater Nazareth College in 1984-85. Jabir has also previously served as an assistant coach at the Division I level, where he helped guide Colorado to a Sweet 16 appearance in his lone season with the Buffaloes in 2002-03.

A 1984 graduate of Nazareth with his degree in English, Jabir earned his Master's in Student Personnel Administration from Buffalo State in 1986. The father of Lauren, Shane, and Jackson, Jabir and his wife, Angie - Siena's Senior Associate AD/SWA - are the proud parents of son Jude.

Jim Jabir enters his sixth overall season at the helm of the Siena Saints in 2023-24 and his third year leading the Green & Gold during his second stint. A finalist for the 2013 Naismith National Coach of the Year Award, the Brooklyn, New York native has led his programs to eight NCAA Tournament berths highlighted by a 2015 Elite Eight appearance, while amassing 543 wins.

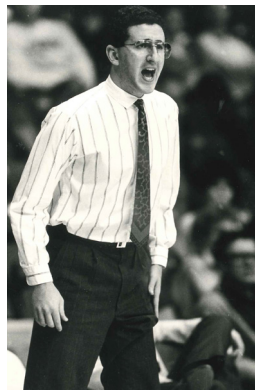
The 61-year-old Jabir has achieved a 543-478 (.532) overall record over 35 seasons as a collegiate head coach, including 34 at the Division I level. Currently standing 26th amongst all active D1 head coaches in wins, he previously led the Siena Women's Basketball program for three seasons (1987-90), while also having served as the head coach at Florida Atlantic University (2017-21), University of Dayton (2003-16), Providence College (1996-02), Marquette University (1990-96), and Division III Buffalo State College (1986-87).

Before his first season back in 2021-22, Jabir said, "I would like to thank Dr. Gibson and John D'Argenio for the opportunity to come home and do what I love. Siena is a special place for me, and our goal from day one is to win championships and represent Siena in a first class manner. This is not my program. This program belongs to our students and all the fans who have supported the Saints for so long, and we will continue to represent you all well. We will build a family that you will be proud of. We will need you all at our games to help us achieve this lofty goal."

After guiding the Saints to their first MAAC Opening Round bye in five seasons during his first campaign back with the team in 2021-22, Jabir led one of the youngest teams in the nation in 2022-23 to a fourth place regular season finish and both the program's first winning record and MAAC Semifinal appearance since 2018. Siena boasted an 11-5 home record and a nine-win improvement while garnering five MAAC postseason honors - including Elisa Mevius winning MAAC Rookie of the Year honors. The team led the league in scoring offense and saw Mevius and classmate Teresa Seppala claim a combined 12 MAAC weekly honors - including Mevius becoming the first player in conference history to take home Player and Rookie of the Week honors on the same day. Siena ended the year with three players in double-figure scoring, six averaging seven points per-game or greater, and eight averaging more than 20 minutes per-game.

"We are delighted to welcome Coach Jabir back to Siena College, and couldn't be more excited to have someone with his tremendous coaching pedigree and acumen leading our women's basketball program," said Siena College President Christopher P. Gibbon '86, Ph.D. "Jim has a proven track record of building championship caliber programs in a way that strongly aligns with our Franciscan values, and we can't wait to see him lead our Saints to new heights."

Jabir returned to the Capital Region following a four-year stint at Florida Atlantic where he took the Owls to unprecedented success in Conference USA. This past season, Jabir piloted FAU to an 11-11 overall record including an 8-8 mark in C-USA. The Owls capped the season by securing the program's first-ever C-USA Tournament win, which marked Jabir's milestone 500th Division I head coaching victory. During his first season at the helm in 2017-18, he guided FAU to a nine-win improvement which marked the fourth best turnaround nationally.

**QUICK HITS**



- Concluding a stretch of four of five home games from Jan. 6-20 and winners of three straight at home, Siena remains at the UHY Center to battle defending MAAC champion Iona on Saturday afternoon. The contest will serve as the program's Alumni Day, where they will celebrate the 50th anniversary of varsity women's basketball at Siena.
- The Saints began the home week with their largest win of the year thus far, using a monster 49 point second half to take a 79-58 win over Rider. Junior Anajah Brown posted a career-best 21 points with a double-double for the second straight game in 21 points and 13 rebounds, while sophomore Elisa Mevius added 16 points and tied a career high with seven steals, and London Gamble went in double figures for the fourth time this season with 15 points and added nine boards. Siena shot a season-best 58 percent in the second half while holding a 45-28 rebound advantage. The night also featured the first collegiate points from freshman Esther Rodellar.
- Siena will look to get to at least 5-3 to start MAAC play for the third time in as many seasons in the current stint of head coach Jim Jabir. The Green and Gold have enjoyed at least five wins in each of the past two January slates under Coach Jabir.
- A monster 31-point performance from senior Ahynisha Jackson led the Saints to a 64-45 victory over Saint Peter's on January 6, giving the team its biggest win of the year and Jackson the most points scored by a Siena player since January 2018, as well as the program's first 30-point performance since November 2018.
- Siena's 45 points allowed against the Peacocks were good for its fewest allowed since a 68-44 win at Rider on Dec. 29, 2022, while the team shot a season-best 47.1 percent from the field.
- Siena lost junior Valencia Fontenelle-Posson for the season after suffering an ACL injury in the first half of the team's 65-62 victory against Fordham at the UHY Center on Dec. 7.
- The team featured all eight players that took the court in the scoring column against Merrimack on Nov. 28, marking the first time this season everyone who took the floor scored. Siena has had eight players score in a game three times this season, most recently on January 6 against MAAC foe Saint Peter's.
- A native of Tampere, Finland, sophomore Teresa Seppala missed the first two games of the season while competing with the Finnish National Team at the FIBA EuroCup in Europe.
- Led by head coach Jim Jabir in the third season of his second stint at Siena, the Saints entered the 2023-24 season coming off a nine-win improvement and an appearance in the MAAC Semifinals during the 2022-23 campaign.
- As a result of returning all five starters from last year, Siena was selected to finish second in the 2023 MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll, marking its highest finish in the poll since 2003.
- The Saints also saw four players take home Preseason All-MAAC honors, with junior Anajah Brown and sophomore Elisa Mevius garnering Preseason Second Team All-MAAC honors and senior Ahnisha Jackson joining sophomore Teresa Seppala on the Preseason All-MAAC Third Team.
- Brown and 2022-23 MAAC Rookie of the Year Mevius return as Third Team All-MAAC selections from last season, while Seppala earned a spot along with Mevius on the MAAC All-Rookie squad
- Boasting 75 percent of its roster (9/12) as underclassmen, Siena returns all five starters and 80 percent of its scoring from last season.
- Brown ranked second in the MAAC in rebounding, total blocks, blocks per-game, and field goal percentage last season, while Mevius was third in assists and boasted a free throw percentage just north of 80 percent (80.4).
- The Saints will be on the hunt this season to complete back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 2002-03 and 2003-04 campaigns.
- The team boasts a program record six international players (half its roster) and players from six different countries, including the United States, Germany, Finland, Spain, Hungary, and Czech Republic.
- Several Saints played internationally for their respective national teams this past summer, including Elisa Mevius (German 3x3u National Team), Teresa Seppala (Finnish Women's Universiade Team), Valencia Fontenelle-Posson (US Women's Deaf National Team), Esther Rodellar (Spanish 3x3 U18 Team), and Eszter Turi (Hungarian National Team Training Camp).
- Siena has spent their entire home life at the UHY Center, formerly known as the Alumni Recreation Center (ARC). Longtime Siena corporate partner UHY Advisors secured the naming rights to the facility in February 2021, and a ribbon cutting was held on November 14, 2021.
- Former program standout Heather Stec returns to Siena for her third year on the sidelines as an assistant coach for the 2022-23 season. Stec played at Siena from 2004 through 2009, and earned a Second Team All-MAAC selection her senior year.

The Last Time...

Siena scored 100 points in a game: Siena defeated Rider 103-69 on Jan. 13, 2001.

Siena allowed 100 points in a game: No. 14/13 Syracuse defeated the Saints, 102-65, on Nov. 9, 2016 in Syracuse, NY.

Siena scored between 90-99: Siena hit 94 points for the second time in a single season with a 94-62 victory over Rider on Jan. 26, 2023. The Saints previously exploded for 94 points in a 94-45 win over Saint Peter's at the UHY Center on Jan. 14, 2023. This marks the first time the team has recorded multiple 90-point games in a season since 2001-02.

Siena won an overtime game: A shorthanded Siena squad with just six active players grabbed a 55-51 road victory at Fairfield on Jan. 19, 2023, marking its first OT triumph since a 78-66 win at Canisius on Feb. 22, 2019.

Siena lost an overtime game: The Saints fell in a 67-64 overtime decision to Merrimack on November 28, 2023 in their first home OT contest against a non-league opponent since 2010.

Siena held an opponent to 40 points or fewer: The Saints held Monmouth to shooting just 23.9 percent from the floor in a 51-39 win on Jan. 23, 2020 at the ARC. In that game, Lala Watts would set the single game record for blocks with eight total.

Siena was held to 40 points or fewer: Siena was stifled in an 69-38 loss against Rider back on Feb. 13, 2020. The Saints turned the ball over 28 times, in was their third loss of being held under 40 points on the season.

Siena won by more than 30 points: Siena took a 32-point rout over Rider to the tune of a 94-62 win at the UHY Center on Jan. 26, 2023. The Saints also recorded their largest margin of victory since 1994 in a 49-point, 94-45 victory over Saint Peter's at the UHY Center on Jan. 14, 2023.

Siena lost by more than 30 points: Siena fell to Manhattan by a final score of 80-50 on Jan. 16, 2020.

Siena featured five players in double-digit scoring: The Saints saw all five of their starters record double-figure scoring in its home opener against Penn on November 19, 2023, marking the second time in eight years the team finished with five players scoring ten or more points in a game.

Siena recorded 50 rebounds in a game: Siena put up a whopping 56 rebounds for its most boards in a game since 2015 as part of a 77-75 overtime loss to Mount St. Mary's at the UHY Center on Feb. 4, marking the third time that season they hit the 50-rebound threshold. The Saints hit the 50 rebound mark twice during the 2021-22 season.

A Siena player scored 30 or more points in a game: Senior Ahniysha Jackson secured the program's first 30-point performance since Nov. 2018 and the most points in a game since Jan. 2018 with a career-high 31 points against Saint Peter's on Jan. 6, 2024.

A Siena player recorded 20 or more rebounds in a game: Heather Stec pulled down 23 rebounds on Jan. 21, 2007 at Saint Peter's. She came up one rebound shy of the program record (24) set by Melanie Halker '97 on Feb. 23, 1997.

A Siena player had 10 or more assists in a game: Freshman London Gamble became the second Saint during the 2022-23 season to record double-digit helps in a game, marking 11 assists in a 94-62 win over Rider at the UHY Center on Jan. 26, 2023. Elisa Mevius previously came one assist away from tying the school record with 14 helps during a 74-67 win over Marist on Jan. 7, 2023. Siena had only had one player eclipse the ten-assist mark since 2013 prior to the season.

Siena featured multiple players with a double-double in a game: Anajah Brown went for 19 pts and 13 reb, while Teresa Seppala totaled 15 points and 11 rebounds against Mount St. Mary's on Feb. 4, 2023, marking the first time during the 2022-23 season that the Saints featured multiple players with a double-double in a game.

Siena failed to convert a free-throw: The Saints failed to score, as well as attempt a free throw in their 59-49 loss to Duquesne on Nov. 27, 2021. The Saints would go 0-0 in the game, marking the latest mark since Dec. 4, 2006 when Siena went 0-3 from the line at #1 Maryland.

Siena failed to convert a 3-pointer: Siena defeated Binghamton, 54-50, despite going 0-13 from the three-point line on December 5, 2022. The result marked the first time since Feb. 20, 2020 that the Saints had gone quiet from beyond-the-arc, and the first time since an 84-81 overtime victory at Rider on Feb. 29, 2008 that they pulled out a win with no three's made.

A Siena opponent failed to convert a 3-pointer: St. Bonaventure went 0-13 from beyond the arc in a 50-42 Bonnies win at the Reilly Center on November 11, 2021. It marked the first time in 10 years that Siena held its opponent without a three since Saint Peter's went 0-for-8 from distance on Feb. 19, 2011.
