### NOTES & NEWS

#### Last Time Out

A historic performance from Destiny Adams pushed the Scarlet Knights past NJIT (1-2), 94-84, Sunday afternoon at Jersey Mike's Arena.

Adams recorded a 36-point, 22-rebound double-double, the highest in the Big Ten era for the Scarlet Knights.

Kiyomi McMiller also broke through with 25 points against the Highlanders.

Chyna Cornwell helped Adams on the boards, bringing in 15 rebounds, her third consecutive contest with 10+ off the glass.

It was another close one through the first half for RU, featuring six lead changes and five ties. However, Rutgers came alive once again in the second half, outscoring the Highlanders by 19 in the third quarter to solidify the win.

#### It Is Her Destiny

Senior forward Destiny Adams was named the Big Ten Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 11. The award is the first Big Ten weekly honor of Adams' career. She is the first Scarlet Knight to win the award since Arella Guirantes (Dec. 8 2020) and the first under head coach Coquese Washington.

She was also named a USBWA Ann Meyers Drysdale National Players of the Week as well as an AP Player of the Week Honorable Mention.

Adams led Rutgers to a 3-0 start during the first week of the 2024-25 season, with wins over Manhattan (85-79), Cornell (72-61) and NJIT (94-84). Between all three outings, she totaled 80 points, 45 rebounds, six blocks, five steals and five assists. In addition, the Manchester, New Jersey native went 25-33 (.758) from the free throw line. The highlight of the week though, was her career best 36 points and 22-rebound double-double against the Highlanders on Sunday. Besides her 2024 Big Ten Tournament performance (33 points, 24 rebounds), she is the first player in program history with 30+ points and 20+ rebounds in a regular season game in over 12 seasons. Adams' 36 points ties a Jersey Mike's Arena record that was previously set by Guirantes in 2020. She is also tied for 8th for the most points in a single game in program history, along with Guirantes and Caroline DeRoose (1994).

The massive performance marks her 10th career double-double and second in three games.

She also had 30 points and 15 boards in the game prior versus the Big Red, to make her the first Scarlet Knight since Sue Wicks (1988) to net back-to-back 30+ point games.

Dating back to last season, Adams has reached double digit points in 20 consecutive contests.

#### Scouting the Gaels

Iona dropped its first two outings of the season to UCF (76-44) and Navy (55-53).

Mya Zaccagnini paces the Gaels with 11.0 points per game while Judith Gomez and Zoey Ward top the team, averaging 6.5 rebounds.

Successful Alumni

Rutgers women's basketball celebrated two of its most distinguished alums during the offseason as Kahleah Copper earned a gold medal in the 2024 Olympic Games with Team USA and Benijah Laney-Hamilton was crowned the 2024 WNBA Champion with the New York Liberty

Copper helped Team USA to its eighth straight gold medal and her first, with a 67-66 win over France on August 11. Copper came up huge off the bench in the gold medal game with 12 points, including 10 in the fourth quarter to help secure the victory.

Laney-Hamilton also made history with the Liberty, bringing the first WNBA Championship to New York. She played a huge role in game two of the series, netting 20 points in addition to two rebounds and two assists to give the Liberty its first victory of the series. In addition, she scored at least two points in the other four games.

Coquese Washington was named the third full-time head coach in the history of Rutgers women's basketball on May 23, 2022. A three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year during her 12-year tenure at Penn State, Washington (first name pronounced ko-KWEES) arrived "On the Banks" with extensive experience program building and coaching championship-caliber basketball.

The Scarlet Knights continued to grow under Washington in her second slate at the helm. The team celebrated its 50th season in program history, highlighting historic moments, players and coaches throughout the year, which culminated in a grand celebration for Alumni Weekend. RU also inducted its inaugural Knights of Honor class in the 1982, 2000 and 2007 teams with banner is Jersey Mike's Arena.

The squad earned its sixth advance sellout in program history and first since 2006, against Iowa, which became the most attended basketball game between men's and women's contests of the entire 2023-24 campaign.

Destiny Adams had a breakout year in her first campaign "On The Banks" under Washington. The transfer led active players on the team in multiple statistical categories while also ranking top-5 in the conference. She earned All-Big Ten Second Team (Coaches) honors and an Honorable Mention (Media). In addition, Adams set the Big Ten Tournament single game rebounding record with 24 boards in the opening round.

In her first season as head coach, Washington set a solid foundation for the team. She guided the program to its 1,000th win in program history with a road victory over Minnesota (Jan. 12), becoming just the 22nd Division I team and the third squad in the Big Ten to reach the milestone. In the same game against the Gophers, Washington also picked up her 100th Big Ten win.

Washington aided freshman guard Kaylene Smikle in chasing greatness, as she was named to the All-Big Ten Second Team (Media & Coaches) and the Big Ten All-Freshman team (Media & Coaches). The guard also collected three Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors, the most in program history. Under Washington's direction, Smikle became Rutgers' all-time leading freshman scorer, ending the season with 573 points to best the previous high of 536 points. She is the third freshman in program history to amass 500+ points.

Smikle paced the team with 17.9 points per game in addition to averaging 19.5 points in Big Ten play. She was the only Scarlet Knight to net 20+ points in a game during the season and accomplished the feat 15 times, including versus 12 Big Ten opponents, leading all freshmen in reaching double-digit scoring. The Farmingdale, New York product also paced the team with 56 three-pointers and 69 steals to rank top-10 in the conference in both categories.

Washington also saw Chyna Cornwell named an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention (Media) as well as earning the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. In a breakout season, Cornwell paced RU with nine double-doubles, including four in Big Ten play.

Before settling "On The Banks" Washington spent two seasons at Notre Dame, marking her second coaching stint in South Bend after serving as assistant coach for her alma mater from 1999-2007. She earned her first head coaching position at Penn State, where she be-

came the first female African American head coach in the school's history and went on to lead the Lady Lions to three Big Ten titles and four NCAA Tournaments. Washington also spent the 2019-20 season as associate head coach at Oklahoma.

During her most recent two seasons at Notre Dame, the Fighting Irish returned to the national scene with an appearance in the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2022. The Sweet 16 run marked Washington's 10th season on the sidelines in South Bend following an eight-year stint as an assistant under Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Muffet McGraw, highlighted by eight consecutive NCAA Tournaments, four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, and the 2001 NCAA Championship.

The Washington era at Rutgers signals the head coach's return to the Big Ten. From 2012-14, the Lady Lions claimed three consecutive Big Ten regular-season titles, becoming one of four programs in conference history to win three or more regular-season crowns in a row. She guided Penn State to Sweet 16 appearances in 2012 and 2014 while developing 17 players to All-Big Ten status on 32 separate occasions.

Washington earned Big Ten Coach of the Year honors three times (2012-14), WBCA Regional Coach of the Year twice (2012, 2013), and was named a finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year two times (2012, 2013). She was also selected as the 2011 and 2014 Black Coaches Association (BCA) Female Coach of the Year.

Her programs' success has mirrored her prowess on the recruiting trail, where she signed 12 top-25 recruiting classes throughout her coaching career at Notre Dame and Penn State. After recruitment came development as Washington mentored six All-Americans and 13 future WNBA professionals. During her tenure at Notre Dame, Washington was directly responsible for developing three All-Americans and two Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winners - Niele Ivey (current Notre Dame head coach) and Megan Duffy (current Marquette University head coach). Washington also worked with Alicia Ratay, who is the NCAA's career three-point field goal percentage leader.

A student of the game, Washington enjoyed success in the college ranks and later as a professional in the WNBA. During her time in an Irish uniform, Washington rewrote the record books with 554 career assists (seventh all-time) and 307 career steals (third all-time). Her 2.7 steals-per-game career average still holds the top spot in South Bend. Washington was just as impressive in the classroom, earning her undergraduate degree in just three years and, later, earning a juris doctorate from Notre Dame Law School in 1997 to become a "Double-Domer."

Washington then played six seasons in the WNBA and won a WNBA title with the Houston Comets in 2000. She followed the Comets' championship season with another strong campaign in 2001, ranking among the Top 10 in the WNBA in assists (ninth) and steals (fourth) as the Comets made their fifth consecutive playoff appearance. Midway through the 2002 season, she was traded to the Indiana Fever, where she guided that club to its first-ever playoff berth and became the first player in WNBA history to lead three different squads to the postseason.

She was a key figure in helping create the WNBA Players Association (WNBPA), serving as the founding president of the WNBPA from

1999 until 2001. She served as the executive vice president of the WNBPA from 2001 until her retirement in 2003. Washington led negotiations for the association's first collective bargaining agreement, and as executive vice president, was a mainstay in the negotiations for the league's second collective bargaining agreement, which brought about the first free agency system in women's professional sports.

Washington's service to the game has gone beyond coaching. She has served on the WBCA Board of Directors and led a committee tasked to grow the game of women's basketball. She won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2013 World University Games and served on the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Committee from 2009-12. She was a member of the Kay Yow Cancer Fund Board of Directors from 2012-15 and served five years on the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee. Currently, she Co-Chairs the WBCA's Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Committee.

A native of Flint, Michigan, Washington was inducted into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame in December 2009. Washington and her husband, Raynell Brown, have two children, Quenton and Rhaiyna.

### Returning to The Banks

RU returns seven Scarlet Knights to the squad in Destiny Adams, Lisa Thompson, Mya Petticord, Antonia Bates, Awa Sidibe, Kennedy Brandt and Chyna Cornwell.

During the 2023-24 campaign, this group combined for 125 games started, 1,267 points and 721 rebounds.

### Welcoming the Newcomers

Head coach Coquese Washington added two transfers, a pair of freshmen and one walk-on in the offseason.

Graduate student JoJo Lacey joined the team from Boston College and sophomore Janae Walker from Kentucky.

As a senior, Lacey averaged 8.7 points and 4.4 rebounds per game. She reached 10+ points in nine outings including two games with 20+ and a career-high 23-point performance against North Carolina (Feb. 29).

During her rookie season with the Wildcats, Walker played in 28 games and made one start. She netted a season-high six points and three field goals at No. 18/18 Louisville (Dec. 10), while also grabbing four rebounds three times. Walker led UK in blocks four times during the season.

Rookies Kiyomi McMiller and Zachara Perkins came "On The Banks" over the summer and walk-on junior Deja Young this fall.

A five-star recruit, McMiller was

ranked No. 22 in her recruiting class by ESPNW. She played the last two seasons of her high school career at Life Center Academy in Burlington, New Jersey, averaging 30.1 points, 5.6 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.8 steals per game during her senior campaign.

McMiller leaves high school with an impressive resume over a three-year span, scoring 2,015 points, 437 rebounds, 363 assists and 231 steals in 70 games.

During Perkins' 2022-23 season at Summer Creek High School in Houston, Texas, she led her team to both an Area and a Bi-District Championship in addition to the Region 3 Finals. A consistent double-double type player, she averaged 18.6 points, 9.8 rebounds and 3.1 blocks per game through her junior season.

Perkins was named to the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABCO) All-State and All-Region teams. In addition, she was selected as the Newcomer of the Year and to the All-Academic Team.

Prior to Young arriving "On The Banks" she served as a walk-on for the Hampton women's basketball team from the fall of 2022 to the spring of 2023. During the campaign she helped the Pirates to a total of 12 wins including nine in conference play. At Teaneck high school, she helped guide her team in the first round of the 2021-22 NJSIAA Tournament with a season-high 26 points, five assists and five takeaways. In addition, she also aided her squad in reaching the North Jersey Section 1, Group 3 Quarterfinals.

### Staff Additions

In addition to the five newcomers on the court, coach Washington also made some adds on the sideline. Johnetta Hayes was brought on as an assistant coach as well as Will McIntire as the director of Director of Scouting & Technology and Alejandro Ramirez as the interim director of basketball operations.

Hayes spent the last four seasons

as the head coach at UMBC. In the 2022-23 season, Hayes led the Retrievers to an 11-win improvement, one of the best in the nation. Hayes also led the team to a 10-6 mark in America East play, their second-best record in program history.

McIntire comes to Piscataway after serving as a student manager and graduate assistant at Iowa over the past four years. Ramirez also served as a student manager with the Scarlet Knights over recent seasons before being promoted to his current role.
