

The primary purpose of this publication is to assist the media in their coverage of the 2008 Iona College Gaels. Should you require any additional information, photos or statistics, please contact David Greenwald in the Sports Information Office. To set up interviews with players and coaches please contact the sports information office 48 hours in advance of desired interview time. Players and coaches will NOT be available on game day until AFTER the contest.

The cozy confines of Mazzella Field's press box are tight, however we can accommodate several members of the media. But we still ask that you contact us well in advance of the game so that we may reserve a space for you. Photo credentials are available and all we ask is that you adhere to the NCAA photography guidelines. Refreshments will be served in the press box at halftime.

A complete computerized statistics package will be available approximately 20 minutes after the contest. Telephone lines and a fax machine are provided in the sports information office after the game. Post game interviews may be conducted after observance of the NCAA's 10 minute cooling-off period. Player interviews will take place outside the locker room in the Hynes Center East lobby. (A sports information representative will bring out requested players.) Coach Mariani will be available in his office. Radio and television are asked to make their credential requests two weeks in advance so that arrangements for phone lines and additional space can be made. Credentials can be picked up at the gate near the press box on game day.

2008 Season Preview

As he enters his 11th season, head Coach Fred Mariani brought home the program's second MAAC Championship, a three game winning streak to start the season on the way to seven wins in 2007. With the end of the MAAC Football League in 2007, the Gaels will be play as an FCS independent in 2008. The Maroon & Gold returns a strong offensive line, quarterback and experienced secondary. The biggest hurdles for Mariani and his staff are a depleted defensive line that lost all four starters and the tailback position, which saw the graduation of two of Iona's most prolific runners.

DEFENSE:

Throughout the 2007 season, Iona's defense ranked in the Top-5 in the nation and finished ranked No. 3. With the graduation of nine starters on defense, four on the line alone, the Gaels will have to rely on a seasoned secondary.

DEFENSIVE LINE:

The Gaels lost one of the most talented defensive lines in the programs history with the graduation of Rob Wright, David Tash, Dan Walters and James McDonald, who were all named to the MAAC First Team Defense and Walters and Wright were All-Americans. With no starters, the line will made up of first year starters. Tim Nervina returns to the Gaels after season ending shoulder surgery in 2007 and Kevin Jackson will join him on the end. Jamal Edwards and Jacob Jabbour will use their experience from last season to help prepare them for the starting job at tackle in 2008. Juniors Duane Jones, Dan Jensen and sophomore Martin LaRoche will help to the sure up the line rotation. Mariani feels that the "Line has to come back stronger, be more prepared and have to step up and play as a defensive line." This is probably the biggest question mark for Mariani and his staff.

SECONDARY:

Good group of defensive backs returning. Senior Matt McGuire, a 2008 quad captain, returned from an injury he suffered in training camp to put up strong numbers in seven games in 2007. After missing the first four games, McGuire grabbed three interceptions,

11 solo tackles and 31 tackles, which ranked ninth best on the team. Joseph Garcia appeared in all eleven games last season with 28 tackles, the second most by a non-starter, added an interception and tied Reggie Dorsainvil with seven passes broken up. Junior Taylor Sohns and Sophomore Desmond Hinds each got good playing time last year and will look to transition their experience to starting roles. Junior Matt Pergolini saw substantial playing time with five starts and had 27 tackles in 2007 and will serve as a strong back up to McGuire. Sophomores Todd Dilando was Most Improved Defensive Player in the spring and along with Geno Raman and Jimmy D'Amora, the Gaels have young, but dedicated talent.

LINEBACKERS:

At linebacker, Andrew Lipski brings experience and accolades to the position. An injury shortened 2007 season saw him only play in four games, but he recorded 30 tackles, two breakups and 3.5 tackles for loss. If he's healthy, he can really pace the defense and make it one of the tops in the county again. Jacob French got great experience taking over the starting role when Lipski was injured. He was the only player to have a forced fumble and an interception. Juniors Paul Mohan and Gerald Ford return from injury riddled 2007 seasons and hope to be healthy this season. Mike Lougee and Kevin Mahoney, a transfer from Fordham, will also look for playing time.

OFFENSE:

QUARTERBACK:

Junior Nick Rossetti enters 2008 as the starting quarterback and comes off a breakout season. Rossetti grabbed the starting job in Week 1 and never relinquished it. He completed 14 of 22 for 222 yards, a career best in the opening week win against Delaware Valley. He went on to complete 247 passes for 1,774 yards and also had 200 yards rushing, the first quarterback at Iona to rush for more than 100 yards under Mariani. He put together four straight 200+-yard games and five on the season. Rossetti added career-bests with 23 pass attempts against Wagner and threw four touchdown passes against Sacred Heart, both home wins. He was able to do it with his feet or

arm either throwing or running in for a score in all but one game. Nick Groth, a transfer from Nassau Community College, will compete with a tremendous group of incoming freshman quarterbacks for the spot behind Rossetti.

RECEIVERS/ TIGHT END:

The Gaels return three starting wide receivers for 2008 including the third leading scorer from last season. Senior Tim Mastrino leads the group of returnees coming off a season with 36 grabs for 538 yards and four touchdowns. Senior Daron Ellis had 15 receptions for 146 yards and a touchdown and looks to be strong target for Rossetti. Junior Tyler Schroeder impressed in 2007 with nine catches and two touchdowns. The sophomore trio of Dan DeAntonio and Danny Picinic and transfer Bryant Torres will battle for playing time. Senior Michael Day returns for his second season at tight end. He caught five passes for 20 yards and a touchdown, but was mainly used for blocking purposes in the 2007 season. He'll catch more balls this season, as he is a big target with good hands. He will also bring his experience to the offensive line. Sophomore Tom Sena and David Nelson, a transfer from Northern Iowa will compete for playing time behind Day.

RUNNING BACK:

The Gaels backfield is rebuilding after the loss of MAAC Offensive Player of the Year Dane Samuels and the fourth leading rusher in Iona's history, Rudy Arcara. Senior Craig Sutera, who saw playing time at the end of 2007, will head into camp as the starting tailback. Sutera rushed for 78 yards on 16 carries in 10 games last season. Caesar Sanchez will also contend for the tailback spot as well as hold the starting fullback spot. The red-shirt sophomore scored his first collegiate touchdown in 2007 and served as a blocker and target out of the backfield for his quarterback. Transfer Joe Muraglia will bring depth to the backfield as Iona tries to solidify the running game before the season.

OFFENSIVE LINE:

The offensive line has eight returning players and four starters. Head Coach Fred Mariani feels, "This is the most experienced offensive line I've had. [The Coaches] are expecting this to be our best offensive line in my ten years." Senior Jonathan Hili was a First Team All-Conference selection and senior Mike Butler was a Second Team All-Conference selection. Senior Juliene Adams and Junior Ryan Mruk each enter their

third year on the line. Junior Richard Mirabito will be looking for playing time at both tackle and guard positions and senior Mike Balone will serve as back at the guard spot. Sophomores Zach Schleimer and Mike Gray will work their way into the line rotation at camp.

SPECIAL TEAMS:

Another key loss for the Gaels was place-kicker Chris Lofrese. Lofrese was tops in several categories including punting, punting yardage, punt average, extra points scoring and field goal scoring. He set the school record for single season extra point scoring connecting on 37 of 41 last season. Sophomore Robert Woods is place-kicker and punter coming into camp. Junior John Kassebaum will handle kickoffs for his third season. He will also compete for placekicking duties with Woods and incoming freshman. Joseph Garcia and Daron Ellis will again serve as the primary punt return specialists. The pair combined for over 213 yards on returns and averaged 10 yards a return. Tim Mastrino and Desmond Hinds will also compete for this assignment. Joe Muraglia, Hinds and Ellis will also compete for kick off return duties. In the specialty positions, Shawn Verma and Tim Nervina return as long snappers and Nick Rossetti will serve as the primary holder.

SCHEDULE:


The Gaels will again embark on an 11-game schedule featuring six opponents from last season. Iona opens on the road for the first time since 2005 and will take on Delaware Valley for the second straight year. The Maroon & Gold play NEC rival Wagner on the road in week two as their first two games are on the road for the first time in seven seasons. The Gaels return home to at Mazzella Field against NEC rival Sacred Heart followed by Pace in the battle of Westchester County's two college football programs, Stonehill and Wesley (Del.) to wrap up a four game home stand. Iona returns to the road and to California for the program's second ever trip to the West Coast to face Cal Davis. The Gaels continue a rivalry started in the MAAC Football Conference when they face off in Poughkeepsie with Marist, who edged the Gaels out of sole possession of the MAAC Football Championship in 2007. The season concludes with a road game at CAA's Maine and home contests against new member of the Big South, Stony Brook, and Bryant, back-to-back Northeast-10 Champions and currently in transition to become Division I.





Head Coach Fred Mariani

In 1998, Fred Mariani was hired as the first full-time head football coach in the 33-year history of the Iona College football program. Mariani enters his 11th season in New Rochelle and is the second-longest tenured football coach in Iona history.

Coach Mariani and his staff have wasted no time building a new tradition of success, turning around a football program that was a combined 1-19 over the previous two seasons and had won just four games in three years.

Since then, Mariani has guided the team to 43 wins and a complete turnaround of the Gael football program, including a 7-4 mark and a share of the MAAC Football League Championship in 2007. This was the program's highest win under Mariani and the highest for the program since winning nine games and taking the inaugural league title in 1993.

In Mariani's tenure, he and his coaching staff have worked hard to install a new offensive system and require a deeper sense of commitment from the players. The success has shown as Mariani has coached a number of players who have made their mark in the Iona College record book. He guided three players that rushed for 1,000+ yards at Iona in former All-American Ralph Saldiveri '01 and the dynamic tandem of Rudy Arcara '07 and Dane Samuels '07. WR Dennis Calacione '06 set receiving records for receptions, yards and sits fourth all-time in scoring. In 2003, former All-Conference player Billy Brieden '04 was just the third quarterback in school history to record a 2,000+ yard passing season and first since 1993. In the last ten seasons, coach Mariani's players have set 40+ Mazzella Field, game, single-season, and career school records.

A number of Coach Mariani's players at Iona have also gone on to a professional level after their career in New Rochelle. Julio Boromei '04, Jason Collins '02, Kevin Fales '04, Brent Maddox '06, Kazmel Minott '02, Jesse Oriol '04, Lavar Stockon



'02 have all experienced football at the next level in various capacities. The six players have spent time in the NFL, Canadian Football League, Arena Football League and pro leagues in Europe. This past year, Dane Samuels '07, Reggie Dorsainvil and David Tash '07 were each invited to professional training camps. Samuels was invited by the Buffalo Bills, Dorsainvil by the Cleveland Browns and Tash by the AF2 Manchester Wolves.

Mariani is well known for both his coaching and recruiting abilities at the Division I-AA level. He has established a national recruiting program at Iona, attracting student-athletes from all over the country. Players from as far away as Iowa, Las Vegas and California to players from close home in the Bronx, Yonkers and New Rochelle fill out this season's roster.

Prior to accepting his first head coaching position at Iona, Mariani served as the Offensive Coordinator and the Recruiting Coordinator at Fordham University from 1994 through 1997. At Fordham, he helped direct the turnaround of the Ram football program, including an impressive 4-2 mark in conference play in 1997.

In four recruiting seasons at Fordham, Mariani was responsible for signing over fifty scholarship recruits, including All-American punter Barry Cantrell, who played with the Philadelphia Eagles and Cory Bailey, who starred for the Rhein Fire of NFL Europe.

Mariani spent six seasons as the Offensive Line Coach and Recruiting Coordinator at Lehigh University before his stint at Fordham. He made an immediate impact on the Lehigh program, helping guide the team to a 6-5 overall record while leading Division I-AA in both total offense and passing offense.

In addition, the 1988 squad allowed only eight quarterback sacks, an average of less than one sack per game. Mariani was also responsible for signing over

sixty recruits in his six seasons, including 12 All-Patriot League offensive linemen. The 1991 squad finished 9-2 and the 1993 team posted a 7-4 record on the way to winning the Patriot League Championship. During four of his six seasons at Lehigh, the offensive line gave up less than nine sacks a season.

Mariani's first Division I-AA coaching position came at Morehead State University, where he was named the Recruiting Coordinator and Offensive Coordinator. In his four seasons at Morehead State, the offense led the Ohio Valley Conference in passing on three occasions and established 24 new school records. In his first season as Offensive Coordinator in 1986, MSU finished 7-4, the most wins in school history. One of those wins came against Division I-A opponent Wichita State. The victory stands in the NCAA record books as the most points ever overcome to win a game, Division I-A or I-AA. Morehead State trailed 35-3 at the half but rallied in the second half for a 36-35 victory. That same year, Morehead State broke 14 offensive records on its way to their first winning season in 20 years.

After a successful playing career at St. Joseph's College in Collegeville, IN, Mariani joined the coaching staff as a graduate assistant in 1974. In nine seasons on the coaching staff, Mariani helped guide St. Joseph's to three Conference titles as well as a national ranking for passing offense for five straight years (1979-83).

In April of 1999, Mariani was inducted into the St. Joseph's College Athletic Hall of Fame for his contributions to the football program.

Mariani began his football career as an offensive lineman at Don Bosco Preparatory High School in Ramsey, New Jersey. As a three-year letterman, Mariani helped guide Don Bosco to two-straight New Jersey State Championships (1969-1970).

Mariani resides in Saddle River, NJ. His daughter, Brook, is a graduate of Iona.

Assistant Coaches

Ed Lynett

Defensive Coordinator - Fourth Season



Ed Lynett returns for his fourth season with the Iona College football team as the team's defensive coordinator.

In 2007, the Gaels again were one of the top defenses in the country ranking third overall in total defense allowing just 271.45 yards per game. Iona also ranked 15th in Division I FCS in run defense (116.91 yards/game) and 24th in scoring defense (21.55 points per game). In 2006, his defense ranked among the top programs in Division I FCS, allowing a stingy 232.0 yards per game, the third lowest total in the nation. The Gaels were especially successful against the run allowing only 66.9 yards per game, also No. 3 overall. Iona's 17.4 points per game allowed ranked 17th in Division I FCS. On Oct. 7, 2006, Lynett served as acting head coach in a game against Columbia.

Lynett arrived in New Rochelle after serving as an assistant coach at Lehigh University in 2003 and 2004. At Lehigh, Lynett coached the defensive line, in addition to assisting with special teams. He also supervised the squads recruiting efforts in the areas of Missouri, Ohio, Upstate New York, and Delaware. In addition to his duties with the varsity teams, Lynett also served as the head coach of the JV team at Lehigh.

Prior to his role at Lehigh, Lynett served as a graduate assistant at Colorado State University where he worked with the defensive line and defensive backs. Lynett also spent five seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Scranton Prep.

As a player, Lynett played both running back and defensive back at Fordham University, earning three varsity letters in 1989, 1990, and 1991. He also earned an MBA from Colorado State in '02.

Lynett currently resides in New Rochelle, NY and has a daughter Delaney.



John Kaleo

Offensive Coordinator - Second Season



Former Arena Football League standout John Kaleo enters his second season at Iona as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Kaleo joined the Gaels last season after a completing a successful 14-year career in the AFL including an Arena Bowl Championship with the Tampa Bay Storm in 2003.

Kaleo passed for more than 35,000 yards and 581 touchdowns while completing 60 percent of his passing attempts playing for the Storm, St. Louis Stampede, and the Los Angeles Avengers. He was instrumental in developing game plans as his squads signal caller. He was also responsible for breaking down opponent game film throughout his career. He also saw time in the AFL in Albany, Cleveland, San Jose, New England, Austin and Columbus.

He was a two-year performer for his alma mater, Maryland after transferring from Montgomery College (Md.) after his sophomore year. As a senior at Maryland, he set single-season school records in passing yards (3,392), completions (286), attempts (482), total yards (3,472) as well as single-game touchdown passes with five. At Montgomery, he led his team to a 10-0 record as a sophomore, setting single-season and career records in every passing category. The NJCAA Hall of Famer was the 1990 Player of the Year as well as First Team All-American.



Mike Lavelle

Offensive Line - Third Season



Mike Lavelle returns for his third season on the Iona College football staff and second year as Offensive Line coach. He switched over to his current duties after coaching Iona's defensive line unit in 2006.

In 2007, Lavelle saw three players on the offensive line receive

All-Conference honors with two players earning first-team selection. He helped improved the Gaels offense in almost every statistical category. Most notably, Iona ranked in the top 50 in Division I FCS in total offense (50th), scoring offense (42nd), passing efficiency (29th), rushing offense (48th), time of possession (40th) and sack allowed (16th).

Lavelle came to New Rochelle after spending three seasons at C.W. Post where he was responsible for the offensive line and tight ends as well as strength and conditioning. The Pioneers achieved a 27-8 mark in his three seasons from 2003-2005, the highest winning total over a span in school history. In 2005, C.W. Post was ranked in the Top-10 of Division II in total offense (3rd), scoring offense (4th), and rushing offense (9th). The Pioneers claimed back-to-back Northeast-10 Conference championships in 2004 and 2005 and reached the Division II Playoffs in two of his three seasons.

He was also an assistant coach at Seaford HS on Long Island in 2002 coaching both the offense and defensive lines. The team won the Conference IV Nassau County championship in his lone season and had its first undefeated season in school history.

Lavelle played two seasons for C.W. Post from 1993-94. As a freshman and sophomore he competed on the Nassau Community College squad that participated in the NJCAA National Championship in 1993.

A native of Long Island, Lavelle resides in West Babylon, NY with his wife Danielle and their two children, a three-year old daughter named Skyla Madison and eight-month old son Maxwell Lucas. In addition to his duties at Iona, he is also a member of the Nassau County Sheriff's Department.



Ryne Nutt

Defensive Line - First Season



Ryne Nutt enters his first season with the Iona Gaels after playing for four seasons at Central Connecticut State University. He will serve as defensive line coach.

After red shirting in 2003, Nutt started every game for the Blue Devils on the offensive line and served as team captain in 2007.

CCSU had the Northeast Conference's top offense in 2004, top rushing attack in 2005 and 2007 and the nation's top ground attack in 2006. He was a member of two straight Northeast Conference Championship teams in 2004 and 2005.

Nutt was a three-time all-NEC selection, including two first team honors. While a Blue Devil, Nutt helped Central Connecticut State to 29 wins, which are the most over a four-year span in CCSU football history.

Nutt also received several accolades for his performance on and off the field in addition to his Northeast Conference awards. He earned Mid-Major All-America distinction from The Sports Network and ECAC All-Star selections in each of the last two seasons. He was a three-time ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District I selection, two-time ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American second team, and Northeast Conference's Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He also received the prestigious Nils V. "Swede" Nelson Award, which is awarded by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston to the athlete that shows exceptional achievement in academics, athletics and sportsmanship.

Harvey Silberbush

Linebackers - First Season



Entering his 40th year of coaching, Harvey Silberbush returns to Iona in 2008 and will serve as an Assistant Coach for Linebackers for the football program. Silberbush comes back to New Rochelle from SUNY Maritime in Throgs Neck, NY where he served as an assistant coach for the last three years.

Now in his third stint with Iona, Silberbush served as defensive coordinator for five years under head coach Brian Colleary from 1979-1982 and Harold Crocker for six seasons from 1992-1997.

After graduating from NYU in 1968, Silberbush began his coaching career at his high school alma mater as an assistant varsity and head JV coach at James Monroe in the Soundview section of the Bronx. He was named head varsity coach in 1971.

After his first season as varsity head coach at JMHS, Silberbush moved on to Adlai Stevenson where he helped found the school's football team in 1972. During his seven-year tenure, he was named NY Daily News' Coach of the Year in 1977 as well as earning the PSAL Official's Sportsmanship Trophy.

During Silverbush's first five seasons at Iona, the Gaels compiled a 25-22 record at the Division III Level. He served as the team's defensive coordinator.

Between his first and second stints with Iona, Silberbush served as the head varsity coach at Ardsley High School. In 1984 - his first season with the Panthers - the program earned its first winning season in more than 10 years. In 1985, he directed Ardsley to its first bowl game in school history.

Silberbush returned to Iona in 1992 and was the Gaels' defensive coordinator during their MAAC Championship season of 1993 and helped in the transition to the Division I FCS.

Since his departure in 1998, Silberbush served as Defensive Coordinator at Pace University (1998), Bronxville High School (1999-01), William Paterson University (2003-04) and SUNY-Maritime (2005-07) with a stint as head coach at Sleepy Hollow High School (2002). At Bronxville, his squad appeared in the Section I, Class D Championship in 1999 and semifinal in 2001.

A native of the Bronx, Silberbush resides in Hartsdale, NY.

Momodou Sisay Jr.

Momodou Sisay comes to New Rochelle after spending this past spring as a Graduate Assistant in the College of Education at the University of Maine. He will serve as the Gaels' running back coach in 2008.

Sisay was a three-year starter at full back for the Black Bears and earned a degree in Communications in 2001. He began his coaching career in 2002 serving as an assistant coach at Old Town High School in Maine as the offensive coordinator.

After stepping away from the gridiron into the business world, Sisay returned to his alma mater to pursue a Master's Degree in Education. He was an academic advisor with the university and also served as the head football coach for the Penobscot Sea Dragons of the New England Football League, a semi-professional team in Penobscot, ME.

This past spring, he worked closely with the coaching staff at observing game-planning, player assessment, recruiting evaluations, video editing and other areas of the varsity program

Demarcus White

Wide Receivers - First Season



White returns to his alma mater after two seasons on the field to patrol the sidelines as wide receivers coach. White appeared in 20 games for the Gaels in 2006 and 2007 while making 12 starts including all 11 as a senior after transferring from Hudson Valley Community College.

The 2007 All-MAAC First Team performer led the Gaels in receptions and yards last season. He was second in the MAAC with 49 catches and fourth with 610 yards. White's six touchdowns were tied for third in the conference.

The Maryland native earned his degree at Iona in Psychology this past summer. In addition to his performance on the field, White also served as a student worker in the operations office of the Athletic Department.

Jake Zweig

Defensive Line - First Season



Motivational leader, expert in youth risk-taking behavior, and innovator, Jake Zweig has brought the standards of excellence in training, toughness, and teamwork and the focus on the mission from his former world as a Navy SEAL commando to college football. Zweig has

earned professional success as a naval special warfare officer and an entrepreneur and applies that same intensity and commitment to his players.

Zweig, 36, comes to Iona College with a wealth of experience and an impressive record of achievement. His arrival at Iona follows two successful seasons as the defensive line and special teams coach at the Catholic University of America. His special teams earned top conference honors in both touchdowns scored and punt return yards. Off the field, Zweig is a natural recruiter and relates to both prospective players and their parents by drawing from his own personal history of setting and achieving difficult goals. As a result, he was instrumental in recruiting the largest class in the history of Catholic football. A true mentor to his team, Zweig charted and executed academic progression plans (or survival plans, depending on the student), identified potential academic problems early, and created incentives for consistent performance. The team responded with significantly higher grade point averages.

Zweig burst onto the scene in 2005, joining the University of Maryland coaching staff as the

graduate assistant working with the wide receivers coach. A life-long athlete and team leader, Zweig returned to college athletics following a successful career in the U.S. Navy. Zweig graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1995 as a commissioned officer. He served as a surface warfare officer for two years on board the U.S.S. Merrimack before reporting for Navy SEAL training at Basic Underwater Demolition School. SEAL training is the most grueling and demanding physical and mental regimen in the world and Zweig not only personally excelled at the challenge, but mentored the other trainees through the program and as a result was named the SEAL class leader. Following his SEAL training, Zweig reported to SEAL Team 8 in Little Creek, VA and attained the rank of Lieutenant.

Zweig has earned a Masters of Business Administration from the University of Michigan and a Bachelor of Science Degree in Computer Science from the U.S. Naval Academy. His college athletic record includes playing nose guard for Coach George Chaump, varsity wrestling, and an intensive swimming routine in preparation to be a Navy diver.

A native of Steilacoom, Washington, he attended the Charles Wright Academy of Tacoma where he was inducting into the Hall of Fame as a member of the 1989 State runner-up football team. He was also a State "A" wrestling champion and a member of the varsity golf team. He is married to the former Sarah Claud of Stony Creek, Virginia. They currently reside in Laurel, Maryland.

For over fifty years, Iona College has forged a Rich Tradition of Excellence in NCAA Division I Intercollegiate Athletics, while never compromising its original philosophy: education first, competition second. That same tradition of excellence continues into the 2008-09 academic year.

Under the vision and direction of Athletics Director Patrick Lyons, the Iona Athletic Department and its 22 NCAA Division I programs, the athletics staff, facilities and support services for student-athletes continue to grow and improve exponentially.

Here are some highlights from the 2007-08 academic year:

- The Gaels placed a school record 130 student-athletes on the list. It was the second highest total of all MAAC full-time and associate schools and surpassed the previous mark of 124 from last year.
- Three standout seniors were awarded the 2008 Joseph O'Connell Award, presented annually to Iona College's most outstanding male and female senior student-athlete: Two-time MAAC Football League Player of the Year **Dane Samuels** joined women's basketball standout **Tiara Headen** and lacrosse star **Jaclyn O'Leary** as this year's winners as a part of the athletic department's annual senior awards banquet. Ninety-five seniors and 26 scholar athletes were also honored at the event.
- Six programs were recognized for their academic prowess by their respective coaches association. Men's cross country was named USTFCCCA NCAA Division I All-Academic Team of the Year while the women's program was named an All-Academic Team. The lacrosse team earned the highest GPA in the nation in being named a Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association Merit Squad. Women's swimming and diving was second in the nation in the Collegiate Swimming Coaches Association of America Academic All-American list while the men's team was 46th overall.
- Individually, nine women's water polo athletes were named Association of Collegiate Water Polo Coaches Academic All-American, eight lacrosse players were named to the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association Academic Honor Roll, five members of the women's rowing team were named a Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association National Scholar Athlete and **Rob Valletti** from football was named to FCS Athletics Directors Association Academic All-Star Team.
- Sunday, April 6, 2008 marked a special day for the Iona College Athletic Department. It was the opening day for the new softball field at Rice Oval. The doubleheader drew a record crowd of nearly 300 fans as they cheered the Gaels to a victory in defeating MAAC rival Siena in both games. Prior to the game, there was a brief ceremony

welcoming alumni, family and friends to the field in celebration of its inaugural event. The honorary first pitch was thrown out by long time supporter, alumni and friend of the Iona College athletic program Edward Arrigoni.

INDIVIDUAL PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

Men's Cross Country

- The cross country team finished the finest season of any athletic program in the history of Iona College with a second-place finish at the NCAA Championship in Terre Haute, IN. Senior **Abraham Ng'etich** and junior **Mohamed Khadraoui** earned All-American honors in leading the Gaels to the championship podium

- The Gaels also earned their third straight NCAA Northeast Regional Championship and fifth in the last six years. Ng'etich, senior **Harbert Okuti** and junior **Andrew Ledwith** were Iona's top three performers finishing third, fourth and fifth.
- Iona earned its 17th straight MAAC Championship at Van Cortlandt Park in October. With a team score of 17 and the top four finishers, the Gaels fell just shy of a clean sweep. Khadraoui was the Individual MAAC Champion and was followed by teammates Mathew Kiplagat, Chase Pizzonia and Joe Parks.

Women's Basketball

- The women's basketball team advanced to the MAAC Championship game for the second year in a row and second time in school history.
- Earned second postseason appearance in program history advancing to the second round of the Women's NIT. The Gaels topped Quinnipiac in the first round.
- Senior **Tiara Headen** and junior **Anna McLean** were both Second Team All-MAAC performers. The duo was joined by senior **Lauren DeFalco** on the conference's All-Tournament team.
- Seniors Headen and DeFalco reached the 1,000 point plateau becoming the 17th and 18th players in school history to reach the mark. Headen finished her career as the No. 10 scorer in school history while DeFalco set the all-time school mark with 167 three-point field goals.

Football

- The Gaels finished the 2007 season with a 7-4 record. Their 2-1 record in the MAAC gave them a share of the MAAC title, the first since taking the title outright in 1993.
- Headlining the ten All-MAAC First Team Selections and eight All-MAAC Second Team Selections were Senior RB **Dane Samuels**, senior LB **Adam Lipski**, and sophomore FB **Caesar Sanchez** as the All-MAAC Offensive Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and Co-Offensive Rookie of the Year respectively.
- Four members were recognized by the The Sports Network's NCAA Div. I FCS Mid-Major All-American Second Team. (Lipski, Samuels, **Dan Walters** and **Rob Wright**).
- Samuels, **David Tash** and **Reggie Dorsainvil** were selected to participate in the East Coast Bowl in Petersburg, VA, and were the only MAAC players selected.

Women's Cross Country

- On Oct. 26, the women's team earned its third straight MAAC Championship and third in program history. Juniors **McKayla Plank**, **Tracey Williams** and Ashling Baker finished 1-2-3 as the Gaels dominated the event at Van Cortlandt Park. Freshman **Jenni Eiremo**, graduate **Erin Linehan**, and sophomore **Mary Kate Quinn** also earned All-MAAC honors by finishing in the Top 15 in the race.

- Plank earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Championship with a second-place finish at the Northeast Regionals in Boston. The team finished 11th overall at the event. Baker was the Gaels' No. 2 finisher, placing 23rd overall.

Women's Water Polo

- The Gaels placed second at the MAAC Championship, set a single-season record for wins with 22 and recorded seven conference victories for the fifth straight season.

- Junior **Lauren Peterson** set numerous single season team records including goals (99), assists (65) and points (164).

- Peterson and rookies **Maggie Wood** and **Kathleen Link** were named MAAC Offensive, Rookie and Co-Defensive Player of the Year respectively. Junior **Amanda Brucia** was named to All-MAAC First Team.

- Iona had nine student-athletes named to MAAC All-Academic Team, the most of any school in the conference.

- The team claimed nine MAAC Weekly Honors throughout the season including MAAC Offensive Player of the Week (Brucia and Peterson twice), Defensive Player of the Week (Link twice) and Rookie of the Week (Wood three times).

Lacrosse

- The Gaels completed their fourth season of competition and earned their first ever bid into the MAAC Championship as the No. 4 seed.

- Head coach **Lauren Rywak** was named MAAC Coach of the Year.

- **Jaclyn O'Leary** was named First Team All-MAAC and finished her career holding 17 school records including points (225), goals (188), ground balls (209) and draw controls (176). The two-time captain was also the program's first and only 200 point and 100 goal scorer.

- Junior **Christie Godlewski** led the Gaels with 61 points with 37 goals and a school record 24 assists.

- Senior **Gail Zonghetti** was named to the All-MAAC Second Team for her contribution to the Gaels on defense.

Women's Rowing

- **Michelle Steinberg** coxed **Veronica Costa**, **Tara Marsigliano**, **Colleen Ryan**, and **Rachel Smith** in the Varsity Four boat to a New York State Championship Gold Medal in Binghamton, NY this past spring. The Gaels topped host Binghamton by six seconds. At the Dad Vail Regatta, the boat won its heat and finished third in the semifinal, missing a qualifying place by less than .2 seconds.

2007 Season Review

GAME ONE: Iona College 14, Delaware Valley 12

Iona opened up its 2007 season by holding on to a 14-12 win over Delaware Valley College at Mazzella Field. The Gaels dominated the Aggies on both ends of the ball, out gaining their opponent by a margin of 382-170. Iona was able to get on the scoreboard first late in the first quarter. After trading punts on the first three possessions of the game, sophomore QB Nick Rossetti connected with WR DeMarcus White for a 40-yard score. The strike came on the first play of the Gaels' possession. After a DeVal score and missed point after, Iona gained an eight point lead early in the second on its next drive. Senior RB Dane Samuels jumped high over the pile for a two-yard score. His running mate in the backfield Rudy Arcara set up the score with a 46-yard scamper on the first play of the drive. Rossetti had a tremendous day in his second collegiate start completing 14-of-22 pass attempts for 222 yards and a touchdown. Samuels rushed for 113 yards while Arcara added 61 more in the win. Senior WR DeMarcus White stepped up for six pass catches for 96 yards to lead the team. Defensively, the Gaels put up some solid numbers allowing just 170 yards of total offense. Senior LB Adam Lipski picked right up where he left off before a season ending injury after the second game of the season last year recording a career-high 13 tackles including 1.5 for a loss. Senior DL David Tash had a monster game, also setting a career-best with nine tackles with two for a loss, 1.5 sacks and a quarterback hurry. Delaware Valley - which had won 41 of its previous 48 contests, the eighth best winning percentage of all NCAA Div. I, II, and III schools - dropped its first contest of the 2007 season.

GAME TWO: Iona College 17, Wagner 14 OT

New Rochelle, NY- Senior PK Chris Lofrese's 19-yard field goal in the first overtime lifted the Iona College football team to a thrilling 17-14 victory over Wagner at Mazzella Field. After the make, the Gaels' (2-0) stingy defense forced the Seahawks' Piotr Czech into a 42-yard field goal attempt to tie, which sailed to the left of the goal post to seal the win for the home team. Iona defeated Wagner for the first time since 1993 and just the second time in 18 tries. The Maroon & Gold are also unbeaten after two games for the first time since 1978. Sophomore QB Nick Rossetti had a second straight impressive performance completing 23-of-33 pass attempts for 212 yards and a touchdown. He also gained 30 yards on the ground (lost 18 yards on three sacks for a net of 12 yards rushing). Senior RB Dane Samuels had 68 yards and a score to lead the rushing attack. College football senior RB Dane Samuels recorded 388 all-purpose yards and DL Dan Walters had 10 tackles, including five for a loss and three sacks but it was not enough to propel the Gaels (3-1) in a 41-37 shootout loss at Western Connecticut. A Colonial score with 2:29 remaining put the home team on top in the contest. Samuels had a "triple-triple" in the contest rushing for a season-high 121 yards, catching six passes for 116 yards and returning seven kicks for 151 yards in the loss. 


